Police said that the arrest happened after a crash, chase, dogs & helicopter were used to capture him. We spoke with one homeowner now facing major damages due to the chase.
3/07/23	Drag Racing Pack - PKG	10pm	1:52	During a recent Metro Council Meeting the issue of drag racing was brought up as a concern. Metro Nashville Police arrested a man for allegedly crashing into another vehicle during a drag race, killing the driver on Monday afternoon.
3/27/23	Six Children Killed in Crash – PKG	4AM	2:08	EMS with Robertson County reported 6 children, a woman with a man driving a Toyota Camry were found turned over on the side of the road. The woman and 6 children were ejected from the vehicle and all 6 children died. The woman was in critical condition. The EMS Chief, Brent Dyer, reminded people how important it is to use the proper restraint devices for children in vehicles.

On Monday morning, March 27th, 2023, an active shooter, identified as Audrey Hale age 28, shot and killed three students and three adults at The Covenant School, a Christian School in Nashville, Tennessee. The police shot the suspect, Audrey Hale, at the scene so seven people in total died. She was a former student at the school. We were in “Live Breaking News Coverage” from 10:55am to 7:03pm (approximately 8 hours and 10 minutes).

As the school property was checked out, the remaining students were escorted out of the building to a safe location to be reunited with their parents. We were live on the scene as the children walked out of the building and stayed at the scene with several crews following all aspects of this story.

In a press conference, police said Hale had two “assault-style” weapons and a pistol which were legally purchased. She shot through a door to enter the building. Metro Nashville Police Department, along with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, said that its investigation led to the discovery of a manifesto with a plan and drawing. This confirmed that this was a targeted attack. The coverage of this shooting made National News.

On Wednesday, March 29th we preempted NBC Nightly News at 5:30pm for live breaking coverage of the mayor’s Nashville Vigil for the school shooting victims. One of our anchors, Amanda Hara was LIVE from the field covering this vigil. Hundreds of people gathered inside Public Square Park in downtown Nashville to pray, to begin to heal and to love on each other after Monday’s school shooting. Local artists provided music, Mayor Cooper spoke and First Lady, Jill Biden attended the vigil. We interviewed several people in attendance and expressed our support.

On Monday, April 3rd, we preempted NBC NEWS Daily at 1PM for live breaking coverage of the Governor Bill Lee’s response and upcoming plans for the state of Tennessee regarding the recent school shooting. We were on-air for approximately 30 minutes during this press conference.
