I Hillcrest Family Services

Hillcrest Family Services operates over thirty programs for over twenty four thousand people in the Tri States area. They include housing, health care, and help for those who need it due to physical disabilities, poverty, or if they are victims of many other problems. One of Hillcrest's major fund raising efforts is "Reflections in the Park", a lit, drive through, Christmas display every year in Murphy Park in Dubuque. This year, a new feature is "Memory Lane", a display honoring people who have passed away. Hillcrest was also looking for more sponsors for the various displays in the park. Greg Birkett and Sondra Bennett were interviewed about the need for funding for the event. A list of the times and dates of each interview is attached to this report for each Cumulus of Dubuque station.

II America's Veterans

Aaron Hayes, the manager of Sport Clips in Dubuque appeared on all five of our stations to promote the Help a Hero Program. A portion of haircuts will be donated to a fund providing scholarships for returning U.S. veterans of up to five thousand dollars. Sport Clips is also offering free haircuts to all current and active military personnel on Veterans Day.

III Welfare of Animals

Every Tuesday Morning, Cumulus of Dubuque presents interviews with Jane McCall of the Dubuque Regional Humane Society. The interviews contain information about proper animal care, upcoming fundraising events, and descriptions of animals available at the Dubuque Regional Humane Society. IV Galena High School News

Every Friday afternoon at 4:40 during the school year, WDBQ-FM presents a program, approximately two minutes in length, recorded by students from Galena, IL High School. The program contains high school news, lists coming events, and mentions accomplishments by outstanding students.

V Local Traffic and Road Construction

Road and street construction can effect businesses, gasoline usage oand the time listeners spend commuting. The safety of construction workers is another concern as is the viability of business people who have business locations in construction areas. All five Cumulus of Dubuque stations present a rundown of the latest detours and traffic construction areas every weekday morning at 6:20 am.

WJOD and WDBQ-FM participated in the Crop Walk on October 6th. The Crop Walk raises funds for the DBQ Food Pantry and the Dubuque Rescue Mission to buy food for these operations. A ninety second interview with Mary Ann Loguidice was aired several times on both stations prior to the event, plus the Crop Walk was included in many public service announcements.

VII Welfare of Women and Children

Ann Lorenz is the director of Opening Doors, which operates the Maria House and Theresa Shelter. These facilities provides homes for women and children who would be homeless, and to families temporarily escaping domestic abuse. Ann told us about these places in addition to promiting a fundraising event at the Floor Emporium on November 1st in Dubuque.

X Coats for Kids

Every fall Cumulus of Dubuque Radio Stations teams with Dupaco Community Credit Union to collect slightly used or new winter coats, hats, gloves, scarves and other winter apparel. The items are distributed to children of lesser means. This interview with Amy Wickham of Dupaco explains where people can drop the clothes, what type of items they need. OTHER SERVICES

NEWS: All Cumulus of Dubuque / Townsquare Media of Dubuque stations carry news of the American Broadcasting Company and six local newscasts each weekday. In addition, WDBQ-AM carries Iowa state news from Radio Iowa.

WEATHER: Cumulus / Townsquare features full access to satellite and radar pictures of current conditions. WJOD is associated with Weathertime, a private weather service that has a much better track record than the National Weather Service, is faster with their reports, and is especially valuable to the Dubuque area's extensive agricultural community.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Cumulus / Townsquare of Dubuque stations average well over 50 locally oriented public service announcements per day for various non-profit groups in the tri states.
