Just yesterday, lawmakers approved house bill 2542, which gives the state’s four year colleges and universities more flexibility with personnel decisions. Event organizers say to combat the cuts, many institutions have been adjusting how they operate.

The trial date of Anthony Arriaga and Brandon Fitzpatrick has been set for April 13th. Last week a grand jury formally charged the two men in the death of Ben Hatfield. Last May, Hatfield was decorating grave sites at Mountain View Memory Gardens in Maher when he was shot in the back. Arriaga and Fitzpatrick were both indicted on first degree murder and robbery charges. Bond was denied for both men.

He will also spend up to 15 years for attempted first degree murder. 2 to 10 for malicious assault and five years each for two counts of wanton endangerment. Neel killed his estranged wife Kayla and severely injured Dakota Walls while they sat in Walls' truck in her parents driveway in December of 2014.

He's planning on introducing a new version of the bill during this session of the legislature. He believes marijuana helps people who suffer from health issues, and it could be the answer to the state's budget problems. Opponents of legalizing medical marijuana say it could lead to using harder drugs. Governor Justice has said he's open to the idea, but most believe it has no chance in a Republican controlled legislature.

Republicans want to do away with several expenses including the Save Our State fund, teacher pay raises, greyhound subsidies and the casino modernization account. The GOP is also holding the line on spending for public and higher education and the Department of Health and Human Resources. Governor Justice says the legislature's plan only kicks the budget problem down the road.
