Station KSCW is a CW Network affiliate in its service area. In carrying out its responsibilities as a public trustee, the station deals with and is responsive to the principal issues arising in its community on a continuing basis. A variety of specials, public service announcements, public affairs programs and broadcasts on matter of concern to our community are supplemented, in some cases, with in-community projects. Our most significant programming, which has dealt with current community issues during the preceding three-month period, is set forth below.

## **COMMUNITY ISSUES**

**Crime** – Reports on criminal activity throughout the entire viewing area as well as the rest of the country and the world. Here we are listing just a few of the stories that were included in our newscast this quarter.

**Community** - Connecting with the all members of the community and serving their specific and special needs is important in a diverse culture. In Wichita, as in most communities, there is a need for the public and private organizations to contribute money, time, and services to important issues, organizations, and causes within their community. As a public medium, we carry a responsibility to let the community know about important causes that are worthy of public support.

# CRIME

**10/1/2014 4pm**

We're following two breaking stories out of derby a standoff happening right now and the search for a suspect in an attempted abduction. Roger Cornish joins us from the breaking news desk. Cindy, the standoff started about 1-30 this afternoon. Emergency dispatchers tell us police responded to a disturbance call at a home in the 500 block of s. Lakeview. Dispatchers tell us one person has been arrested and another person is still inside the house. We don't know how it started. Dispatchers say three streets are blocked off in the area including Belmont, Lakeview, and Kay to English. Also breaking in derby attempted child abduction. We \*don't know if this is connected to the standoff. Derby police say a woman was walking with her two children in the 200 block of east kay about 10-30 this morning. She said a black van pulled up and asked if they wanted candy or cookies. She said no. That's when police say the van stopped and someone got out, grabbed her three-year-old child by the shoulders. The mother hit the man twice and he let the child go. He got back into the van and it sped off towards k-15. Here's a composite drawing police issued of a possible suspect. The man is described as a white male in his 30s about 6-feet tall. He's slender build with blonde hair. He was wearing a tan t-shirt, blue jeans and tan shoes. If you have any information, all derby police or 9-1-1, we've put the picture on our Facebook page, too... So you can share it.

**10/2/2014 7am**

A derby woman says two men tried to take her three year old daughter. And police want your help finding them. It happened yesterday morning in the 200 block of east Kay. That's where officers say a woman was walking with her two children and noticed a black van was following them. She says a man got out of the van and grabbed her 3-year old by the shoulders. She hit the man several times until he got back into the van driven by another man. The two then took off. This is what police say, one of the men looked like. If you see him, you're asked to call 9-1-1

**10/4/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, a bouncer is in serious condition after being assaulted overnight. Police say the man was escorting a 23-year-old out of club rodeo... When the suspect took offense to how his girlfriend was being touched and punched the bouncer in the face. The bouncer was taken to Wesley with possible broken bones, a concussion and significant cuts to his face. The suspect was arrested on aggravated battery charges.

**10/5/2014 9pm**

A man is robbed while trying to buy electronics on craigslist in Wichita. Police say he met two men at pizza hut in the 11-hundred block of east Kellogg...after responding to an ad on craigslist. The two men pulled a knife on him...and took a couple hundred dollars and the victim's electronics then ran off. Police are still searching for the suspects.

**10/6/2014 7am**

One person dies after a crash on eye-35 near Olathe. The vehicle lost control and spun. It entered the median and hit a pole. The driver wasn't wearing a seat belt. Shoulders along the highway were closed as crews worked to clear the scene.

**10/7/2014 4pm**

You're looking a surveillance video of an overnight robbery. Diamond archery says thieves stole 24-thousand dollars' worth of compound bows and merchandise. The break-in happened around 4 o'clock this morning. The store owner says three people pried open the front door and stole the merchandise. Diamond archery asks you to notify them if you see any new bow for sale at local pawn shops or on websites such as craigslist.

**10/8/2014 8am**

A police officer has been shot in the face in Arizona. The suspect vehicle has Kansas plates! We're following the breaking news from our newsroom. The officer was shot in a motel parking lot early at 4-30

this morning after pulling over the car for having windows that were too dark. Arizona authorities are looking for a dark blue 2008 Mercury Sable with Kansas plates "887-GAM." Again, they say someone in that car with Kansas plates shot a phoenix police officer in the face this morning. That officer is in critical condition. We'll keep on top of this story and bring you more on air and online at kwch dot com.

**10/9/2014 4pm**

A manhunt is underway in the crime watch today. Reno county deputies consider this man to be armed and dangerous. Scott Lutz is wanted on three felony warrants for failure to appear. In a message posted to Facebook, deputies say Lutz has said, he will not be taken alive. Wednesday, Lutz lead authorities on a high speed chase in northeast Reno County. Law enforcement called off the chase because it got too dangerous.

**10/10/2014 7am**

It's an update to a story we first told you about last week. Derby police were looking for a man who fit this description after a report of an attempted child abduction. Now police say- the incident never happened. The mother who reported the abduction attempt has taken back her initial accusations. We asked if she would be charged for filing a false police report police say that is one option they will look into.

**10/11/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, police are looking for a man who pulled out a gun at a movie theater in west Wichita. Police say a 20-year-old man and a 17-year-old woman were leaving the Warren on west 21st Street just after midnight this morning...when a man pointed a gun at them while driving through the parking lot...then drove off. The vehicle is described as a white 2-thousand Pontiac grand am. If you have any information, you're asked to call police.

**10/12/2014 9pm**

A man who's been wanted for several weeks is in custody tonight. Hutchinson police say they have arrested Scott Lutz after finding him in an apartment attic. Devon Fasbinder is in the newsroom to explain how it happened. Police say a tip took them to east avenue b in Hutchinson this afternoon. That's where neighbors say they knocked on doors looking for Lutz. They found him in this attic where he was hiding from police. Officers say they tried to talk him out but he refused and set fire to the attic. Witnesses say the fire department arrived and crews cut a hole in the attic and blasted both it and Lutz with water. A witness says he heard officers tell Lutz they'd stop spraying if he came out. Witnesses say they helped him down from the roof and immediately took him into custody. He had to be treated for some cuts before going to the detention center. A neighbor who lives in the next apartment over says because of the police and fire activity, he doesn't have electricity or gas. He says his landlord has to get an inspection before he can get those back. Lutz has been wanted for weeks on several felony warrants of failure to appear. He has quite a few drug charges on his record. He led police on two different chases and police have been looking for him ever since.

**10/13/2014 7am**

A man who's been wanted for several weeks is in custody. Hutchinson police say they have arrested Scott Lutz after finding him in an apartment attic. Police say a tip led them to east avenue b in Hutchinson. Officers say they tried to talk him out but he refused and set fire to the attic. Eyewitnesses say the fire department arrived and crews cut a hole in the attic and blasted both it and Lutz with water. **10/15/2014 4pm**

In the crime watch, a Valley Center teenager accused of killing his parents last year pleads not guilty to capital murder. Tony bluml appeared in court just an hour ago. He was the adopted son of roger and Melissa Bluml who were shot outside their valley center area home. Bluml's trial is set for November 17th. Prosecutors say he plotted to kill the couple for months with his biological mother Keisha Shaberg. Co-

defendant drew Ellington is due in court next month. Braden smith has admitted to helping plan the murders... He has accepted a plea deal to testify against the three others charged in the case.

**10/16/2014 9pm**

New developments in the case against the men behind one of the worst crimes in Wichita's history. The Kansas Supreme Court overturned Jonathan and Reginald Carr's death sentenced in the summer. Today, attorney general Derek Schmidt officially appealed that decision to the u-s Supreme Court. Relatives of the Carr brothers' victims are now trying to remove two justices from Kansas' highest court. Claiming the ruling was made for political reasons. Two Kansas death penalty cases have been sent to the u-s Supreme Court. Both were upheld. Now, the court will have to decide whether to hear three more. Jonathan Carr, Reginald Carr and Sidney Gleason. Attorney general Derek Schmidt formally filed an appeal on Thursday. Asking for the u-s Supreme Court to make a ruling after all three death sentences were vacated in July. The group Kansans for justice says that decision was made for political reasons. The group is made up of family members of four of the people the Carr brothers murdered back in 2000. They're trying to get other Kansans to vote against retention for justices Eric Rosen and Lee Johnson. Spokeswoman Amy James says the families are upset because if the u-s supreme court chooses \*not\* to hear the Carr brothers case. It could return to Sedgwick County for a new sentencing phase. Back in august, we sat down with district attorney marc Bennett. Who says no matter what, the public should not worry. A decision on whether the court will hear any of the three cases is expected sometime before next June.

**10/17/2014 7am**

Kansas attorney general Derek Schmidt has appealed a Kansas Supreme Court decision that vacated the death sentences for the Carr brothers. The brothers were convicted of killing five people in Wichita. The court ruled that the Carr brothers should have had separate trials. Schmidt also appealed the court's decision to overturn Sydney Gleason's death sentence. Gleason was convicted in the 2004 death of a great bend woman and her boyfriend.

**10/18/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, a Wichita man is shot in the back early this morning. The man told police he was walking down 27th street, when a man who owed him money shot at him several times from a car. Wichita police say the man was hit once in the back and went to a friend's house to call 9-1-1 around 4 this morning. Police say the suspect is a 28-year-old man but no arrest has been made at this time. No word on the victim's condition.

**10/19/2014 9pm**

Continuing coverage, criminal charges have changed against a man accused of killing three people at suburban \*Kansas City Jewish sites.\* Frazier Glenn cross junior faces a single capital murder count for all three victims. Johnson county prosecutors dismissed a separate first-degree murder charge. Cross is accused of killing two men and a 14-year-old in April.

**10/21/2014 8am**

Breaking overnight. One person is critically hurt after a stabbing. Police were called to a street near Oliver and central just before 3:30. Dispatch couldn't tell us about any suspects.

**10/22/2014 4pm**

In the crime watch, a Sedgwick County detention corporal has been fired... accused of stealing money from a co-worker and the jail. The sheriff's office says a contract employee reported last month she had roughly 100-dollars in her purse while working. But when she got home, it was gone. The sheriff says the detention officer also stole about another 100-dollars from a money box. The DA charged a 10-year veteran with two counts of Misdemeanor Theft.

**10/23/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, a man arrested in connection with a Wichita double murder... appears in court on an \*unrelated\* charge. Steven Edwards... Made a first appearance this afternoon for A probation violation. He was arrested along with a 17-year-old in connection to the deaths of a couple on south ida last week. Formal charges in that case have yet to be filed.

**10/24/2014 7am**

In the crime watch, a Wichita man arrested in connection with a double murder... Appeared in court on an \*unrelated\* charge. Steven Edwards was in court yesterday for a probation violation. He was arrested along with a 17-year-old in connection with the deaths of a couple on south Ida last week. Formal charges still haven't been filed in connection with that case.

**10/25/2014 9pm**

New at nine, one man is hospitalized after his wheelchair is hit by a car in east Wichita. It happened just before seven at 21st and Rock road. A car was heading south on rock and tried to turn left onto 21st. At the same time, a 60-year-old man in a wheelchair was in the middle of the crosswalk on 21st. The car hit the wheelchair, tipping it over and causing the man to hit his head on the street. He was taken to the hospital with serious injuries, but he is expected to survive.

**10/26/2014 9pm**

One man is dead, after a shoot-out with Wichita police in the middle of a street this morning. Witnesses say that man was walking down Douglas with two guns - and shooting at random cars, before he opened fire on several officers. Anne Meyer is live where it all happened - Anne, what do we know about that suspect tonight? The deputy chief did not release his name today. But we do know he was 18 years old, a documented gang associate here in Wichita, and wanted on warrants out of Cowley County. Investigators tell us he was sitting on this corner - when he got into a shootout with officers. Crime scene tape surrounded the area of Douglas and Mt. Carmel Sunday morning, after a man opened fire on Wichita police at least three times. Deputy Chief John speer says there were so many bullets - he didn't have a count. The suspect had a 2 caliber revolver and a 380 semi-automatic hand gun - plus additional ammunition, witnesses called police when they heard those bullets at about 6:39 Sunday morning - a home security camera videotaped some of what happened. Within minutes - the first officer got to the scene and was shot at but not hurt. He radioed for help, and two other squad cars driving on Douglas were hit as well - that's when those officers fired back. Neighbors who saw what happened feel lucky that they weren't hurt. Even though a lot of this happened just after 6:30 this morning - investigators also believe the suspect was involved in a drive by shooting a few blocks from here- at 4:50 this morning. Right now, they don't know why he opened fire on drivers or police. Three officers shot at the suspect. All are on administrative leave while the Kansas bureau of investigation looks into the case. That is standard practice in officer involved shootings.

**10/27/2014 7am**

We hope to learn more after a person is found dead in Dodge City. A man died Saturday night at the ford county fairgrounds center. The Kansas bureau of investigations was on the scene yesterday but would not give out any details about what was happening. The k-b-i and the dodge city police department are investigating.

**10/28/2014 8am**

Dodge City police and the k-b-i are investigating the death of this man as a murder. 58-year-old Fabian corral was found Sunday morning at the ford county fairgrounds. His body was near the 4-h building. His family says... he was attending a wedding there the night before. Officers are now interviewing people who were also at the event.

**10/30/2014 7am**

Breaking overnight, two people are hurt after a clubbing. Crews were called to the area 19th and grove - just before midnight. A man and a woman were seriously hurt. They were both taken to the hospital. Police are now looking for the people responsible - and say this might be gang related.

**11/1/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, a Wichita home with seven people inside was shot several times overnight, and police are still looking for the person responsible. It happened in the 32-hundred block of south knight early this morning. Officers found five shell casings, and damage to the front of a house. Seven people, the youngest just four years old were inside the home at the time. No one was hurt, and no arrests have been made.

**11/2/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, Wichita police are looking for the person who shot at a man while he was leaving a bar Thursday night. It happened in the 31-hundred block of north Arkansas at 11-30. The man says he was leaving the bar when someone fired four shots at him. He was not hurt, but his car was hit by the bullets. Officers found three shell casings at the scene.

**11/4/2014 8am**

It's a follow up to a story we first told you about in September. Officers have arrested this man in connection with the assault of a junior football coach. Police have been looking for bobby brown for two months. They say he used brass knuckles to beat up a junior football league coach at a practice in Linwood Park. The altercation happened during an argument with a parent. Brown has been booked on an aggravated battery warrant.

**11/5/2014 4pm**

Still no arrests made in a chase and crash in Wichita that sent a 16 month old girl to the hospital. The chase began near 31st and Oliver and ended at Pawnee and George Washington Boulevard. The Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office says a deputy was chasing a couple who stole a car. We're told the chase lasted 33-seconds before it was called off. The little girl is still in the hospital - the 22 year old driver - is currently detained and is expected to be arrested after he is released from the hospital. New at 5 on eyewitness news... Scott Evans looks at the policy behind chases and when deputies call them off.

**11/6/2014 9pm**

A man is in critical condition tonight after a shooting in south Wichita. Wichita police officers believe the shooting happened somewhere near the 800-block of south hydraulic. Jade DeGood talked with police on scene. She tells us what they know about this crime so far. Wichita police say the man in his late 20s was shot somewhere outside before making his way to these apartments behind me to call 911. Police say they received that call around 6 tonight. According to police... The man was leaving a business in the area when the shooting happened. Several officers scoured the area near the 800 block of hydraulic with flashlights... Looking for any evidence of where the crime took place. They say the man had gunshot wounds to his back and chest and was taken to Via Christi in critical condition. Police say they have not found any witnesses to the crime... And they have no suspects at this time. In Wichita... Jade DeGood... Eyewitness news. Police say they spoke with the man. And have not figured out any motive for the shooting.

**11/7/2014 7am**

In the crime watch, police continue looking for a suspect after an east Wichita shooting. This was the scene last night in the 800 block of south hydraulic. Emergency crews found a man with a gunshot wound to his chest. The victim came back to an apartment in the area and called 911 saying he had been shot while walking back from an area business. He was taken to the hospital in critical condition.

**11/8/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, it looks like the batman masked robber has been caught. Police have arrested the masked woman tonight, during an attempted robbery near hillside and Pawnee. The call came in after 5 this evening... Where a store clerk at Phamily express said the woman... Wearing a batman mask... Showed a gun and demanded cash. This is the third straight night of similar robberies. This is surveillance video from the Maize food mart near Kellogg and Maize. This robbery happened just after 9 last night. The store manager said this was a first. Another similar robbery... With a woman in a batman mask happened on Thursday afternoon. When a woman of a similar description robbed friend's corner in southeast Wichita while wearing that same batman mask. Police have not said whether all three robberies are connected.

**11/9/2014 9pm**

Wichita police are looking for this man. after he allegedly set a pallet of hay on fire outside a hardware store...causing 7-thousand dollars' worth of damage to the building. It happened October 28-th. At the Hupp true value hardware store\* in the 7-hundred block of east harry. If you have any information, you're asked to call police.

**11/10/2014 8am**

In the crime watch, a woman is arrested after attempting to rob a convenience store wearing a batman mask. This is video from one of the robberies. She was arrested Saturday evening near Pawnee and Hydraulic. Police say the woman demanded money, but someone else inside pulled a gun. The woman left the store and got into a car. She and the driver were arrested a short time later.

**11/11/2014 7am**

In the crime watch, a man is hurt in an officer-involved shooting in Hutchinson. Police say the victim's mother called reporting an armed person and dispatchers could hear threats in the background. Within 30 seconds of arriving, an officer reported shots fired. Another officer on scene says the victim came out on to the porch carrying several knives. The victim is 29 year old Justin Matthews who was taken to hutch regional medical center. An officer on scene says he was transferred to a hospital here in Wichita.

**11/13/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, Wichita police are looking for a man they say raped a pregnant woman in northeast Wichita. Police are searching for a man they say raped a pregnant woman in northeast Wichita last night. It happened around 9:30 near 10th and grove last night. The woman told officers she was walking alone when someone attacked her from behind. She says the man forced her to the ground and on her stomach before raping her for 45 minutes. Police tell us that woman is 37 weeks pregnant. The woman remains in the hospital. She was unable to give a description of the suspect.

**11/15/2014 9pm**

Wichita police say they need your help solving what they call an \*extremely violent crime." a woman... Sexually assaulted... Beaten.. Then set on fire. She survived but is in critical condition tonight. Let's go to Devon Fasbinder... Who's been following this horrific crime today. Devon what do we know right now. Jade... Evidence from the crime scene still remains at Fairmount Park near w-s-u's campus. Police have been working all day to try and figure out who is responsible for this crime. But still have no suspects. Some neighbors in the Fairmount park area say this crime has them concerned. Police say late Friday evening, a 38-year-old woman was sexually assaulted, beaten and set on fire. Firefighters found her when responding to a call of a grass fire. She's now in critical condition...and police are looking for anyone responsible. Neighbors say they didn't feel unsafe before, but now, they're taking precautions. Some are calling the crime "disturbing" and "deranged". Most shocked this happened right outside their doors.

**11/16/2014 9pm**

Tonight we continue a crime alert. As a person involved in an \*extremely violent crime\* is still at large. An attacker... Sexually assaulted... Beat... And burned a woman Friday night. And still no suspects in custody. Devon Fasbinder has the latest on where the investigation goes from here. I spoke with a former f-b-i agent earlier today and he tells me investigators will look at the victim's life. They'll try to learn about her relationships and places she visited the night this happened. Trying to learn as much as they can. Some overnight weather made Fairmount Park go from clearly burned to seemingly normal. Police say Friday, a woman was beaten, sexually assaulted and set on fire here but they don't have any suspects and aren't releasing any other information. A person close to the family tells me the victim was walking home from work when this happened. Neighbors say Friday night was the worst of several incidents at the park. The family gave us this statement today saying they want anyone with information to come forward so this doesn't happen to another innocent person. They say the victim had four children and was a loving, caring person. Police are also asking for information regarding this crime. Again, if you know anything police and the family ask that you call 9-1-1 or crime stoppers at 267-2111.

**11/17/2014 7am**

We hope to learn more today about a person involved in an extremely violent crime. A women was sexually assaulted, beaten and burned on Friday night. And still no suspects in custody. A person close to the family says the victim was walking home from work when this happened. The family gave us this statement saying they want anyone with information to come forward so this doesn't happen to another innocent person. They say the victim has four children and is a loving, caring person. Police are also

asking for information regarding this crime. If you know anything police and the family ask that you call 9-1-1 or crime stoppers at 267-2111.

**11/19/2014 8am**

A woman is beaten... Sexually assaulted and set on fire at a Wichita park. Now...crime stoppers is offering a 25-hundred dollar reward for information leading to an arrest. The incident happened Friday night at Fairmount Park. The woman is still in critical condition this morning. Police say despite the crime...the park is fairly safe. We went on a ride-along with police while they patrolled the area last night. Police say, overall, crime in the area hasn't changed much in the last few years. But they are paying close attention because of this incident. Here is a look at the crime statistics in the area this year. So far. There have been 6 fewer non-residential burglaries compared to last year. There have been 3 less home burglaries. However, there have been 3 more reported rapes in the area compared to 2013.

**11/20/2014 4pm**

Wichita police asked for your help in this case. Crime stoppers offered a 25-hundred dollar reward for a tip leading to an arrest and conviction. Today we learned crime stoppers received 10 tips in the case. While we're told that's a significant number for a crime in town... Crime stopper says none of the tips led to today's arrest. However, crime stoppers told us today... It may still offer a partial reward to someone. But only if the tip is credible and leads to a solid prosecution of the suspect.

**11/21/2014 9pm**

A para at a Wichita middle school is arrested, accused of sex crimes against a child. Jade DeGood is live at Wilbur middle school with the latest. This is where Samuel Perlman is employed as a para. But he has since been placed on administrative leave. Perlman was arrested yesterday afternoon on charges of sexual exploitation of a child... Aggravated indecent liberties with a child... And electronic solicitation. An incident report filed in this case... Alleges the 22-year-old sent a Facebook message that was \*sexual in nature\* to the victim. Another police report says the victim was between 14 and 16 and did not know Perlman. Wichita public schools said he'll stay on administrative leave pending the outcome of the investigation. It couldn't comment any further since it is a personnel matter. Perlman's bond was set at 75-thousand dollars. He has since bonded out of jail.

**11/22/2014 9pm**

A woman who was found beaten, sexually assaulted and burned at a Wichita park died from her injuries this morning. Devon Fasbinder takes a look at her life... And also what changes we might see in the case against her accused attacker. We know the woman was 36 years old and a mother to four. Her family says she was a loving and caring person. But now that she has passed, i spoke with an attorney about what that means for the charges. The man suspected of beating, sexually assaulting and setting fire to a 36 year old woman could soon see different charges. That's because the victim died Saturday morning. So far, the suspect...Cornell McNeal is charged with attempted capital murder, rape and two counts of arson. Attorney Charlie O'Hara says now that will change. The district attorney's office makes that decision for the suspect. But in Kansas, the death penalty is something we haven't seen for a while. Even without the death penalty, O'Hara says this crime has life-long consequences. But for now, McNeal awaits trial. District attorney Marc Bennett released a statement today regarding the case. It extends sympathy to friends and family of the victim...and says it expects autopsy results Monday from Wichita police. At that time, it will determine if charges should be amended to capital murder. The family of the victim is holding a vigil for the woman tomorrow. It's at Fairmount Park at five o'clock.

**11/23/2014 9pm**

The man accused of brutally attacking Letitia is behind bars. And her death may mean a change in his charges. 26-year-old Cornell McNeal faces attempted capital murder... Rape and two counts of arson. But that first charge may now change to capital murder. The district attorney's office says it expects to see an autopsy report tomorrow. At that time... It'll decide whether to change that charge. We'll continue to follow these developments and bring them to you on air and on-line... Kwch.com.

**11/25/2014 8am**

In the crime watch this morning, Wichita police looking for a person who robbed a family dollar store. It happened just after nine last night at the store located near central and grove. A Manager was ordered to open the cash register. The manager handed the man the money and the man left. Police say he did leave finger prints and they do have surveillance video.

**11/26/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, a Wichita man facing a murder charge has pleaded guilty to a lesser charge. Seth Jackson agreed to a deal with prosecutors. Pleading guilty to involuntary manslaughter instead of first degree murder. Jackson had faced the murder charge for leaving his 10-month-old foster daughter in the backseat of a hot car last summer. Police say Jackson was high on marijuana at the time. The plea deal means he could face more than 11 years in prison. That's down from a possible life sentence for first degree murder. He is set to be sentenced in January.

**11/29/2014 9pm**

In the crime watch, surveillance video at this family dollar helped catch a robber. Police were able to identify the 60-year-old suspect. After he robbed a clerk at knife point. It happened in the 16-hundred block of south Broadway yesterday afternoon around 4:30. The man was booked for aggravated robbery.

**11/30/2014 9pm**

A homeowner in rural Sedgwick county... Shoots a man... He says was trying to break into his house. Now that suspect is in custody. Emily griffin was on scene when it happened this morning. She begins our coverage. The call came in just after 8:30 Sunday morning as a burglary in progress. Sedgwick county officials tell me the homeowner thought he heard someone breaking into his house and that's when he grabbed his gun. It happened at a home in the 9400 block of west 73rd street north. While units were en route to the scene... Dispatchers were told the homeowner fired his gun at the suspect and then began to chase him. The homeowner came back to the house a short time later, and Sedgwick county officials found the suspect walking down the road suffering from a gunshot wound. We're putting his picture on our Facebook page so you can share it. Fabian corral was found behind the ford county four-h building. His family says he was attending a wedding there the night before.

**12/5/2014 7am**

Breaking overnight, Hutchinson police are looking for someone involved in a stabbing. They were called the area of North Cleveland and east 3rd last night around 8:15. They found a man with a stab wound to his hip. He was treated and should be okay. Call police if you have any information.

**12/6/2014 9pm**

New at nine, a person is in custody. After a shooting in garden city this evening, police there were dispatched to Dillon's east around 5 p-m. There they found a man who had been shot in the parking lot. That man was taken to the hospital. No word on his condition at this time. Police are asking anyone with any information about the incident to contact them immediately.

**12/7/2014 9pm**

The latest now on a fatal shooting in Garden City. Police say a 21-year-old man from Wichita was arrested on a charge of 1st degree murder. The shooting happened yesterday a little after 5 p-m. Officers found a 32-year-old man in the parking lot of \*Dillon's east\* who had been shot. The man... Identified as Jeremy Pascascio of garden city... Had gunshot wounds to his upper body. He was pronounced dead at a local hospital. Police arrested Loren Wiseman of Wichita at the Garden City y-m-c-a shortly after the shooting. An initial investigation showed Wiseman was in a car with a woman... When they drove to the Dillon's. Allegedly, Pascascio approached their car... A verbal confrontation occurred... And he was shot. Police are still trying to figure out what relationship... If any the victim had with the suspect.

**12/8/2014 7am**

After an incident with a Lawrence police officer, two k-u athletes end up in jail. Basketball forward Jamari Traylor and wide receiver Rodriguez Coleman were arrested yesterday morning. Traylor was booked into the Douglas county jail for interfering with duties of an officer. Coleman was booked for battery. Both posted bond. Bill self says the issue quote "will certainly be addressed and handled as we receive complete information".

The woman who suffered a broken shoulder -- was able to escape and run to a neighbor's home. Officers found the suspect asleep inside of her apartment. Police say she didn't know him.

It was supposed to be a good day...she was spending time with her sister for the holidays. Fun Anderson could use. Anderson's husband is in the air force...and has been deployed to the Middle East. So this Christmas will be spent without him...and now without the help to give her kids a good Christmas. Now duct tape and cardboard temporarily patch the window...as Anderson works to keep the holidays happy. The women tell me their mother was just in the hospital unexpectedly and Anderson was planning to visit and help out. But some of the cash she was going to use for that trip was stolen too. Police say leaving items of value in vehicles can make you an easy target for theft. That includes purses... Shopping bags and cell phones. Instead, move those items to a trunk... Or cover them up with a coat or blanket.

**12/22/2014 7am**

Still no suspects in Wichita's latest homicide. Friends and family have identified the victim as 19-year old Reshia Pittman - a mother of two. Officers found her in the 11-hundred block of north Harding just after 1 a.m. Sunday. Wichita police blocked off that area, to look for evidence. We talked to a friend of the victim. She was with Pittman minutes before she was killed, and says no one in the apartment heard any gun shots. Last year, the city had 17 homicide cases. This death - brings the total for this year to 25. Three of those cases - including this one - remain unsolved.

**12/23/2014 4pm**

The defense attorney for a mother charged with murdering her son -- files an objection to prevent some of the case details from being made public. The attorney is trying to block a request by kwch12 and the Wichita eagle to release the probable cause affidavit that details the reasons for the arrest of Lindsey Nicole Blansett. An attorney representing kwch-12 and the eagle is filing a response to the objection today. The judge says he won't hold a hearing, but will issue a ruling based on filings of both parties. Blansett is charged with stabbing and beating her son to death with a rock. Eyewitness news believes this information in \*all\* cases should be open the public -- as was the intent of the Kansas legislature when it passed the open affidavit law last session.

**12/24/2014 9pm**

A volunteer firefighter in Franklin County is arrested. After sheriff's deputies say she took a fire truck for a drunken joyride. 24-year-old Chelsea Matthew has been charged with d-u-i after the incident this weekend. Deputies say she was talking to dispatchers on the radio while driving drunk. Saying another firefighter was chasing her and trying to kill her. Matthew was part of the all-volunteer Lincoln-Ottawa-Harrison fire department. She is no longer with the force.

A community comes together to remember a 10 year old boy who won't be around this Christmas. Police say 10 year old Caleb Blasnett was murdered by his own mother. Last night friends and family shared their memories of Caleb Blansett in a candlelight vigil. Anna auld was there. Christmas songs could be heard around a wellington neighborhood as the community remembered ten year old Caleb Blansett...giving him a Christmas he couldn't have. Friends and family gathered to do what they could. They say he deserves a Christmas like any other kid. Gifts, candles and ornaments were put under a Christmas tree outside his house so he could have a Christmas in heaven, too. Judy Thomas says she planned the vigil. Jim Hansley is Caleb's neighbor and put up the tree and say Caleb was the light of the neighborhood. Happy moments were shared about Caleb and even at a young age...how he impacted those around him. Total strangers even praying for a young boy who wanted a Christmas. Shirts were made for Caleb and the community to wear to last night's vigil. They raised over nine hundred dollars.

**12/26/2014 8am**

A teenager is arrested on murder charges after a deadly Christmas Eve stabbing. Wichita police say the 16-year-old stabbed another man multiple times on south knight late Wednesday. The man died from his injuries. The teenager is being held on murder charges. Police expect to release more information later on today.

**12/27/2014 9pm**

The Kansas Supreme Court has reversed the murder conviction of a Salina man. Willie Jerome Smith-Parker was convicted in October of 20-10 of first-degree murder for killing a 24-year-old man during a burglary. And second-degree murder for killing a 22-year-old man after an argument. The justices ruled this past week that four of his 10 allegations of error had merit.

**12/28/2014 9pm**

Wichita police are also looking for a person... Who forced his way into this \*Midas muffler shop\* in Wichita. It happened early this morning around 4 on west central. Police say the suspect stole some cash and a \*diagnostic scan tool\* worth 5-thousand-dollars.

**12/29/2014 4pm**

The electrical lines started a fire that completely engulfed it leaving it a total loss. According to the Salina journal... The man that was shocked was flown to a Wichita hospital.

**10/26/2014 9pm**

A vehicle fire causes an explosion this morning in east Wichita. Fire crews were called to the 500 block of north Dellrose, where they found two vehicles engulfed. The fire also spread to the home. Firefighters say they believe the explosion came from the tires on the car. Everyone inside the home made it out safely.

**10/27/2014 7am**

Breaking overnight. A fire early this morning may have been intentionally set. Emily griffin is live outside the motel where it happened. Kfdi is reporting that firefighters were able to knock the fire down quickly. Crews were called around 5 to the royal lodge near Kellogg and Topeka. They found heavy smoke coming from a room. K-f-d-i is reporting the fire may have been intentionally set and police have a possible suspect in custody. The fire caused about 10-thousand dollars in damage. No one was hurt.

**10/28/2014 8am**

It may not look like it from the outside... but demolition has started on the Wheatshocker Apartments at Wichita state university. It's being torn down to make way for the first new building on the university's innovation campus. Before being torn down... usable interior items... Like furniture are being salvaged and donated to local charities. Demolition should wrap-up in February. Work on a new engineering building will start in the spring.

**10/29/2014 4pm**

Just one win, that's all the royals need to take back the crown. It's been 29 years since the royals last championship. Eyewitness news has been there every step of the post season. Tonight... Yesterday was the last day to play a round of golf. And there were certainly people braving the colder temperatures to tee off. Construction on the new buildings for the innovation campus is expected to begin in early 2015.

**11/5/2014 4pm**

One of the elephants at the Sedgwick county zoo died this morning. Cinda the African elephant had been at the zoo for 42 years. The Sedgwick county zoo says Cinda had begun showing a natural decline in health over the past year due to her age. And says, the elephant care staff and veterinary staff worked to investigate and treat any health issues and pains she experienced. The exact cause of Cinda's death is unknown at this time. They are waiting on an autopsy. Stephanie, the zoo's other African elephant, is said to be doing well at this time. The veldt building will remain closed for the next few days.... Tomorrow... \*go-Wichita\* is holding a meeting to talk about what they've found through thousands of personal surveys. Devon Fasbinder explains what its goal is... And the next step for the group. I spoke with the president and CEO of Gowichita this afternoon about this branding process. She says the goal is to be consistent in trying to bring visitors and business to the city. She says data from your responses will help make that possible. It all began in September when Gowichita and its partners asked what makes Wichita great. But assistant county manager Ron Holt presented a new plan today with the fund not being replenished by the county. More talks are scheduled for next month.

**11/13/2014 9pm**

We are following some developing news to start. Wichita fire firefighters on scene of house fire in south Wichita. This is a live look. The fire is on the 1700 block of south water. Crews arrived to flames when they arrived around 7-45 tonight. Everyone was able to make it out. No injuries were reported... No cause at this time.

**11/14/2014 7am**

The city of Wichita plans to hold a storm briefing this morning. They'll let you know how they're prepping for the snow this weekend. You can watch the briefing live on our website. It starts at 10 a.m.

**11/15/2014 9pm**

This is the third sexual assault to happen in the past few weeks. On Wednesday, a pregnant woman was assaulted near 10th and poplar. And at the end of October. A man waited inside a restroom at the big lots on east harry. And tried to assault a woman at knife-point. No arrests have been made in any of these cases. And police have \*not\* said if any of the three are connected in any way.

**11/16/2014 9pm**

That's just one of the issues Sedgwick county fire crews faced this morning fighting this house fire. The fire started at 11 a.m. In Garden Plain, crews arrived to heavy fire in the home in the 200 block of west Garnett. They are not sure at this time what caused it. The division chief says the cold is difficult on firefighters... With slick walk ways and just trying to keep everyone warm. He also says they have to pay close attention to water lines... Making sure they don't freeze up. The home is likely a total loss... No one was inside at the time of the fire.

**11/17/2014 7am**

Same sex marriages begin today in Kansas. The Kansas Supreme Court also plans to consider a case filed Friday on the state gay marriage lawsuit. The Johnson County judge who issued the first marriage license to same sex couples last week says the state should stay out of it and let the federal courts decide. The state is suing to keep him from issuing marriage licenses to same sex couples. The justices will be deciding two things. Whether to move forward with the state case. Or wait until the competing federal case is resolved.

**11/18/2014 8am**

At least three Kansas counties are denying same sex couples marriage licenses. Butler... Elk and greenwood counties will continue to keep complying with the state's same sex marriage ban. Voters approved of that ban in 2005. The chief district judge in that area says, the district will continue to deny same sex couples marriage licenses until he is convinced it falls under a binding court order.

**11/19/2014 8am**

The Kansas Supreme Court clears the way for more same sex marriages in the state. The state's highest court lifts its hold on marriage licenses to same sex couples in Johnson county. Justices blocked licenses from being issued last month while reviewing a petition from Kansas attorney general Derek Schmidt. This

new ruling only affects Johnson County. The court did not address whether the state's ban on same sex marriage is constitutional. The court says, it will not consider the issue until the federal court rules on a lawsuit filed last month. Last week, the u-s Supreme Court ruled the state could not continue enforcing the ban while the lawsuit makes its way through federal courts.

**11/20/2014 4pm**

Thursday and Friday will \*not\* have deliveries, and recipients are asked to use their frozen meals. In addition, all activities at the downtown senior center are cancelled. **11/23/2014 9pm**

Anne, they told me that Letitia was a great mother and her family says if she was here today, all she would want is for her kids to have the best lives possible. Throughout the vigil, family members took turns holding a poster with pictures of Letitia. Anyone who went to the vigil could sign the poster showing their love for the family. One thing that stuck out on that poster was Letitia's big smile. Her fiance was surrounded by family holding each other in the cold rain during the vigil. Followed by hugs from nearly everyone there. Family members tell me Letitia was such a loving person they couldn't think of one time she didn't show how caring she was.

**11/24/2014 7am**

A union representing Kansas workers says there's a shortage of workers at our state's prisons, and the shortage is putting correctional officers at risk. The interim director of the Kansas association of state employees testified last week. She told a committee about inmates attacking guards and says all adult facilities are short staffed. A department of corrections spokesperson says there are job openings at each facility, but no one wants them. He says low wages and dangerous working conditions are a big part of the problem.

Thousands of dollars are raised for the children of a Wichita woman who was raped, beaten and set on fire. Thirty-six year-old Letitia Davis died last month. The man accused of killing her, 26 year-old Cornell McNeal remains in jail. He is charged with capital murder, rape, and arson. A fundraiser to help Latisha's four children took place yesterday. According to the event's Facebook page... They've already raised 10-thousand dollars for the family. We spoke to one of the organizers of the event... Who says this brutal attack really hit home. The event included, food trucks, live music,, and an auction..

**12/9/2014 8am**

Wichita school board members finalize the future for its current administration building. The school board approved selling the building to a developer for about 1-point-2 million dollars. The administration offices will be moved into the current southeast high school once the new southeast school opens in 2016. School leaders say the deal is another step towards the finalization of the 370 million dollar bond issue passed six years ago. The current administrative building will be turned into loft apartments once the school moves into its new location.

**12/10/2014 4pm**

The child advocacy center is one million dollars closer to reaching its goal. This morning, Sedgwick county commissioners voted unanimously to give the center the new funding. That money will be used to

renovate the old Lincoln elementary school in to a center to help abused kids and their families. The idea is to bring eight difference agencies together under one roof to eliminate some of added stress of going to multiple locations, which is how things are done now. Short is twenty four years old and has a wife and daughter. His family says he is now in Saint Louis receiving skin graphing operations and will be getting prosthetic legs.

Today, rock the vote tried to decrease that number and sign people up to vote the right way. Devon Fasbinder has the story. But here in Kansas, that extra step of proving citizenship made some unable to sign up. It would be the first of its kind inside of a Wichita high school. It's also the sixth clinic built in the district. Grace-med funds the cost of building the clinic.

**12/8/2014**      **7am**

Demolition starts today to make room for Wichita state's innovation campus. Crews will tear down the Wheatshocker apartments to make room. The new building has been scaled back to just three floors to help save money. It will feature classrooms, labs and a space that private companies can rent for offices. The plans also include a maker's space, which will be equipped with things like a three-d printer that you can use for a fee.

**12/30/2014**      **4pm**

Friends University is trying-out a new tuition plan... locking-in undergraduate tuition rates for four years. The new tuition plan is set to begin with undergrads next fall. Current students will pay the same tuition next year... as they're paying for this school year. K-u has used a similar plan for several years.

**10/2/2014 7am**

Early Thursday showers and isolated storms continue to dot the radar screen across parts of Kansas. The strongest storms are riding due east along the NE state line while the rest race northeastward at 35 mph. Skies are partly to mostly cloudy and temps range from the 40s northwest to around 70 southeast. Gusty northerly winds will crank-up through the day and despite some late day clearing, highs will only climb into the mid-60s northwest and mid-70s for southeast Kansas. Scattered showers and isolated storms pushing out of most of eastern KS by afternoon. Behind the cold front, look for some clearing, gusty northerly winds and much cooler temps. Winds will not back-off too much tonight as skies continue to clear. Friday will be mostly sunny but breezy/windy and kind of chilly for early Oct. Looking at our 7-Day forecast... We'll see a slow warming trend this weekend that will continue into early next week but no decent chances for rain or storms through at least next Thursday.

**10/1/2014 4pm**

Seven Goddard elementary students are taken to the hospital after a school bus runs off the road and into a ditch. Emily griffin was on scene shortly after the accident this morning, and has an update on what happened. The accident happened on Pawnee near 135th street west about 8:30 this morning. The bus veered off the side of the road and went down into this ditch on the right-hand side. And as you can see, this ditch is so deep officials say the driver actually did a good job of keeping the bus upright during the accident. The school bus had been on its route to Amelia Earhart elementary school when it ran off the road. 32 students were on board...and seven of them were taken to the hospital with minor injuries - mainly scratches and bruises. The driver also went to the hospital to be checked out. Although an official cause of the wreck hasn't been released, Sedgwick county sheriff's deputies say the driver may have been distracted by something. District officials say emergency personnel and all of the student's parents were contacted immediately... As safety of the school's students and staff is top priority. Part of the bus's windshield broke and fell out during the wreck and that's all that was left behind after the wrecker towed it away. Emily Griffin, eyewitness news. Another bus picked up the rest of the uninjured students this morning to take them the rest of the way to school.

**10/3/2014 8am**

Emporia police are investigating a man's death, after he was found unresponsive in the department's bathroom. A captain says the 58-year-old was at the police station for personal reasons. He was found not breathing yesterday morning. He was pronounced dead at the scene. Foul play isn't suspected.

**10/5/2014 9pm**

New now, Kansas City health officials say a man whose apartment was sealed off to the public last night... is not believed to have Ebola. The man was rushed to a Kansas City hospital around 9:30 last night. Sources of k-c-t-v say it caused part of the medical facility to be quarantined as well. This morning... Hospital officials said the patient does not have symptoms associated with the Ebola virus. But city health officials say they are monitoring him and are in a state of awareness because of the Ebola case in Dallas, Texas.

**10/6/2014 7am**

Saving your life in the event of a house fire could be as simple as installing a smoke alarm in your home. And the Wichita fire department is reminding you about it all week long. Emily griffin is live with more on what they're doing for fire prevention week. Theme this week is working smoke alarms save lives. Having a working smoke alarm in your home reduce your risk of injury or death in a fire by 50 percent. \*\*not just homes... Also important for schools and businesses to remember to check smoke alarms and change batteries regularly. \*\*part of weeks activities include fire drills at 15 Wichita area schools... Drills are going to be unannounced at these schools so we don't know which ones they're happening at just yet. Part of the surprise could include certain doors being locked, or hallways being blocked off... So, teachers and students can have a more realistic experience. In your homes, Lt. Evans says it's important to have a smoke alarm in every room, on every level of your house. You should test it once a month, and change the batteries twice a year... Usually daylight saving time is a good time to remember.

**10/7/2014 4pm**

An eastern Kansas nuclear power plant reopens following a fire. A spokesman at wolf creek nuclear operating corporation says the fire broke out Monday in one of two emergency diesel generator rooms. Employees were able to put the fire out before firefighters arrived. It's unclear how the fire started. No radiation was released.

**10/8/2014 8am**

Right now crews are still on scene of a rollover crash involving a semi. It happened near k-96 and Kellogg. That's where we find Emily Griffin right now, she's live at the scene where crews are now preparing to flip that semi back up. Semi rollover at ramp from k-96 to Kellogg in E Wichita. Sheriff's deputy & khp troopers on scene at semi rollover on ramp from eb 96 to eb Kellogg. No one is hurt. Traffic isn't blocked off and is moving. There are traffic control vehicles out there. K96 and Kellogg is a problem spot for big trucks. If you've driven it, .. You know it's a sharp turn. Just last month, k-dot put down these stickers on 96 trying to give anyone who's about to take the ramp a heads up. K-dot says a truck rolls-over about once a month here.

**10/9/2014 4pm**

Sedgwick County expands its information hotline. You can now call 2-1-1 and have someone answer your questions about Ebola. The county teamed up with the united way to make information available. You can also learn more about the disease, and track the latest developments in the outbreak on our website... Kwch-dot-com slash Ebola.

**10/11/2014 9pm**

Also in health news, another child has died due to stronger strain of a respiratory illness. This one from Michigan. The 21 month old died Friday afternoon from enterovirus d-68. Last week a 4-year-old boy from New Jersey died of the virus. The illness can cause flu-like symptoms and respiratory problems. The virus can be spread through coughing, sneezing and contact with contaminated surfaces. There is no vaccine or specific treatment. The virus has sickened 691 people in 46 states including Kansas.

**10/12/2014 9pm**

The latest now on Ebola, a passenger at L-A-X vomited and had flu like systems aboard a flight to New York today, prompting authorities to divert the plane to a remote terminal at LAX so the person could be isolated to prevent possible Ebola exposure. there is no confirmation if the passenger did have Ebola. Airport authorities say they are just taking the proper precautions. Mean time in Texas, a healthcare worker from Texas health Presbyterian hospital tested positive for the illness. The worker helped treat Eric Duncan who was the first person in the u.s to die from the disease. Officials are not releasing the name of the female patient who is listed in stable condition. She came in contact with Duncan after his second visit to the hospital after he was diagnosed with Ebola. Top health officials believe the worker somehow broke safety protocol and are trying to determine exactly what happened. The White House says President Barack Obama has asked the CDC to move as quickly as possible in investigating the incident.

**10/13/2014 7am**

The f-a-a and n-t-s-b should be on scene after a plane crashes on its way to Lawrence. It happened last night shortly after the plane left midway airport near Chicago. The plane crashed in an empty lot in a neighborhood. The Three people on board died. The plane did not hit any houses.

**10/14/2014 8am**

Breaking news, Wichita firefighters are on the scene of an apartment fire in the 14-hundred block of east 3-rd street. That building has been evacuated because of smoke. The fire started just before 8. No word yet if there is any injuries.

**10/15/2014 4pm**

As Ebola concerns continue to spread, more hospitals are making sure their staff is prepared to handle any possible cases. Staff at Via Christi hospital... Underwent training this morning and allowed us inside. The CDC has requirements in place for nurses and doctors when putting on and removing protective clothing. But Via Christi says it's doing more than required to make sure every employee knows every step. All of the suits and other gear being used today is strictly used for training. New tonight at six on k-w-c-h 12... Emily Griffin walks you through every step doctors and nurses must take to keep themselves and you safe.

**10/16/2014 9pm**

President Obama used his weekly address today to try and calm the American public about Ebola. The president's remarks come as federal health agencies monitor two nurses with Ebola- and hundreds of others who may have had contact with them. Wendy Gillette has more from the president. President Obama is urging Americans to remain calm about Ebola. The President's remarks come one day after he appointed former white house advisor Ron Klain as the nation's first ever Ebola czar. He also said he won't give in to calls from some lawmakers to ban travel from the most hard-hit area in West Africa. On Saturday, a memorial service was held for Thomas Eric Duncan in North Carolina. Duncan had the first case of Ebola diagnosed in the US after travelling to Dallas from Liberia in September. Two nurses who cared for Duncan now have the virus. 26 year old Nina Pham is undergoing treatment at the National Institutes of Health in Maryland and 29 year old Amber Vinson is at Emory University Hospital in Atlanta. In Ohio- where Vinson traveled before she was diagnosed- more than 100 people are being monitored for Ebola symptoms. And a cruise ship carrying a hospital worker who had contact with Duncan's lab specimens is making its way back to Galveston. The worker, who's shown no symptoms, is quarantined in her cabin. Wendy Gillette for CBS News, New York.

**10/20/2014 7am**

A 19-year-old has died after a crash in Butler County. The Kansas highway patrol says Leon Williams was killed, after his pick up hit a semi head on along u-s 400 east of Augusta. The driver of the semi was taken to the hospital and should be okay. Officials are still investigating what led to the crash.

**10/21/2014 8am**

A f-16 fighter jet comes crashing down in southeast Kansas. An Oklahoma air national guard spokesperson confirmed the crash southwest of Moline. An eyewitness says the plane spiraled downward and went behind some trees. He says he saw the pilot eject and glide to the ground using a parachute. The jet was one of four Oklahoma air national guard f-16's flying over Elk County. Two of them were involved in a mid-air collision during a training exercise. The second air craft returned to Tulsa where it landed safely. Neither pilot was seriously hurt. The pilot who ejected was transferred to a hospital at McConnell air force base. He should be okay.

**10/23/2014 9pm**

A New York City doctor is in a "hospital isolation ward" tonight after testing positive for Ebola. The man had recently returned from West Africa working with the group "doctors without borders." He was taken to the hospital this morning by medics in hazmat suits. Brian Webb has the latest from New York. New York City doctor Craig Spencer is the fourth person to be diagnosed with Ebola in the United States. Spencer tested positive for the virus at New York's Bellevue hospital, where he is in isolation. Spencer was likely exposed to the virus earlier this month while working with the group 'doctors without borders' in Guinea, West Africa. A Facebook photo shows him wearing the protective gear he used while caring for Ebola patients. Guinea is one of the three West African countries at the heart of the worst outbreak on record. Spencer had been self-monitoring for symptoms since his return to the U.S. He reported fever and abdominal pain Thursday morning. Video from the New York post shows an ambulance with police escort rushing Spencer to Bellevue hospital, where EMT's wearing hazmat suits were then decontaminated. Bellevue is a designated Ebola treatment center in New York City. Healthcare workers here have been preparing for a situation like this for weeks. Spencer is being kept in an air-tight room like this one. A CDC go-team will work with his doctors to make sure all protocols are followed. Before his diagnosis, neighbors in Spencer's apartment building said they're not scared. Spencer's apartment remains closed off. Brian Webb, CBS News, New York. New York City authorities believe Spencer came into contact with at least four other people. Officials are now working to track those people down.

**10/24/2014 7am**

A preliminary report says a small plane was nearly vertical to the ground when it crashed. Three Kansas physicians were killed in the crash just outside of Chicago earlier this month. The n-t-s-b report doesn't give a cause. It was misting at the time of the crash. But the report doesn't say if that contributed to it.

**10/28/2014 8am**

Wichita police officers are investigating a deadly motorcycle crash. It happened late last night near Lincoln and Broadway. Officers say, the rider hit a curb... Flipped the bike and hit a sign. He was pronounced dead at the scene. Alcohol and drugs are not believed to be a factor in the crash.

**10/29/2014 4pm**

We're following a developing story from Stanley elementary school in Wichita. Emergency dispatchers say the school was put on lockdown two hours ago... because of a chase in the area. Police have a suspect in custody, but are still waiting to clear the area. Principal Bruce Shelton says 9-1-1 asked them to lock down the school because of something going on in the neighborhood.

**10/30/2014 7am**

New this morning, the inauguration canceled at Baker University after the death of a student. The university's president wrote on their Facebook page that a sophomore died. It says he was from Colorado and was a member of the football team. The university is holding a prayer service today at 11 a-m at a church in Baldwin city. The school also made counseling services available for students and staff.

**10/31/2014 8am**

Investigators at the plane crash at mid-continent will now have what they need daylight. Emily griffin and Hannah Davis are at the scene live this morning.

**11/1/2014 9pm**

The mid-term election is just days away. In Saline County, one of the hot topics on the ballot involves drinking water. Specifically, should the county keep fluoride in it? Anna auld talked with community members and a local dentist who are divided on the issue. Salina neighborhoods are covered in signs that are for and against keeping fluoride in the water, but as the election gets closer, more residents are voicing their opinions. Lou Tryon thinks Salina's water is poisoned. She is part of a grassroots campaign that is voting "yes" on November 4th to get fluoride out the water. Tyron wants residence to have the right to make that decision, not the county commissioners. But not everyone feels this way. We asked doctor Allison Lesko who is a Salina dentist. She says she will be voting "no" next week to keep fluoride in the water. One of the main concerns for both groups is the future of the kids. We do know the names of three of the four people killed in crash. Mark Goldstein the pilot, Nataliya Menestrina and Jay Ferguson. The fourth victim's identity has not been released. The n-t-s-b is investigating. A preliminary report is expected sometime this week.

**11/4/2014 8am**

The investigation into the deadly plane crash near mid-continent airport continues. Crews are now working to remove the Beechcraft super king air 200 from the roof of a flight-safety building. Mark Goldstein, the pilot of the plane, crashed into the building Thursday. He died, along with 3 others inside the building. We still don't know the name of one of the people who died. The building is still unstable making removing the plane a difficult job. 5 others were hurt in the crash. 1 of them is still in the hospital. You've heard us talking about Scott mans since early on. He's the man who jumped from a simulator inside the building and crawled through falling debris as the fire only continued to grow, and he did it all with a broken hip.

**11/5/2014 4pm**

Many of you are sharing this picture after our Facebook post. That's because Colby police need your help finding this teenager. They believe 16-year-old Andrew Shubert left his home before 10-30 Monday night and hasn't been seen since. If you have any information about where he is, you're asked to contact the Colby Police Department at 785-460-44-60.

**11/6/2014 9pm**

In the health watch, officials say Health-Care-dot-gov has received security upgrades ahead of the November 15 start for the second open enrollment season. The facility that hosts the site is now certified to meet the highest government standards for cloud computing, which uses large networks of machines in different locations to handle data. The website is also conducting daily security scans and weekly hacking attempts that simulate real attacks.

**11/7/2014 8am**

A 16-month old girl needs your help after she was hurt in a crash. This was the scene Tuesday morning. Faith gales was hurt after the driver of a stolen car ran a red and crashed into the vehicle she was in. Faith remains in critical condition. A go fund me page has been set up for her. She says the class helps them be more aware of their surroundings. Tonight's self-defense class lasted an hour. In it, people aren't learning how to be an expert fighter. Instead, they're learning how to fight back enough to escape a potential attacker. The money raised is going to "a loving mother fund"-- a fund established at the "credit union of America" for the victim of the park attack.

Troopers have not said why the first driver ran the stop sign.

**12/11/2014 9pm**

New information this evening - on an explosion in northeast Kansas. Cindy Klose is in the newsroom with the latest. We now know 7 people were hurt in that explosion at a rail service company near Atchison. Two of them are in critical condition in KU hospital burn center. The explosion happened around 2:00 this afternoon, inside a building at gbw railcar services-- it's a business that repairs and maintains rail cars. The Atchison county sheriff's office says a rail car filled with some type of fuel blew up-- you can see the damage the blast did to the building. 16 or 17 employees were inside the building when the car exploded. All were accounted for and assessed by ems crews. Six were taken to hospitals with burns, smoke inhalation and a back injury. The Kansas state fire Marshall's office has started an investigation. A company spokesman says the explosion happened in a part of the warehouse where rail car surfaces are prepared for painting. Federal regulators have been to the plant twice in the last five years for planned inspections and another time in response to a complaint. In that case, the complaint led to a fine for respiratory and ventilation problems.

New this morning, a Wichita family no longer has a home, after a fire destroyed it last night. When fire crews arrived to the home near east 22-nd and market, there were still people inside. They all made it out safely. Fire officials are still looking into what caused the fire.

**12/17/2014 4pm**

150-thousand dollars in farm equipment damaged by flames overnight. Fire crews were called to a barn in Cheney after the family heard an explosion. Fire officials say there were several propane tanks inside the barn which was used to store tractors, trucks, and a semi. Investigators have not said what caused the fire. No one was hurt.

**12/18/2014 9pm**

That breaking news is out of Hutchinson. Where fire crews are still on scene after a fire broke out at a dry cleaner earlier this evening. Cindy Klose is at the breaking news desk with what we know. And they said there's no proof Orel suffered at all... Since he entered no evidence... Didn't sign a sworn statement and didn't show up in court for Monday's hearing. The Kansas Democratic Party told me this is the ruling it expected. While the secretary of state remains firmly convinced the court is wrong in its ruling. O'Hara says when comparing the Kansas amendment and the u-s constitution, judges have several things to look at. Those include certain rights like liberty and the right to choose. O'Hara says the same-sex marriage issue isn't about morality. But rather, the legality of whether the government can ban a couple from buying a marriage license...on the basis of sexuality.

**11/11/2014 7am**

Attorneys with the a-c-l-u say they'll file a response this morning to try to lift a hold on same sex marriage in Kansas. It's the latest development as the state tries to keep its ban on same sex marriage, and couples try to end it. U-s Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor issued a temporary stay yesterday afternoon-- answering the state's request to keep a ban on same sex marriage in place. over how to react... Some want to go to the mat. But many republicans argue against being goaded into a distracting fight.
