Dan Elwell, the acting FAA administrator, will tell members of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation's Subcommittee on Aviation and Space Wednesday afternoon that the agency's "oversight approach needs to evolve," although he will say the processes used to certify the 737 MAX were "extensive, well-established, and have consistently produced safe aircraft designs for decades."

The pill, developed by researchers with the Los Angeles Biomedical Research Institute and the University of Washington, is a mixture of testosterone and progesterin, and is designed to be taken once per day. Christina Wang, the lead researcher on the project, said that the team gave the pill to 30 healthy men between 18 and 50 years old for 28 consecutive days, while 10 other men were given a placebo. The goal was to test for safety and hormonal responses, more than the drug's actual ability to prevent pregnancy. The results showed only minor symptoms were felt: fatigue, acne, and headaches.</p>

The key changes include providing</p>

					patients with information about breast density, in the form of a letter, with screening results. Mammograms of dense breasts are known to be more difficult to read and interpret. "The dense tissue can obscure signs of breast cancer and lower the sensitivity of the image," according to the FDA. Dense breasts are also known to be a risk factor for breast cancer. More than half of women over age 40 have dense breasts, according to the FDA.

In a release this week, the agency touted that it shut down "four separate operations" that were responsible for "bombarding consumers nationwide with billions of unwanted and illegal robocalls." According to the FTC, the groups responsible pitched a wide array of services from auto warranties and debt-relief services to home security systems, fake charities and services meant to help improve Google search results. All four operations named by the FTC were charged in either late 2017 or in 2018 with operating their illegal practices.

Some falsely claimed their licenses, while others either didn't exist or didn't know they were on the site in the first place.

The layoffs include the plant in Lordstown, Ohio, where about 1,200 people work. These new layoffs mean GM has terminated more than 14,000 jobs in the U.S. and Canada since last November. The cutbacks will save the company about \$3 billion by the end of this year, despite the cost of the buyouts, and a total of \$6 billion by the end of 2020. Jared Polis declined to intervene in a pay dispute between teacher union officials and school district officials, setting up the first strike in Colorado's biggest school district in 25 years. Before teachers take to the picket line, the two sides have a last-ditch negotiation effort scheduled for Friday, where they will try to close what Polis characterized as "small, limited differences." At issue is the payment structure for bonuses, which allow Denver educators to earn more for things like strong evaluations, students' high test scores and teaching in a high-performing or high-poverty school. School district officials proposed an additional \$20.5 million for the bonus program and indicated that they want higher bonuses for teachers who work in high-poverty schools where teacher turnover has been a problem. But the union negotiators asked for \$28 million, the bulk of which they want to go to increasing base salaries.</p>

Roughly 80% of taxpayers did indeed end up owing</p>

Exercising releases the hormone irisin, which has been linked to neuron growth in the part of the brain responsible for memory and learning. Though irisin was linked to neuron growth in the hippocampus, the researchers first wanted to see if there was a relationship between the hormone and Alzheimer's. The findings showed that those who have Alzheimer's have lower levels of irisin.
