Jobs are crucial to our state and in particularly Southern, Ohio generally the counties with the highest unemployment rate are situated in Southern & Southern Eastern Ohio. As of December 2024 – Pike County #13 with 4.3% unemployment.

Scioto County #14 with 4.2% unemployment.

Adams County #5 – 4.9%
