Blood drives conducted by Vitalant Blood Services in Roswell and the surrounding area.

The annual Kymera Trunk or Treat for kids in the area.

The intention of the New Mexico Department of Transportation to remove any unauthorized signs placed in the right-of-way along public highways.

The intention of the New Mexico State Police to start enforcing the requirement that drivers stay in the right hand lane of multi-lane highways unless passing or exiting the highway.

The annual Roswell Science and Art Festival that will be held on October 14th and will start off with a viewing of the annular eclipse.

A pet adoption event held by the Roswell Animal Shelter on September 30th.

The Trunk or Treat event for kids to be held on Friday, October 13th at the Roswell JOY Center.

A drive by various state law enforcement agencies to collect new stuffed bears that will be given by law enforcement officials to kids who are in bad situations through no fault of their own.

A reminder to citizens that the New Mexico State Police will be conducting checkpoints during which they will check for sobriety, drivers licenses, registration and insurance.

Diabetes Cooking classes being hosted by the Chaves County Extension service for people with diabetes or people who cook for people who have diabetes.

The weekly Roswell Farmers Market head every Saturday in downtown Roswell where people can buy fresh locally grown produce and purchase locally produced crafts.

A program by the City of Roswell that reduced the price of the first building permit for a single-family home to a dollar until May of 2024.

Numerous announcements about child and pet safety during the unprecedented heat wave and how to prevent the deaths of children and pets left unattended inside vehicles.

Information about changes to the bulk trash pickup schedules for the next few months due to equipment failure.

Information about the food pantry for students at Eastern New Mexico University Roswell. This food pantry is strictly for students enrolled at ENMU Roswell who have trouble affording food while attending school.
