BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): As part of a new proposal to address decades of contamination at Los Alamos National Laboratory, New Mexico officials are hopeful the federal government will restore funding for environmental cleanup projects. The U.S. Department of Energy says it's committed to cleaning up legacy waste left behind at Los Alamos National Laboratory by decades of bomb-making and related nuclear research. A department spokesman reiterated the commitment Wednesday after New Mexico regulators unveiled a new proposal for addressing hazardous waste and contamination in and around the northern New Mexico lab. The DOE confirmed that it has been in discussions with the state Environment Department over a revamped cleanup schedule since a previous agreement signed in 2005 has run out.
