**1. Drugs & Addiction / Mental Health / Suicide**

**Al Día Up-to-Date, with Vania Consentino.** Public Affairs program with special expert guests interviewed by Vania Consentino. Saturdays 12:00 – 12:15 p.m.

7/1/2023	Vaping - Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Santa Barbara, CA - Dr. Miguel Avila says that the addiction to 'vaping' and our youth going back to school continues to be a critical concern. The FDA points out that disposable vaporizers are illegal, can cause serious diseases, and remain on the country's shelves.
7/8/2023	Addiction - Celebrate Recovery. Pastor and Chaplain to the Oxnard Police Department Officer Fermin Hernandez joined us to talk about a Bible-based self-help group for people struggling with a wide range of hurts and hang-ups. Addiction: Eating disorders to gambling, codependency, pornography, anger management, past trauma. Celebrate Recovery website for locations across the country.
7/29/2023	Mental Health- Drs. Pablo & Elena Precioso, Psychologists in Santa Clarita CA, joined us to address the growing Mental Health Crisis that affects the whole country. Mental illness is a health problem that has a large effect on thinking, actions, emotions, and mood. It often impacts day-to-day life and relationships. How can the Church leaders help? By educating their congregations, bringing in professional speakers, talking about it in their sermons.
8/12/2023	Suicide & Domestic Violence - Pastor Eric Garcia, Psychologist from Eternal Rock Ministries, Canoga Park, CA gave us an overview of what domestic violence means, how far it can go, and if the victim of abuse attempts suicide. Caution: The person exercising control, especially over a partner, and a support phone line handy, may help to avoid suicide.
9/23/2023	Alcohol and Drug Addiction - Lazaro Santos-San Fernando Valley Partnership, Inc. has a program to inform and educate people addicted to opioids, including lectures in schools and places of worship. This is a non-profit organization whose mission is to develop social prevention strategies. Other churches and community groups can benefit for contacting them to start their own programs in their own communities.

## 2. Homelessness / Housing

7/22/2023	Homelessness - Pastor Luis Saenz, from Victoria Homes Ministry Los Angeles CA joined us to talk about homelessness. The lack of income and affordable housing leaves many people without a home. Lacking a dependable job, or another source of money, makes monthly payments for a living space, impossible. For women, homelessness caused by domestic violence has always been a priority to many ministries. Contact local churches for Rescue Missions and for County Public Health resources.

The nation's unemployment rate seems to be moving higher. From February through August this year, the monthly average is under 202,000 new jobs created. Jobs are necessary for the economic well-being of residents and cities alike.

Discourage your children from hanging around with gang members. Occupy their free time. Develop effective communication. Set limits, and do not allow dressing in gang-style clothing.
