1. Drugs / Suicide

10/1/2022	Drugs - Rainbow Fentanyl - Officer Fermin Garcia, Oxnard PD, Oxnard CA is our guest. Since August of this year, the Drug Enforcement Administration has been alerting communities of the dangers involving a narcotic dubbed "Rainbow Fentanyl", which holds a striking resemblance to Skittles, the candy.
11/26/2022	Certified Counselor and Pastor Gerardo Goyenaga - Van Nuys, CA joins us to talk about Depression in Youth - Mental health concerns in youth continue to pervade our communities and parents are on high alert. An estimated 3,2 percent of American children and adolescents have diagnosed depression.
12/24/2022	SAD-Seasonal Affective Disorder - Pastor Salomon Ruano- Church Damasco- Caldwell, ID joins us to discuss how as the days get shorter and darker, many experience emotional shifts relative to these seasonal changes.
