MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE A KEY POLITICAL ISSUE

Synopsis:
Even as Democrats lurch toward a potentially disastrous midterm election, support for raising the federal minimum wage is resonating with voters. In fact, it may be the only issue on which Democrats are winning: A Pew Research Center poll earlier this year found 90 percent of Democrats and 53 percent of Republicans favored raising the federal minimum to \$10.10 from its current \$7.25, as proposed by President Barack Obama. Four Republican-leaning states have state-level minimum wage increases on the ballot this year - Alaska (\$9.75), Arkansas (\$8.50), Nebraska (\$9), and South Dakota (\$8.50) - and the increases will likely pass in all four. The same goes for a non-binding Illinois referendum on raising the minimum wage to \$10. Democrats anticipate these measures will boost Democratic turnout in all five states, particularly among African-Americans.

Southern California police have arrested a 31-year-old man in the hit-and-run deaths of three teenage girls who had gone trick-or-treating on Halloween. Santa Ana police Chief Carlos Rojas said Monday that Joaquin Bell of Orange was booked for investigation of felony hit-and-run causing death. The chief says the Orange County district attorney's office is considering the case. Authorities had said they were looking for the driver and another person who fled the scene of Friday evening's crash, which claimed the lives of 13-year-old twins and their 13-year-old friend at a crosswalk. The police chief says Bell had two minor children in the vehicle with him at the time and they have been released. A damaged black Honda SUV was found a short distance from where the collision occurred.

AMENDMENT 2 FAILS IN FLORIDA

Synopsis:

Although polls have found almost 90 percent public support for medical marijuana in Florida, a state measure that would have legalized cannabis for medicinal purposes failed on Tuesday. A majority of voters approved of Amendment 2, about 57 percent, but state law requires a supermajority of support -- 60 percent or higher -- so the ballot initiative failed to pass. Amendment 2 would have legalized marijuana for medical purposes in Florida. The measure proposed allowing doctors to prescribe cannabis for debilitating medical conditions, which the bill defined as cancer, multiple sclerosis, glaucoma, hepatitis C, HIV, AIDS, ALS, Crohn's disease, Parkinson's disease or other conditions for which a physician believes that the medical use of marijuana would likely outweigh the potential health risks for a patient.

ABORTION IN THE UNITED STATES
VO 30 SEC.

Synopsis:

Voters on ballot initiatives in 41 states gave a resounding thumbs-up to recreational marijuana and higher minimum wages, while dividing on abortion-related measures and GMO labeling. Scores of measures that thickened ballot booklets from Alaska to Florida included a ban on bear baiting (overturned), immigrants IDs rejected and gun background checks (approved). In Colorado, voters rejected a proposal to add unborn human beings to the state's criminal code, a measure that some feared could ban abortion. And in North Dakota, voters rejected a right-to-life state constitutional amendment that abortion rights advocates feared would have ended legal abortions there. The North Dakota measure would have declared the inalienable right to life of every human being at every stage of development must be recognized and protected.

LATINO VOTE IN COLORADO
LUIS MEGID / DENVER, COLORADO

Synopsis:

Latino activists and immigration reform advocates knew going into the midterms that 2014 wasn't the ideal election to punish Republicans for killing a path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants. The House was largely insulated from any serious challenge, few Senate races up for grabs had significant Latino voting populations, and turnout in off years tends to draw older, white, conservative voters. Even by that standard, however, Tuesday night was rough. Nationally, Democrats won 64% of Latino voters, according to exit polls - exactly halfway between their 60% level in 2010 and 68% in 2012. The numbers suggest the GOP still has major hurdles with one of the fastest-growing voting blocs in the nation, an issue that will loom large in 2016. Republican pollsters preemptively warned the party earlier this week not to get too excited by their gains on Tuesday given these broader problems.

Minimum wage - election

Synopsis:

Voters in four states approved measures Tuesday to raise the minimum wage The Associated Press projected. The wage increase won its biggest margin of victory in Alaska, where it garnered 69 percent of the vote. In Arkansas, it received 65 percent; in Nebraska, 59 percent

approved raising the minimum wage, while in South Dakota, the margin was 53 percent. The proposals differed in their particulars. Alaska would set its minimum wage the highest, with a gradual rise to \$9.75 by 2016. Nebraska would go to \$9 in 2016, South Dakota to \$8.50 in 2015 and Arkansas to \$8.50 by 2017. In Alaska and South Dakota, the minimum wage would continue to rise in line with price inflation in following years, which makes an enormous difference in the long term.

OBAMA ON EXECUTIVE ACCION TOWARDS IMMIGRATION REFORM

Synopsis:

President Barack Obama showed no signs of backing down from executive action on immigration reform on Wednesday, despite a Republican wave that ripped control of the U.S. Senate away from Democrats the night before. Obama said that before the end of the year, he is going to take whatever lawful actions at the White House, although he declined to offer specifics on what an executive order might look like. The president said he plans to reach out to Republican leaders in both chambers to gauge their agenda, but added that he is done waiting for lawmakers on Capitol Hill to take action. Republicans are almost certain to cry foul when Obama takes immigration action. A group of conservative Republican senators, including Ted Cruz (R-Texas) and Jeff Sessions (R-Ala.), sent a letter on Wednesday to Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-Nev.) threatening to use procedural means to block any executive action by the president. Sen. Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.), who won re-election Tuesday and will likely be the next Senate majority leader, said during a press conference ahead of Obama's speech that Republicans could take up immigration reform, but the chances of that happening would be hurt if the president takes executive action.

LATINOS IN CONGRESS

Synopsis:

Latinos made history in the 114th Congress, bringing the total number of Hispanics in Capitol Hill to 32 - 29 U.S. representatives and three U.S. senators. The number of Latinos in Congress has increased by one during the midterm election on Tuesday, from 28. Five Latinos are heading to the Capitol for the first time, three Democrats (Arizona's Rubén Gallego, California's Norma Torres and Pete Aguilar) and two Republicans (Florida's Carlos Curbelo and West Virginia's Alex Mooney). Mooney, a Cuban-American, became the first Latino representative in West Virginia, the state with the smallest percentage of Hispanics in the nation. Among the Latino candidates for Congress who failed to win election were Florida's Joe García and Texas' Pete Gallego, both of whom were running for reelection after just one term.

NO DRIVER'S LICENCES TO UNDOCUMENTED IN OREGON

Synopsis:

On Tuesday night, Oregon voters killed a ballot initiative that would have allowed undocumented immigrants in the state to apply for driver's licenses. The ballot initiative known as Measure 88 would have given four-year driver's licenses to undocumented immigrants without requiring proof of legal presence in the United States and died with a vote of 68 -33

percent. Undocumented immigrants would also be required to provide "proof of residence in Oregon for more than one year, and has provided proof of identity and date of birth" and could show a foreign passport or consular document and proof of state residency.

SEXUAL ASSAULT TO CHILDREN FROM PRIESTS

Synopsis:

The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago said it will release on Thursday internal files of 36 priests who church officials found had sexually abused children. The files were to be released online at 9 a.m. CST, the archdiocese said in a statement. Together with other documents released earlier this year, they were expected to show how the archdiocese dealt with abuse allegations during the past six decades. As part of a mediation agreement, the Chicago Archdiocese in January released files on 30 former priests accused of abusing minors. Lawyers for victims had said at the time they wanted the archdiocese to release documents on more than 30 other priests. Thursday's release, which comes less than two weeks before the retirement of Cardinal Francis George, would be the latest in a series of such abuse disclosures by Midwest church officials.

OBAMACARE UNDER REPUBLICAN THREAT

Synopsis:

ObamaCare is back under threat as Republicans take control of the Senate after a wave of important victories Tuesday night. The GOP won pledging to deal blows to the healthcare law, which remains unpopular in its fourth year. And efforts to derail it could gain ammunition starting Nov. 15, if HealthCare.gov encounters more problems in its second enrollment period. Hopes for expanding Medicaid under the Affordable Care Act in five crucial states also appear dashed, after Republicans kept all five governorships on Tuesday. There is no chance the healthcare law will be repealed with President Obama still in office. Most Republican leaders acknowledge the bulk of the system is too entrenched to root out now, with millions of Americans receiving benefits. But that doesn't mean there won't be sustained action taken against provisions opposed by Republicans and their allies. Add to that the inevitable symbolic moves - a full repeal effort is almost certain - and it means a slew of new healthcare fights are waiting to happen.

HOME DEPOT CREDIT CARDS AND EMAILS HACKED

Synopsis:

Hackers stole 53 million email addresses in addition to customers' card data, Home Depot said Thursday. The nation's largest home improvement chain had disclosed the massive, months-long breach of 56 million debit and credit cards in September. Home Depot's breach has surpassed Target's pre-Christmas 2013 data theft, which compromised 40 million credit and debit cards and hurt sales and profits. Since late last year, Michaels, SUPERVALU and Neiman Marcus have been among a string of retailers that have also reported breaches, though they were smaller. While shoppers appear to have grown numb to the hacks, the breaches have forcing changes in retailing. Target's breach pushed banks, retailers and card companies to increase security by speeding the adoption of microchips in U.S. credit and debit cards, which

supporters say are more secure. Home Depot reiterated Thursday that it will be activating chip-enabled checkout terminals at all of its U.S. stores by the end of the year.

MEXICAN TEEN'S MOM STILL WANTS ANSWERS

Synopsis:

Just after 11:30 p.m., two years ago Friday, the shots rang out. A Border Patrol agent, aiming through a narrow opening in the border fence, emptied all 12 rounds from his 0.40-caliber pistol. He reloaded and continued firing, riddling a teenage boy in the back and head, leaving him face-down in a pool of his own blood. The Border Patrol said the agent fired at rock-throwers; witnesses say the boy killed was just walking down the street. During the two years since Jose Antonio Elena Rodriguez, 16, was shot to death, much has changed. New policies inside Customs and Border Protection, federal court rulings and public pressure are combining in ways that may help prevent similar contentious deaths.

ASSISTED SUICIDE IN NEW JERSEY

Synopsis:

Just days after Brittany Maynard's assisted suicide launched a national debate on the ethics of the controversial practice; the New Jersey Assembly is set to hold a debate and vote on whether to become the next state to legalize it. Bill A2270 is now scheduled to be voted on Thursday and pro-life groups like New Jersey Right to Life are urging pro-life residents to call and email their legislators and ask for a no vote. The legislation states that the process outlined in the bill should be entirely voluntary and even includes language to hold persons accountable who coerce or exert undue influence on a patient to request medication; however, other sections in the bill leave ample room for abuse by relatives, friends, caregivers and the medical profession.

1 IN 4 LATINOS DON'T HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE

Synopsis:

A year after open enrollment under the Affordable Care Act began, 1 in 4 Latinos in the United States do not have health insurance, according to new Census Bureau data, more than any other ethnic population. And most states have few backups in place to help those in the coverage gap. Latino immigrants are the hardest-hit: Foreign-born Hispanics are more than twice as likely to be uninsured as are U.S.-born Hispanics, according to Census data compiled by the Pew Research Center. A variety of factors account for this, including a lack of culturally specific outreach programs, language barriers, financial concerns, frustration with the law's complexities and fears that applying could reveal a relative's illegal status. Illustrating some of these challenges was the woman in Joachin's clinic who grew up in a Honduran refugee camp and couldn't read or write in any language. As a legal resident, she was eligible to purchase health insurance through the exchanges created by the law

A SCARE AT THE NEW WORLD TRADE CENTER AS TWO WINDOW WASHERS WERE LEFT HANGING IN A SCAFFOLD IN FROM OF A WINDOW AT THE 68TH FLOOR OF THE STRUCTURE

Synopsis:

Juan Lopez and Juan Lizama the two window washers, who became trapped on a scaffold near the 68th floor of One World Trade Center and were rescued and brought to safety Wednesday

afternoon. The incident began at around 12:45 p.m. on the south side of the building - about 820 feet off the ground at the 68th floor. Initial reports suggested the washers were done cleaning the windows and were about to ascend to the top of the tower when the cable that pulls the scaffold up became loose. Officials said during a news conference that a slack had developed on the left side of the scaffolding, causing it to tilt dangerously, scaffold operating contractor Upgrade Services said the slack appeared to be caused by an equipment failure in the traction hoist brake mechanism, which supports one side of the rig. Officials shared tips on how to stay safe while working in dangers jobs.

The high court kept intact a lower-court ruling from three weeks ago that struck down the law, which was passed in 2006 amid a series of immigration crackdowns in Arizona over the past decade. The law denies bail to immigrants who are in the country illegally and have been charged with a range of felonies that include shoplifting, aggravated identity theft, sexual assault and murder. As a result, immigrants spend months in jail and often simply plead guilty and get turned over to federal immigration authorities for deportation. The decision clears the way for a wave of bail hearings for immigrants across Arizona.

One of the petitioners is a young woman from Honduras who suffered severe gender-based violence from partners, friends, and family. When she first entered the United States in 2007, immigration officials apprehended and detained her for 22 days. During that time, no one explained to her she had a right to seek asylum protection. After she was deported, she suffered abuse that became so unbearable she again fled to the United States. Years later, the Honduran woman was taken into immigration custody from her home. LICENSES FOR UNDOCUMENTED IN CALIFORNIA

The California Department of Motor Vehicles has begun preparing to implement a law that will provide undocumented immigrants in the United States legal means of obtaining a California driver license by the beginning of next year. The law will go into effect and DMV will begin issuing Assembly Bill (AB) 60 driver licenses on Jan. 2, but DMV has been planning and drawing up regulations for new drivers of all types over the last year. AB 60 requires DMV to issue an original driver license to an applicant who is unable to submit satisfactory proof of legal presence in the United States. Driver license applicants under AB 60 must still meet all other qualifications for licensure, which includes passing the required vision test, driver license knowledge test and the behind-the-wheel drive test, as well as provide satisfactory proof of identity and California residency.

AIR BAG RECALL EXTENDED TO WHOLE COUNTRY

U.S. safety regulators are demanding that automakers and Takata Corp. expand nationwide a recall of vehicles with certain driver's side air bags equipped with inflators that can erupt and send metal fragments into the passenger compartment. Previously, cars with the inflators have been recalled only in areas along the Gulf Coast with high humidity. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration says it's basing its latest decision on an incident that happened outside of those areas. The owner of a 2007 Ford Mustang recently complained to the government about suffering an injury when an air bag malfunctioned in North Carolina. The

safety agency says if Takata and automakers don't agree to the recall quickly, it will use its legal powers to make sure the inflators are recalled.

ICE TO CLOSE IMMIGRATION CENTER IN NEW MEXICO

New Mexico's controversial temporary immigration detention center for children and families will close at the end of the year. The detention center at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Artesia opened in late June at a time when tens of thousands of Central American families were caught crossing the border illegally. In the past six weeks, Burch says 448 Central American mothers and children were let go. His figures showed 28 were deported in the last six weeks. As a result, they would pay into the Social Security system through payroll taxes. No such "lawfully present" immigrant, however, would be immediately entitled to the benefits because like all Social Security and Medicare recipients they would have to work 10 years to become eligible for retirement payments and health care. To be eligible, either Congress or future administrations would have to extend Obama's actions so that those immigrants would still be considered lawfully present in the country. According to ComScore, last year's Cyber Monday was the biggest online shopping day in history, with online spending reaching US\$1.46 billion on that day alone. However, there could be a chance that attackers will take advantage of the day to target both consumers and retailers. According to a recent study from RSA Security and the Ponemon institute, 64 percent of retail-focused IT professionals have seen an increase in attacks and fraud attempts during high traffic days such as Cyber Monday. But just one third of these IT professionals take special precautions to ensure high availability and integrity of websites on these days. Worse still, the estimated direct cost of a cyber-attack around the holiday season is believed to be US\$8,000 a minute. There are several ways that attackers could target retailers and consumers during Cyber Monday. Identity theft is one possible threat and it has plagued many stores and customers in recent years. The increased traffic on Cyber Monday could entice attackers to target vulnerabilities in retailers' infrastructure in order to plant malware that could steal consumers' information.

Immigrants entering the U.S. illegally are increasingly making states along the East Coast their home rather than states closer to the Mexican border. New Jersey, Florida and Pennsylvania were among seven states to register gains in unauthorized immigrants from 2009 to 2012, even as the total number of immigrants here in the U.S. unlawfully was unchanged at 11.2 million, according to a report released Tuesday by the nonpartisan Pew Research Center. New Jersey had the biggest gain, jumping 75,000 to 525,000 as many immigrants from India and Ecuador crossed illegally into the state. It was followed by Florida, increasing 50,000 to 925,000. Pennsylvania was third, rising 30,000 to 170,000. It saw increases from several regions including Honduras, India and the Dominican Republic, many of whom moved into the rapidly diversifying southeastern part of the state.
