He gives examples of how the policies can sometimes slow new energy and construction projects. Believes reducing the red tape should appeal to those across the political spectrum. 30 minutes</p> <p>W/Coleman: Talks about how the proposed changes to environmental policy is about weighing the positives over the negatives. It’s about balancing the environmental impact vs energy and economic expansion. Says he fascinated by booms and busts in our history. Talks about why he decided to write this book and Florida’s economy in the 1920s. Explains why Florida was able to have the real estate and economic boom in the 1920s, which had a lot to do with rich investors. Also mentions the racism the still existed in Florida at the time. 30 minutes</p> <p>W/Knowlton: Talks about how Florida’s economic boom in the 1920s had many negative effects to the environment including the everglades. Explains how the real estate investors and the banks really pushed the bubble to a point where it ended up popping.
