At one point, the index reached 255, far above the “Very Unhealthy” level. Experts with the EPA say they look for signs of small particulates that can be inhaled more deeply into the lungs. “The data we are seeing in real-time is showing that the impacts are greater than we expected,” said Justin Mondok, director of planning and development for Eastgate Regional Council of Governments. “We have not seen anything like this since we’ve been measuring for that standard back 15 years or so.”</p>
