Jeanne Zavada—Museum Director, Gray Fossil Museum

The museum was funded by the State of Tennessee to exhibit finds from the Gray Fossil site. In addition to local finds the museum will display traveling exhibits related to natural history.

Dr. Steven Wallace—Director, Don Sunquist Center of Excellence in Paleontology

A laboratory on site is designed to preserve and display specimens. Dr. Wallace oversees the digging process as well as the documentation and preservation of fossil finds.

Persons who may have collected specimens prior to closing of the area are encouraged to bring these in for preservation.
