Mission: Our Kids provides expert medical evaluations and crisis counseling for children and families in response to concerns of child sexual abuse. Our Kids publishes research and seeks to increase awareness about the epidemic prevalence of child sexual abuse.

- Four research papers published in major professional journals
- Expert testimony in courts of law throughout Middle Tennessee

What we know:

- Child sexual abuse happens in every community, in every zip code. 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 7 boys will be sexually abused before age 18.
- Most children don't tell immediately because of fear and confusion. Only 15% of the children Our Kids evaluates are seen within 72 hours of the assault.
- Based on the Our Kids injury prevalence study published in 2016, we know that only 6% of children have genital injury.
- In 90% of the cases, the perpetrator is someone known and trusted by the family.
- When children are believed and protected, the child and family are much more likely to begin the healing process and develop resiliency.

Each of us can show courage by learning about child sexual abuse, understanding how to respond if a child tells us something has happened, and supporting agencies who provide essential services to our most vulnerable children. We offer guidance on everything from how to recognize abuse to how to keep kids safe online. - Business: In 20216, I finished my bachelor, but I didn't want to change my career and That is when the idea of starting my own agency came. I started first agency Shine and Care at Home later changed it to Able Helpers Homecare. Able Helpers homecare is a non-medical home care focuses on serving people who are on Medicaid. Our services include Meal preparation, laundry, light housekeeping, medication reminder, assist with bath, dressing, toileting, transfer, and more activities of daily living. While I was trying to grow my business, I was also pursuing master's in business administration (MBA). In 2020, I finished MBA and then started another non-medical home care business, Christ Home Care which is focused mainly on high end private pay clients and work comp clients.
- Currently we are serving all counties in middle Tennessee, East Tennessee, and Louisville, KY
- Our mission at both of our entities is to serve and make an impact on clients who need care in the comfort of their own home.

- Our mission is to prevent unplanned pregnancies by providing education about and access to free long-acting reversible contraception (LARC). When people can plan their families, we know educational, economic, and health outcomes are improved for families. We remove barriers to LARC and have a call center that helps women navigate the process. We cover a well woman exam, STI testing, the cost of the device, removal at any time. The client never receives a bill. The only requirement to participate in our program is that the client be a resident or student in one of the 29 counties we serve.
- We have been doing this work for 7 years in middle TN. We have served more than 2,500 clients with these free healthcare services.
- We do this by partnering with organizations in the community who work with women who may want to know about our free resources. Community partners are key to our success. We provide education with their participants and are often in the community at health and community fairs.
- When we started this work, the rate of unplanned pregnancies in TN was 56% but most recent stats show a decline to 43%.
