October, 2022	Williamson CO Rezone	We notified Williamson County Parents that there will be a rezoning of schools due to 2 elementary schools being added in the area.
October, 2022	Education Numbers	We notified the community that the Tennessee Report Card for students has dropped since the pandemic. In an interview, the TN Education Commissioner encouraged the communities to move forward with a commitment to do what is best for the kids.
November, 2022	Election Coverage	We provided LIVE up-to-the-minute election coverage of our Local and National Mid-Term Election results. This coverage included the emotional "Victory Speech" of Tennessee's Governor and his wife (who has been battling cancer).
November, 2022	Get Flu Shot	Several county schools are closed due to the outbreak of the flu virus. Doctors are urging everyone to get their flu shots before the holidays and are claiming it will help the immune system fend off the virus. Any Metro Health Department Clinic is offering free flu shots.
December, 2022	Porch Pirates	As the holidays approach, we have completed several stories to warn our viewers of "Porch Pirates" stealing packages delivered. We also shared alternative options when scheduling deliveries.
December, 2022	Fairground Speedway Hearing	We attended a hearing that presented pleas on both sides referencing the redevelopment of the Nashville Fairgrounds Speedway. Opinions were shared about concerns that the racetrack is too loud and there is a pollution element to consider for a residential area. On the other hand, supporters shared the economic boost this would provide for the city.
