WGSA ran the Independent News Network M-Friday at 10pm to focus on National Issues of importance to educate and inform viewers of current events that affect their lives.

WGSA actively sought out and partnered with local non profit and educational organizations through ongoing community outreach to educate and inform families of various local activities and opportunities with a community calendar. Calendar runs 4x per day 7 days a week as well as the WGSA website.

WGSA partnered with not for profit organizations to educate and inform families with regard to safety, public health and education. 30/60 Public service announcements run in all dayparts

WGSA broadcast 65 30 minute programs to reach out to the rural families with vital information, news and content to educate and inform their specific local needs. AG Day runs at 6am Monday – Friday.

WGSA ran 13 30-minute programs to educate and inform viewers regarding entrepreneurship, technology, and personal finance and minority development. The Black Enterprise Business Report provides a forum for the discussion of issues, policies and ideas that impact the development of small, minority owned and female owned businesses. Program airs Sunday at 4:30am

WGSA aired 13 30 minute programs to educate and inform families on possible careers and goals are for children on Real Life 101. The show airs Sunday at 10:30a. The show hosted by children who go to work with a variety of people to find out what it is like to perform different jobs and what type of training and education is required to accomplish those jobs.

WGSA ran 13 30 minute programs to educate and inform viewers as to what potential dangers may arise concerning children's personal safety and how these dangers can be specifically dealt with through safety tips. Missing provides a much-needed public service by meeting the informational and educational needs of both children as well as their parents. Program airs Saturday at 9:30am. Updates of Missing Children are also integral to informing viewers of safe recoveries.
