- 1. Crime/Safety including crime prevention and notable local cases, alcohol and drug abuse, fire safety and police conduct.
 - Keeping You Safe: Recurring segments which address issues of personal and community safety.

- 6. Recreation including activities for youth and adults, and the arts.
- 7. Community Involvement/Development including volunteerism, blood drives, revitalizing neighborhoods, mentoring, and fundraising activities.
 - Politics 2022: part of Community Involvement, including discussions of national and local issues and candidates, as well as voter registration and participation issues.
- 8. Employment including job opportunities, downsizing, training, and outplacement.
- 9. Environment/Animals including chemical spills, landfills, water quality and smog, and animal protection and conservation.

- 10. Healthy Living including exercise, dieting, disease prevention, and personal safety issues, as well as mental health initiatives and new treatment options.
 - Corona Virus: Part of Health, includes updates on issues relating to the Covid-19 outbreak, such as health information, public orders, and other relevant information.
