Dear Mr. Milan:

In response to your letter of April 1, 2012, seeking retransmission consent from us with respect to the carriage of the DTV signal of our Station WUGA-TV, Toccoa, GA on your cable system at Toccoa and Royston, GA in the Greenville-Spartanburg DMA, please be advised that, under Section 325(b)(2)(A) of the Communications Act, as amended by the 1992 Cable Act, retransmission consent is not required for the carriage of the signal of noncommercial educational stations, including stations such as Station WUGA-TV.

In view of the foregoing, there is no basis for us to sign a retransmission consent agreement as suggested in your letter. We are, however, pleased that your system will carry Station WUGA-TV's signal, and we look forward to a continuing cooperative relationship between us.

Mandatory Carriage Election WUGA-TV, Toccoa, Georgia

Dear Mr. Johnson:

We write to re-introduce you to the University of Georgia's new Noncommercial Educational Television Station, WUGA-TV. The station is licensed to Toccoa, Georgia, and has its main studio and offices here on UGA's campus.

WUGA-TV began broadcasting in 1984 as WNEG-TV and operated as both a commercial independent station and a CBS affiliate between 1984 and 2008. In 2008, the University of Georgia acquired the station, and, last year, the station announced its partnership with Georgia Public Broadcasting. This year, the station successfully modified its broadcast license to reflect its new noncommercial status, began using the call letters "WUGA" to reflect its association with the University of Georgia, and became the only station in Georgia to broadcast PBS World programming on its primary digital stream.

Earlier this year, Nielsen assigned the station to the Atlanta DMA. Nielsen's decision reflected marketplace realities. First, the University of Georgia is located in Athens, and our main studio is located on the University's campus. As you may know, UGA and Athens play an important role in the Atlanta community. Second, our signal primarily covers the Atlanta market rather than North or South Carolina. Third, our programming and local outreach all focus on the Atlanta community rather than the Carolinas. For example, WUGA-TV will begin local news updates this fall and is currently airing student produced UGA Newsource. Historical documentaries such as the recent story of the rebirth of the Georgia Theatre, the bi-weekly program Public Health Impact (in cooperation with the UGA college of Public health), It's Friday (featuring live Athens area musical groups) and local symphony performances are also part of the program schedule. Selected sporting events from colleges in the region beginning in 2012 round out a platform of public service, information, entertainment and sports programming serving the important Northeast Georgia segment of the Atlanta DMA.

Thank you for submitting your petition and supporting documentation requesting that Nielsen change its Market of Origin (MMO) assignment for WUGA-TV having a FCC-assigned Community-of-License of Toccoa GA. Specifically, you have requested that Nielsen change WUGA-TV's MOO to the Atlanta GA DMA region from the current Greenville-Spartanburg-Asheville-Anderson DMA region.

Your petition has been reviewed and is approved.
