ISSUES COVERED: Employment opportunities for individuals with disabilities in Arkansas

PROGRAM: Community Matters

LENGTH: 26 minutes

DATE/TIME AIRED: April 22, 2012

TOPICS DISCUSSED:

History of Friendship Community care, their expansion into NWA, their quality of care and their successful business models, which provide employments opportunities for the disabled. Discussed how NWA can get involved and make a difference by volunteering or providing job for the disabled.

TOPICS DISCUSSED:

Building homes for deserving families in need of safe, clean and secure accommodations; finding all the resources to build the homes and / or raising the money and securing the volunteers to make the project possible. We discussed the need for donations such as land or carpentry / contractor labor. Discussion about how NWA can help build a dream for someone through volunteer hours with Habitat for Humanity.

Funding for the new Children's House location, the challenge to keep the program small and intimate for maximum one-on-one attention. Providing a nurturing and safe place for children who have been abused. Concluded our discussion by talking about their fundraiser, Starry, Starry Night.
