Issues Statement

- 4. Application of science to practical life needs: health, the environment, geography, society, and quality of life
- 5. Search for peaceful solutions to the challenging issues of the day

Programs

There are three ways that the programming on WLGI strives to address the issues outlined above: music, public service and community announcements, short informational programs, and informational interview programs.

Music - every song with lyrics that is aired on WLGI is selected for the message in the music. These include themes of justice, oneness, reliance on God, patience, generosity, kindness, joy, responsibility, trustworthiness, and service to others.
