DESCRIPTION: Coverage of the swearing in of President Barack Obama, and the days activities, including the luncheon and parade.

DATE: Tuesday, March 3, 2009
TIME: 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
LENGTH: 60 minutes
DESCRIPTION: Neighbors report a pale little girl without clothes hidden from the world. Learn what police found when they entered the home, and what happened to the biological mother that neglected the little girl. Dr. Bruce Perry joins Oprah to talk about some extreme cases of child neglect and the story of 10 year old Danielle.

TITLE: "Dr. Phil" – "Omaha Mall Shooting: A Mother's Guilt"

His wife Gayle explains why she stayed by his side and when it took to rebuild their family.

TITLE: "Oprah Winfrey Show" – "Oprah Talks To An Entire Family Addicted To Heroin"
DATE: Tuesday, February 17, 2009
TIME: 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
LENGTH: 60 minutes
DESCRIPTION: Oprah speaks to a mom, dad and two teenage sons all addicted to heroin. Cameras follow a mom and dad on their daily drug run with their infant son. Everyone in the family is hooked except the baby. Oprah also speaks to a pregnant woman struggling with her addiction – she shoots up every 4 hours.

TITLE: "Dr Phil" – "An Addict In The Family"
DATE: Monday, January, 12, 2009
TIME: 3:00 - 4:00 p.m.
LENGTH: 60 minutes
DESCRIPTION: While battling cancer, Paula says she missed the signs their 21 year old daughter, CJ, was disconnecting from the family and turning to drugs to heal her anguish. After Paula's husband had an affair, the signs of trouble became clearer. The family has done everything to help her – rehab, counseling, tough love, but nothing helped. CJ ingests a combination of 13 prescription and street drugs and is on the edge of killing herself.
