Singer Luis Enrique Meets Berklee College of Music: Grammy and Latin Grammy-Winning singer Luis Enrique visited Berklee College of Music in November, as part of the school's Latin Music and Culture Celebration. Known for his smooth vocals, Nicaraguan singer-songwriter Luis Enrique—"the Prince of Salsa"—is one of Latin music's first pioneers of the romantic "salsa sensual" style. Backed by a large student ensemble, he performed some of his biggest hits at Berklee College of Music. The program Orale con Veronica covered the event, interviewing Luis Enrique exclusively and filming footage of the concert. Veronica Robles, the host of Orale con Veronica, and Luis Enrique talked about his visit to Berklee and what it meant to him to perform alongside Latin students, a minority within the college. Luis Enrique also talked about a clinic he taught to students.

Special Dominican Festival in Providence

Held annually in Providence, Rhode Island, since 1987, the Dominican Festival and Parade celebrates the city's rich Dominican heritage. The event features a parade on Broad Street and a festival of music, food and family activities at Roger Williams Park. The event is organized by the nonprofit Quisqueya in Action and the Dominican American Association of Rhode Island. Orale con Veronica covered the parade and the festival, and it featured an appearance by Providence Mayor Angel Taveras, who is the son of Dominican immigrants and the city's first

Hispanic mayor; State Representative Grace Diaz, Congressman Jim Langevin, plus artistic performances on stage including Dominican music and folklore dances.

Veronica Robles, host of Orale con Veronica, gives back to the community with this Special Thanksgiving show. Veronica collected donated food and gift baskets to give out to families in need in Lawrence, Chelsea, East Boston and Waltham. Veronica partnered with local community organizations and Hispanic churches in those areas, which coordinated the food donations to the families in need. In late November, Veronica also held a health and education mini fair in Waltham, in coordination with Latinos en Accion, a local civic nonprofit that advocates for Latino issues.
