ITEMS OF PUBLIC INTEREST AIR ON KDPM-FM Q3 2023

As part of KDPM's regular programming schedule from 6a-7p Monday through Friday the station airs announcements, updates, interviews and pre-recorded promos regarding a myriad of items in the public interest. It should be noted that these announcements are not relegated to only 30 minutes of "public interest" programming per week but are integrated as part of the station's day-to-day programming with each announcement airing a minimum of three to four times a day and sometimes more.
