**KNAM** provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the previous calendar quarter were:

- **Water:** Saving water is mandatory in the west, and one method of saving water is dealing with invasive weeds and plants like tamarisk. A group called River's Edge West is focusing on removing those and replacing them with natural vegetation. The City of Grand Junction looking at water conservation through gray water reuse.
- **Health:** The opioid crisis continues to grow. The pharmaceutical settlement includes billions of dollars for states to combat the problem. How will Colorado use its money? Attorney General Phil Weiser explains.
- **Mental Health:** Trouble at Mind Springs Health, serving 10 Western Colorado counties is under investigation for poor quality of care. The Colorado News Collaborative reporting on the areas of service under investigation.
- **Business:** The Grand Junction Area Chamber of Commerce is an active part of the business community, receiving national recognition. Diane Schwenke, the head of the Chamber for the past 33 years is retiring and talks about the Chamber and it's role in the community.
- **Transportation:** Fatalities in Colorado are alarmingly high. Colorado Department of Transportation working on educating the public and putting programs in place to reduce the trend.
