These 7 stations, *collectively known as "The RevFM Radio Network"* are based in State College, Pennsylvania and form a network of non-commercially licensed NCE-FM radio stations with listener involvement throughout the Central and North Central Pennsylvania regions.

The RevFM Radio Network airs a public interest program for the citizens of Pennsylvania entitled "Lincoln Radio Journal" (30 Minutes). The program airs Saturday mornings at 6:00 AM. The show is produced by the non-profit Lincoln Institute and is hosted by Lowman Henry. The show originates from Harrisburg, PA, the capital of Pennsylvania. The program spotlights non-profits, civic functions, public health issues and state wide governmental issues in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The RevFM Radio Network airs a public interest program addressing national issues entitled "American Radio Journal" (30 Minutes). The program airs Sunday mornings at 6:00 AM. The show is produced by the non-profit Lincoln Institute and is hosted by Lowman Henry. The show originates from Harrisburg, PA, the capital of Pennsylvania. The program spotlights civic functions, public health issues and governmental issues focused on the federal government in Washington, DC

The RevFM Radio Network airs a 1 minute program entitled "Family Matters Minute" which airs at 9:40 and 11:20 AM weekdays and random times on the weekend. The Family Matters Minute with Dr. Tim Kimmel is a cutting edge and leading-edge radio feature. Dr. Kimmel is a parenting and family expert. His goal is to bring hope and purpose to a listener's role as a family member. The show covers topics such as parenting, grand parenting and marriage. The program helps listeners to create an atmosphere of grace in their homes which will permeate all areas of their life and gives grace-based nuggets of truth and encouragement for the listener's journey as a family.

The RevFM Radio Network airs a 1 minute program entitled "Family Minute" which airs at 8:35 AM, 12:20 PM and 6:40 PM weekdays and random times on the weekend. The Family Minute with Mark Merrill, president of the national non-profit organization Family First, is a daily radio feature that offers everyday advice on marriage, parenting, and family relationships. This family relationship-focused broadcast reaches millions of listeners every week with practical, impactful, and relevant advice providing tips and reminders that can be immediately applied to improve relationships. Promoting positive views towards marriage, parenting, and relationships that help people love their families well and addressing real life issues and the common difficulties we all face in our relationships.

The RevFM Radio Network airs a 1 minute program entitled "Answers in Genesis" which airs at 7:10 AM and 4:25 PM, Weekdays. Ken Ham discusses the authority of the Bible from the very first verse including the topics of Creation versus evolution, Biblical inerrancy and infallibility, and how historical documents and archeological evidence point to the creation of the universe by a divine Creator.

The RevFM Radio Network airs a short (10 to 15 second) feature which is changed on a weekly basis. The feature, entitled "*BibleTrax*", airs around 30 minutes past the hour, every hour of the broadcast day. BibleTrax is designed to encourage listeners and provide Biblical insight. The feature facilitates Biblical education and knowledge by allowing the listener to memorize scripture by repeated airings at regular intervals.

The RevFM Radio Network airs short (30 to 60 second) features such as "DiscipleTips", "Journey Diaries" and "Ancient Wisdom" at random times of the day. These features include quotes or insights from modern and historical Christian artists, ministers and authors. The programs are designed to encourage the listener to learn more about the scripture or to apply the topic of the feature to their daily lives.

The RevFM Radio Network airs the 1 minute "*Plugged In*" review program produced by Focus on the Family. The program airs at **6:30 AM and 5:50 PM, Monday through Friday.** The feature is an entertainment guide full of the reviews listeners need to make wise personal and family-friendly decisions about movies, videos, music, TV, games and books found in modern culture.

The RevFM Radio Network affords the opportunity for churches and other non-profit organizations to have their *community events* aired, <u>free of charge</u>, via *Public Service Announcements* during **regular intervals throughout the prime hours of the broadcast day.** These events range in scope from free winter coat giveaways, food pantries, free cultural events, community socials, public lectures, blood drives, human services, etc. RevFM on-air personalities regularly invite non-profit groups to submit Public Service Announcements by email, our facebook page and our physical mailing address.

The RevFM Radio Network provides a *regional weather forecast* hourly from 6am to 10am weekdays. *Weather events* that are <u>an imminent threat to life or property</u> are <u>immediately</u> forwarded over the air from the regional National Weather Service in State College, Pennsylvania via our Emergency Alert System for any severe weather situation in all the counties within our 7 FM radio signal primary coverage areas.
