Dean Congemi with the Eastern Ohio Youth Football League says there are several factors contributing to this. "It's getting almost on the end of too competitive," Congemi said. "Where I think a lot of the parents that become coaches are more focused on winning and winning a plastic trophy than developing the kids and making sure they learn the fundamentals to take with them, and then the great experiences of the sport." Some other reasons for burnout could include depression, fatigue, and injuries. Congemi urges parents not to overdo it.</p>
