## 1/22/19

Even though it's been cold, make sure the ice is thick enough before taking a vehicle onto it...yesterday in Blue Earth County in the southern part of Minnesota, 4 different vehicles went through the ice on the same lake...Fortunately, everyone survived, but police are reminding us that ice should never be considered completely safe.

Well we know we have great teachers in Central Minnesota...a few of them are up for the Minnesota Teacher of the Year! Shelby Chollett from Sauk Rapids-Rice Middle School, Chris Ann Johnson at Apollo High School, Nancy Davis at Rice Elementary, and Lynette Faber at John Clark Elementary in the Rocori District.

The Wild won last night...4-2 over the Vegas Golden Knights. They're now 3rd in their division.

## 1/23/19

Well we only got 1.3 inches of snow in St. Cloud, but the weather across the state was enough to make things pretty messy...the State Patrol says there were 232 crashes from 5 a.m. to 12 p.m. yesterday on the state's highways and interstates, as well as 113 spinouts.

A bill to require motorists to use hands-free devices when talking on the phone while driving passed its first committee stop in the Minnesota Legislature yesterday. Lawmakers heard emotional testimony from several people who lost loved ones in crashes caused by distracted drivers. 16 other states and the District of Columbia already have hands-free laws.

And today marks 32 days of the partial government shutdown. That means 800,000 federal employees will miss their second paycheck. President Donald Trump signed a bill to provide back pay when the shutdown ends.

## 1/24/19

General Mills announced <u>a nationwide recall</u> of five-pound bags of Gold Medal Unbleached Flour because it could have Salmonella. They said the recalled bags have a "better if used by" date of April 20, 2020. Only five-pound bags are affected.

Now that it's tax season, St. Cloud police say be careful...this is the time of year where W-2 forms get stolen out of mailboxes and thieves then file bogus tax returns to try to get a refund check. If your company offers electronic W-2's, or you can collect a physical copy at work, those are two good options to help avoid identity theft.

The Minnesota Department of Transportation has increased the speed limit on a number of two lane state highways from 55 to 60 mph. The change has already happened on some of them, and for others will be in effect as soon as signs can get posted. This is happening after a 5 year study on these roads.

## 1/25/19

If you're looking for some indoor fun for your kids with the extreme cold this weekend, District 742 is holding a Run and Read Event. It's for kids 1 to 5, it'll include story time, time in the gym to run around, and snacks too. It's a free event, though they are accepting donations for the food shelf....it's tomorrow from 9:30 to 11:30 at the Quarryview Education Center in Waite Park.

And you may remember in the Jayme Closs case there was a large sum of reward money for information...turkey products company Jennie-O from Jayme's hometown of Barron Wisconsin is donating their half of the reward directly to Jayme. Jennie-O President Steve Lykken says that he hopes a trust fund can be set up for Jayme's current and future needs.

With the snow and the dangerous cold this week, it's a great idea to have a winter survival kit in your car...here's what the Minnesota Department of Public Safety says should be in it: 1. Candles and matches

- 2. A knife
- 3. A red bandanna or cloth for signaling authorities
- 4. Pencil and paper
- 5. A whistle
- 6. Snacks (such as raisins, hard candy, food bars)
- 7. A cell phone charger
- 8. Flashlight

And 9. Spare batteries

The ultimate winter survival tip they say is that If you get stranded, stay in your car.

You may want to wait for a slightly warmer week, but the Hike Hoppers Park Blast is a fun way to get exercise and have fun. It's a scavenger hunt at 8 local county parks, where you search for prize codes that are 50 feet or less off the trails. There is a small fee to play...you can find out more and register at Hike Hoppers dot org.

In sports, Gopher's men's basketball won last night, they beat #19 Iowa 92-87, and the Timberwolves fell to the Utah Jazz 125-111.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency is reminding us to be prepared with this dangerous cold. A lot of this is just common sense, but they say obviously dress in layers, check on family friends and neighbors who might need help, bring your pets inside or make sure they have warm shelter and unfrozen water, and make sure your vehicle has an emergency kit.

Roads are still slick in areas from the snow we got yesterday and the extreme cold now...the Minnesota State Patrol responded to 134 crashes and 137 spin outs, just from midnight to 10:00 a.m. yesterday morning. This type of cold can lead to black ice too, so a good reminder to slow down and take our time today.

And families in need can save on dental expenses this week...kids can get their teeth cleaned for free at the St. Cloud Technical College on Friday...it's through the Give Kids a Smile Program. You can set up an appointment by calling 320-308-5919.

#### 1/30/19

Our top story of the day...you may have seen this on social media...an Illinois police department has placed Elsa — the Queen of Arendell from the <u>Disney movie "Frozen"</u> — under arrest Tuesday for <u>bringing frigid cold temperatures</u> to the Midwest. For the first time in forever, Elsa is being punished for her crimes.

On a more serious note, no mail today. The U.S. Postal Service has joined the large list of closures. They're suspending delivery not only for Minneosta, but also for Western Wisconsin, Iowa and Western Illinois.

And hopefully you don't have to go outside much today, but in case you do it's good to be aware of the signs of frostbite and hypothermia. Frostbite shows up first as redness or pain. Other signs include a white or grayish-yellow skin area, skin that feels unusually firm or waxy. Skin will also be numb. Hypothermia is marked by shivering, exhaustion, confusion, fumbling hands, memory loss, slurred speech, and drowsiness.

And in sports, even though MInnesota is pretty much canceled today, the Timberwolves and Gophers men's basketball teams will STILL be in action today down in the Cities...the Timberwolves host the Grizzlies at the Target Center at 7, and the Gophers will take on Illinois at the barn at 8.

## 1/31/19

Xcel Energy is urgently asking all customers to reduce their natural gas usage after the severe cold snap placed what the company calls "a significant strain" on its natural gas system. The utility provider asked Minnesota customers to temporarily reduce their thermostat settings to 63 degrees, if possible, through Thursday.

If you're using space heaters to help keep you warm, especially if you've turned your heat down like Xcel Energy requested, the MN State Fire Marshal posed these tips for safely using them. He said.

- Don't leave space heaters and other alternative heat sources unattended
- Keep space heaters at least 3 feet from anything that can catch on fire (wood, cloth, plastic, combustibles, paper, rugs, etc.)
- Plug space heaters directly into an outlet, not an extension cord

The city of St. Cloud wants to hear from you...there's a survey you can fill out online or via a copy they sent you in the mail...they want to hear how they're doing and how residents view St. Cloud. If you didn't get the survey in the mail, you can find it on the City of St. Cloud's website. You have through February 9th to fill it out.

## 2/1/19

The St. Cloud police say they've found a child who went missing yesterday. It was a scary situation....11 year old Brennan, who has high functioning autism, ran from his home yesterday, and with the temperatures and the family being new to the area, his mom called police. Fortunately a local homeowner found Brennan and took him in and let police know he was there, and he is now safe and sound.

Well now that we're on the other side of the polar vortex...let's talk about just how cold it get...one town in MInnesota ALMOST set an all time state record. The unincorporated town of Cotton, which is about 35 miles north of Duluth, dropped down to 56 below...that's just 4 degrees shy of the record of 60 below from 1996 in Tower, Minnesota. Makes our 17 degree high today look pretty balmy.

Sad news for a lot of people as the Mall of America is saying goodbye to a store that was a staple in many childhoods...the American girl store will close at the mall on March 20th. The mall will announce new tenants soon.

## 2/4/19

Benton County Deputies are getting body cameras soon. The cameras were just ordered after being approved in the county's budget, and will be put into use in the spring.

If you or someone you know is looking for a job, the St. Cloud area school district is holding a job fair this Thursday. They're looking for paraprofessionals, custodial staff, nutritional services, and bus drivers. They'll have onsite interviews...it's from 4 to 6 PM this Thursday at Quarryview Education Center in Waite Park.

And it feels like the movie Groundhog day...the Patriots are Super Bowl champions yet again...they beat the Los Angeles Rams 13-3 in the lowest scoring Super Bowl ever. Patriots wide receiver Julian Edelman was named the game's MVP.

## 2/5/19

MnDOT is asking us to be more cautious around snowplows after reporting 25 crashes between vehicles and state plows already this winter. They say the main causes of these crashes are people driving too fast for conditions, driving too close to the plow, and driver inattention. The safest place you can be is well behind the snowplow and away from the snow cloud it creates.

Texting and driving could face a much more expensive penalty...Sen. David Osmek is introducing a bill to sharply increase fines for those caught texting while driving. Currently the fine for a first offense is \$50. Osmek's bill would move that to \$150 for the first offense, \$300 for the second and \$500 for the third violation, along with a 30-day driver's license suspension on the third offense.

Well it's hard to believe, but next year is already another nationwide census...they happen every 10 years, and so Minnesota officials are already coordinating efforts so that they can count every resident in the state in 2020. One of the reasons this is a big deal is because census data dictates the nearly \$8.5 billion per year in federal funding that's allocated to Minnesota, and the state could lose about \$15,000 for each uncounted resident.

## 2/6/19

The State of the Union address was last night...President Trump called for bipartisanship, but wouldn't yield on hard-line immigration policies, renewing his call for a border wall.

Well this is right here in our Central Minnesota Community, and it's awesome....The Clearwater Travel Plaza has been holding a variety of fundraisers for a while...they've now raised over 200 thousand dollars to help the Coborn Cancer Center in St. Cloud.

And just a reminder from the Minnesota State Patrol with this snow coming up...they say if there are flurries flying, our headlights need to be on!

And in sports the Timberwolves and Wild both lost last night...the Wolves fell to the Grizzlies 108-106, and the Wild dropped one to the Sabres in a shootout, 5 to 4.

## 2/7/19

More Shopko closings are on the way, and this time one of the ones in St. Cloud will be shutting down. The East side Shopko will be permanently closing on May 12th.

A couple of local students are moving on to the state spelling bee. Lydia Johnson from Sauk Rapids and India Ratha from St. Cloud took 1st and 2nd in a field of 25 students from 12 school districts. They'll compete at state later this month, and the winner of that will move on to the Scripp's National Spelling bee in May.

In sports, Gophers men's basketball dropped a close one to the Wisconsin Badgers last night 56-51. Their record is now 16-7 on the year.

Here's our good news story of the day. Sometimes the little things turn out to be the big things Like many 16 month olds, little Carter is inquisitive and friendly. And so when she and her daddy were waiting at the airport for a flight, of course this little one wanted to explore and make friends. And she walked up to this man named Joseph and said hi. And he asked if she wanted to sit with him. And so for the next 45 minutes, this man, who had never met this little one and her dad before...hung out with Carter...taught her to draw pictures on his tablet, watched cartoons with her, even accepted her generous offer to share her snacks. And her dad was so impressed by this, he posted about it on social media and it just blew up...thousands and thousands of shares....and he said "Watching them in that moment, I couldn't help but think, different genders, different races, different generations, and the best of friends. This is the world I want for her," ""Thank you for showing my daughter what kindness and compassion looks like.

# 2/8/19

Yesterday was pretty unbelievable in regards to the amount of crashes...the State Patrol responded to 562 crashes across the state, as well as 37 jackknifed semis and 788 vehicles that went into the ditch. THANK YOU to our law enforcement and first responders who are bravely serving when the weather gets bad like this.

St. Cloud is under a snow emergency right now...that means if you're illegally parked, you WILL be towed. It started at 12:01 this morning, and it'll go 72 hours from that point unless it's rescinded because of improved conditions, but right now...make sure you're not parked in the wrong place, or will you end up in the impound lot.

And it's no secret that the MNLARS driver licensing and vehicle registration system has had issues for a while...governor Tim Walz is trying to fix that...he signed an executive order creating a blue-ribbon council to advise state government on information technology issues, he'll also ask the Legislature for another \$16 million in the current budget to continue fixing the MNLARS system and to beef up staffing in the division that distributes license plates, vehicle titles and driver's licenses.

#### 2/11/19

It was another busy weekend for the Minnesota State Patrol...between 6 AM and 8:30 PM yesterday, they responded to 375 crashes and 395 spinouts. Down in the cities there was a crash that involved 17 vehicles, fortunately there were no life-threatening injuries. But with another round of snow coming, let's make the State Patrol's job a little easier and drive carefully.

Police want help in finding a missing teenager and her infant son. The Waite Park Police Department says 17 year old Morgan Styke and her 9 month old son left Minnesota back in October with the baby's father, 19 year old James Spence. Family hasn't heard from her in quite a while, and there's been no traceable cell phone or bank card activity. Morgan is considered a runaway, and police just want to talk to her to make sure she's ok. Contact the Waite Park police department if you have any information.

If you're planning on surprising that special someone with flowers this week, the Better Business Bureau says be careful. This is the time of year when fake flower shops will show up online and take your money without actually delivering any flowers. The Better Business Bureau says to make sure the shop actually exists by calling or by visiting the location.

## 2/12/19

A few Central Minnesota schools running late because of the snow today...Mississippi Heights Elementary in Sauk Rapids is CANCELLED, not because of the snow, but because of a water main break outside of the school.

Minnesota education officials and lobbyists are surveying districts to decide whether to ask lawmakers for a shorter school year after winter weather has forced so many school closings lately. As it is now, a number of districts could fall short of the state requirement for time in school if they don't add makeup days. A spokesman for Governor Tim Walz has assured districts that they won't be punished for keeping students safe.

The Minnesota Department of Transportation says more than 40 snow plows have been hit so far this winter. They want to remind us that when those snowplows are out, like this morning, they are considered emergency vehicles, so give them plenty of room to make the roads safe for everyone.

In sports, the Timberwolves beat the LA Clippers 130-120 last night, and St. Cloud State Men's hockey is still #1 in the nation for the 4th straight week.

## 2/13/19

Well it definitely feels like it's been a really snowy month...we've had officially 14.1 inches for February in St. Cloud...that's close to a foot above normal so far. We have a chance to get in the top 10 snowiest Februarys ever if we get a couple more inches the second half of this month.

There's a new app that the St. Cloud Police Department will be using when they're called to situations with people struggling with mental health issues. It's called the Vitals Aware Service App, and it's free to enroll yourself or your loved ones...when enrolled, police will then have important information about someone's mental health condition and how to de-escalate a situation, which could save lives. You can find out more about the app at The Vitals App dot com.

Well a month ago on January 13th you might remember there was a fire at Pleasantview Elementary in Sauk Rapids. Officials still haven't determined what caused it, and no word on when the investigation will be over. The good news is plenty of donations have come in and are still coming in to help the school.

# 2/14/19

There's a scam letter going around...you could get this in your mailbox today. Stearns county deputies said a number of people got a letter yesterday from dot service dot com...the letters say they're about a person's Department of Transportation number which is past due and need their biennial update, and may be fined 1000 dollars per day if they don't renew. If you get this letter, it IS a scam, and you can go ahead and throw it away.

You may have heard that the store Homegoods is coming to St. Cloud...it'll be one of the businesses in the old Sears building in the mall. Sounds it'll open late this year.

And if you're a fisherman, boy this is a dream catch... Darren Troseth caught a 120 pound sturgeon while ice fishing on the St. Croix river yesterday. It's 5 inches longer and about 26

pounds heavier than the current catch and release record holder. The DNR is examining photos and measurements of the catch to determine whether it will officially break the record.

## 2/15/19

If you love fishing, here's another reason to be excited for summer...the Minnesota DNR says fishermen will be able to keep some walleye during the open-water season on Mille Lacs Lake this year. This is a big deal since it's the premiere walleye lake in Minnesota, and it's been catch and release there for several years in a row.

If you missed January's Super Blood Wolf Moon, make sure you set a reminder to catch this month's because it'll be the largest super moon of the year. On Tuesday early early morning, 4 AM...the moon will be the closest to earth that it will be for all of 2019. They don't call this one the wolf moon...is the snow moon.

And we have some crazy, but awesome people here in Central Minnesota...hundreds of people will take the polar plunge tomorrow in Rockville to raise money for the Special Olympics. They literally cut a hole in the ice and jump in. They're hoping to raise 60 thousand dollars this year. If you wanna be part of this and find out more, visit Plunge MN dot org.

In your good news story of the day, it was a simple act of respect, but it's really touched a lot of hearts. Two young men, probably around 10-11 years old, were playing...riding around a scooter and a hoverboard, they were by the fire department, and firefighters began to raise the American flag. And these two boys stopped what they were doing, put their hands on their hearts, and recited the pledge of allegiance as the flag was being raised to full staff. A firefighter snapped a picture of this, and it has blown up on social media...thousands of shares. The fire chief there says, hey, maybe they'll even grow up to be firefighters or police officers. A simple act of respect can go a long ways.

## 2/26/19

It was a weekend with a lot of people getting stranded...hundreds of Minnesotans (including myself) got stuck in Northern Iowa and southern Minnesota because of awful conditions on the roads...blowing snow and lots of drifts...many roads were completely shut down for quite a while. You might have heard that even the St. Cloud State Hockey team got stuck in southern Minnnesota...they spent some time at the Watonwan Jail Sunday because their bus couldn't get through. And the problems weren't just on dry land...hundreds of ice fishermen got stuck on Mille Lacs because of heavy drifting that covered ice roads...fortunately, as of last night, the DNR says everyone who needed to get back to shore had done so.

The Better Business Bureau is warning us about a phony auto dealer who's been ripping people off in Minnesota and North Dakota. It's called Superior Auto Sales, and the scam starts with a vehicle listing on Craigslist...when someone asks about the vehicle, the scammer will talk with them, then send an official looking invoice asking them to pay a 20 percent down payment. But once the money is paid, Superior disappears. The BBB reminds us don't wire money for an online vehicle purchase if you can't view and inspect the vehicle in person first or have a trustworthy third-party inspector do so for you.

## 2/27/19

Just a head's up if you're traveling through downtown St. Cloud today...Veterans Bridge over the Mississippi that connects 1st street north and east St. Germain street is going to be partially closed. Westbound traffic will be reduced to one lane between 9 and 4 today and tomorrow so that they can inspect it.

If your school-aged kids love their sleep, they'll like this bill being introduced by state Representative Tama Theis...the bill calls for high schools to not start classes before 8:30 AM, and also says buses have to wait 'til at least 7 AM to pick up younger, elementary aged kids. Definitely a while to wait though...IF this goes through, it wouldn't start 'til the 2021-2022 school year.

And the Wild helped their playoff chances with a big comeback win over the Winnipeg Jets last night, 3-2. They're currently in place for one of the last playoff spots.

## 2/28/19

As we round out a recording-breaking month of snowfall in much of Minnesota, the State Patrol says it's seeing an "alarming" number of squad cars hit by drivers.

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety says 15 State Patrol squads were hit so far in February. That's the most in any month of any year on record.

With all the snow we've had, the snowmelt flood threat could be "higher than it has been in a few years," in parts of Minnesota, according to the NAtional Weather service. The severity of floods will depend on how quickly the weather warms this spring and how much rain comes with it

In sports, the Timberwolves lost to the Atlanta Hawks last night 131-123 in overtime. They're 11th in their conference with a record of 29-32.

## 3/1/19

Hard to believe with the snow expected today, but it's almost time to get those fish houses off
Minnesota's frozen lakes. The Minnesota DNR announced deadlines to remove fish houses. The first
deadline is the end of the day on Monday, March 4th for lakes south of an east-west line formed by U.S.
Highway 10. The deadline north of that line is the end of the day Monday, March 18. You can find more
detailed information on the DNR's website

Now that February is officially over, we can officially say it was the snowiest February EVER recorded in St. Cloud, EASILY. Our final total was 27.6 inches, shattering the previous February high of 21.6 by 6 inches.

And in sports, the Wild beat the Rangers last night 4-1 for their 4th straight win. They're in 5th place in their division right now.

## 3/4/19

Please pray for Lee County Alabama, you may have heard they had a severe weather outbreak there...an F3 tornado swept through and took the lives of at least 23 people and caused catastrophic damage.

Stride Academy in St. Cloud is adding back middle school grades in the coming years...their board of directors voted to add 7th grade for the 2019-2020 school year, and then 8th grade the following year. Spots could be available for new students, but that will depend on how many current students re-enroll.

A St. Cloud company has invented a device called Badge Messenger to help keep schools safe. It's about the same size as a teacher's ID badge, and it has 4 buttons that can easily alert other teachers and administrative staff in events such as a medical situation, security issue, maintenance need. Badge Messenger is already being used by St. Francis Xavier school in Sartell.

## 3/5/19

Governor Tim Walz is making a trip to St. Cloud today. Walz and Lieutenant Governor Flanagan will be speaking with both teachers and students at St. Cloud Technical college about their education proposal.

You may have heard the sad news that actor Luke Perry passed away yesterday after suffering a stroke last week. Strokes can hit people of any age, and the acronym BE FAST will help you remember the symptoms of a stroke. BE FAST stands for Balance, Eye movement (or vision loss), Facial drooping, Arm weakness, Speech difficulties, and Time. Strokes can be reversed if medical care is given within the first few hours. Remember, it's not about pain with stroke, it's about a loss of function.

In sports, players and fans are gearing up for the 75th Minnesota State Boys hockey tournament.at the Xcel Energy Center. St. Cloud Cathedral made it to State...they have their first game tomorrow, and they'll take on North Branch at 11 AM.

# 3/6/19

Nobody really wants to hear about it, but sounds like there could be more snow on the way this weekend...and St. Cloud is running out of space to put it. The snow dump on the east side is

 $\frac{2}{3}$  covered and has piles 25 feet high, and the one on the west side is almost full. They're now looking at other sites that they wouldn't normally use, but could be forced to this year.

And you MIGHT be really happy about this if you drive on the interstate a lot...Minnesota lawmakers have revived bills that would increase penalties for people who drive too slowly in the passing lane. They call it, appropriately enough, a slowpoke violation, and the bill would raise the fine for driving too slowly in the left lane to \$100 from the current level of \$50. Once you tack on the \$75 standard surcharge for all moving violations, a slowpoke violation would total \$175.

In sports, the Wild lost in a shootout last night to the Nashville Predators...they're still in place for a playoff spot right now though. And a lot people excited today as the Boys State Hockey Tournament starts this morning. St. Cloud Cathedral takes on North Branch at 11 AM.

# 3/7/19

Tough news for longtime Jeopardy host Alex Trebek...he announced yesterday that he's been diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer. He's promised he's going to fight it, and continue working. Support and prayer for Trebek has been pouring in from all over.

Just a reminder that this Sunday is Daylight Saving Time, so most of the country setting clocks one hour forward. Senator Marco Rubio is hoping to make the change stick. He reintroduced the Sunshine Protection Act, which would make Daylight Saving Time permanent for all of the United States, so we wouldn't "fall back" an hour in November. The bill was originally filed in 2018 but didn't advance.

## 3/8/19

With so many school cancellations across the state this winter, The Minnesota Senate passed the "Snow Day Relief Bill" yesterday so kids don't have to spend an extra week or two in school this summer. Most districts won't be able to fit in all 165 instructional days required by state law, and so this bill would give local school boards the option of shortening their academic calendars this year only. The bill still has to go through the House.

## 4/1/19

The city of Waite Park is looking to start a volunteer reserve police unit.
