- We advocate for military victims of Sexual Violence, Domestic Violence and Families that have lost a loved one due to injustices in the process of reporting crimes.
- We have identified a pattern of murder by suicide that is amplified by a toxic culture that has failed to hold perpetrators accountable and be transparent with crime victims. This assessment is supported by the Secretary of Defense's March 2022 Memo citing the military has the highest rate of suicide that they have ever seen and Ft. Campbell in our backyard is listed as one of the installations with the largest problems. Why this matters to our community is that service members and veterans that are not receiving appropriate intervention for behavioral health issues are being discharged into our community and criminals that are not being held accountable go on to perpetrate in the communities that they reside in. Many don't know that one of the most famous serial killers in America began his crimes while serving in the US Army in Germany and was discharged for a substance abuse issue as documented in a New York times article in 2022.
- We are partnering with other veteran organizations in this community and across the nation to support efforts and legislation to ensure that service members have access to proper behavioral health care as a primary prevention effort and that crime victims within the military can utilize military and community-based programs to heal and seek justice. We must understand that justice comes in all forms and the most basic step in giving a crime victim justice is believing them and giving the access to healing resources.

 - The triple threat of fate at a networking event...
 - Lack of awareness

 - Lack of access (inconvenience, etc.)
 - The Event hosts
 - They are more aware than ever that people want to be out and about and networking
 - o They are competing now for priority and top relevance... Content isn't going to necessarily be the priority
 - It's the places that have the best experience and most relevant connections that will get the budget
- The experience of networking online/virtual events
 - There is one person at a time talking great focused attention for that one person, not necessarily great for everyone else
 - Getting to the individuals that are going to be ideal connections for you is harder in virtual events, you can't walk up
 - Everyone sharing a the Web meeting Chat Box to share their business and contact information is a bit chaotic
 - o I think we'll see more Virtual Background sharing information, often w/ QR Code
 - o Tips: QR Code for info and your name, and use the Name field as your tagline or offer
 - You have to hope your host puts you in the right chat group or you may spend an hour talking with really nice people that aren't good connections and don't have a network that includes your ideal connections.
 - Your time is managed by someone else, your access also, your awareness of your peers mostly as well... more restrictive than in-person networking
