April 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022

April 3, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am

30-minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention Month, Education and Community Involvement.

Guest: Kathleen LaValle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA.

Topic: The month of April is Child Abuse Prevention Month and so Kathleen LaValle from Dallas CASA joined me to talk about what we all need to be on the lookout for when it comes to child abuse. Kathleen talked about the stressors, including the economy with high gas prices and the high cost of food, that have led to parents and/or caregivers taking out their anger and fear on children in their care.. Kathleen spoke of the work that CASA does to help children who have been abused and neglected and how the community can get involved to help and how they can become CASA volunteers to help children who are navigating the child welfare system. We spoke of the requirements for volunteers and the impact that the CASA volunteers make and the future for children who have been abused and neglected.

April 10, 2022

Aired 6am to 6:30am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues, Education Issues and Economic Issues.

Guests: Dr. Todd Aguilera and Randi Ervin with the Pancreatic Action Network and Jennifer and Kyle Riggs with the American Heart Association.

Topic: Dr. Todd Aguilera and Randi Ervin joined me for the first part of our program to talk about the upcoming PANCAN Purple Stride which will be held April 30th at Klyde Warren Park in Dallas that will benefit the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network and the work that they do to support people who have been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer and also the important research that they fund in to pancreatic cancer, the deadliest form of cancer. Dr. Aguilera talked about what people should know about this deadly killer and the progress being made in research and in medications to improve survivability when someone has been diagnosed. Randi Ervin who is a pancreatic cancer survivor shared his personal journey and talked about the ways that the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network has helped him and his family and the importance of the upcoming Purple Stride. Jennifer and Kyle Riggs joined me for the second half of the program. Jennifer and Klye are the co-chairs of the upcoming Tarrant County Heart Ball which will benefit the American Heart Association. Kyle suffered a massive heart attack when he was only 36 years old and shared his story of the symptoms that he experienced and how a complete stranger at a pharmacy saved him because he knew CPR. Jennifer and Kyle talked about the important work that the American Heart Association is doing in North Texas to raise awareness about heart disease and who is at risk and how we can be better advocates for our health and the health of our loved ones and they talked about the importance of learning CPR because the life you safe could be of someone you love.

April 17, 2022

Aired 6am to 6:30am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Education

Guests: Jacqueline Leach the Executive Director of the Crohns and Colitis Foundation of North Texas and Sara Khaleghipour this year's honored hero for the Take Steps Dallas Walk.

Topic: As the pandemic finally seems to wind down more and more events are returning to in person status and that includes the upcoming Take Steps Walk in Dallas and Fort Worth which will benefit the Crohns and Colitis Foundation on North Texas. Jacqueline Leach and Sara Khaleghipour joined me to talk about the upcoming events and to encourage people to come out and take part to raise awareness about Crohns and Colitis and also to help raise funds for research. Sara shared her story of being diagnosed with Crohns when she was in high school and how for the longest times doctors did not know what was going on and

how that impacted her mental health and how she lost so much weight that she almost died of malnutrition. She talked about getting her diagnosis and the hurdles she has had to overcome but how she now has a full life thanks to progress into medications and treatment thanks to research funded in part by the Crohns and Colitis Foundation. Jacqueline talked about the work that the Foundation does in North Texas and how it supports families like Sara's. We talked about signs and symptoms and how more and more young people are being affected by IBD and the camp that the foundation has just for children who suffer from IBD.

April 24, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Pregnancy and Pre-term Births, Health Issue and Economic Issues and Homelessness.

Guests: Ryan Miller the Fort Worth March for Babies Ambassador and Daniel Robie the CEO of Austin Street Center in Dallas. Topic: With Mother's Day coming up in just a couple of weeks we decided to highlight the work of the March of Dimes in focusing on the health of mothers and mothers to be. The annual March of Dimes March for Babies will be held in Fort Worth on May 7th and the Dallas event will be held on May 14th and both events will be in person this year after several years of virtual events due to the pandemic. Ryan Miller who along with his wife is serving as the Ambassador Family for this year's event joined me to talk about their families personal experience with pre-term birth. Their twins Dexter and Daxton were born at 37 weeks and had to be in the neo natal intensive care unit for several months but now are active three year olds. Ryan shared how the March of Dimes helped their family and how the research that the March of Dimes funds led to the drugs that helped his premature twins. We talked about the programs that the March of Dimes offers from It Starts with Mom which provides resources for Moms to Be and also the advocacy work that the organization does for newborn screenings and prenatal programs and research centers. Daniel Robie joined me for the second half of the program to talk about the rise in the homeless population in North Texas as more and more families fall on hard times and we talked about the face of the homeless which often times is not the person on the street. We also talked about the work that the Austin Street Center in Dallas does to help the homeless from providing safe shelter and meeting the basic needs of the most vulnerable to working with other nonprofits to provide wrap around services to those who find themselves on the streets or living in their car. We also talked about the upcoming 7th Annual No Place Like Home fundraiser at Klyde Warren Park in Dallas on April 28th that will raise awareness about the homeless situation and talk about best practices and also raise funds for the work that Austin Street Center does.

May 1, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issues and Pediatric Cancer

Guest: Cindy Brinker Simmons the founder of Wipe Out Kids Cancer.

Topic: Mother's day is coming up next Sunday and we are focusing on moms in our area who have made an impact on our community. Cindy Brinker Simmons the founder of Wipe Out Kids Cancer joined me to talk about how she created this nonprofit as a tribute to her mom who she lost to cancer and in honor of her son. Wipe Out Kids Cancer is now in its 40^{th} year and thanks to their efforts funding research projects at hospitals across the country the survival rate for children with cancer has increased dramatically but so much more needs to be done. Cindy talked about the work that Wipe Out Kids Cancer does not just funding important research projects but also to help families who hear the dreaded words, "Your child has cancer." The nonprofit provides essential items for children who must be rushed to the hospital and for their parents as well. It also provides fun activities for the children with cancer and their siblings to get their mind off of their diagnosis and their hospital stays.

May 8, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program Issues Covered:

Guest: Debra Caudy the founder and President and CEO of 29 Acres a residential program for adults with autism and other neuro diversities in North Texas.

Topic: Today is Mother's Day and in honor of today we are highlighting moms in North Texas who have made an impact on our community. Debra Caudy founded 29 Acres a nonprofit that provides quality support services and safe housing for young adults with autism and other neuro diversities in our area. Debra talked about her son who has autism and how as he grew older she worried that there were no programs in North Texas for when he graduated from high school that would help occupy is time once he aged out of the school system so she got together with other moms of autistic children and they came up with the idea of 29

Acres and created programs to help teach their kids to live on their own in a supervised environment. We talked about the programs that include the residential academy, the Live and Learn program that teaches career readiness and independent living the enrichment services and vocational training and the therapeutic recreation programs plus their community partners that help with employment services and also they have a summer transition experience and a Friday Night Social Club once a month. Debra talked about the need for services for those who are neuro diverse and how raising awareness about the young adults who are neuro diverse can open up employment opportunities for them.

May 15, 2022 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime and Economic Issues and Mental Health Issues

Guest: Laura Hilgart the CEO of the Women's Center of Tarrant County

Topic: With crime on the rise and gas prices and food prices continuing to rise the economy is having a major impact on people who were already hurting because of the pandemic and so today we are highlighting a nonprofit that is making a difference each and every today and that is The Women's Center of Tarrant County. The nonprofit's mission is to inspire and empower women, men and children to overcome violence, crisis and poverty. Laura Hilgart joined me to talk about the work that they do and how the current economic situation is impacting the people that they serve and what they are seeing on the front lines in the fight to help people. We talked about the services and programs that they have including the rape crisis and victim services, their counseling and legal services, their criminal justice accompaniment. We also talked about their Violence Prevention and Education programs and their Employment Services and the work that they do with senior citizens on mental health issues. We also talked about how the community can help them do their work and support their efforts.

May 22, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Housing, the Economy and Education

Guest: Blaine Cowart the Vice President of Homeowner Services with Dallas area Habitat for Humanity.

Topic: The month of June is Homeownership Month and Habitat for Humanity Dallas is having a free virtual homeownership fair that will include free homebuyer workshops and Blaine Cowart with Dallas area Habitat joined me to talk about the upcoming free event and the importance of such an event in a market such as the one that we are experiencing right now and how the event is not just for people thinking of getting a Habitat home but for anyone thinking of buying a home in this tight market and the tips that can help them land their dream home. Blaine also talked about the work that Habitat does to help people and communities. We talked about how families are selected, their homeownership counseling, the process of applying for a home to building the home, the sweat equity that a family must put in to their home and how the community can help families realize their dream by volunteering on builds around the area. We also talked about their restores that can help people find products that they may get at Home Depot or Lowe's but cheaper and with the money raised going to Habitat.

May 29, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Military and Veteran support services and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues.

Guest: Jacob Schick the Executive Director of One Tribe Foundation

Topic:.It is Memorial Week end a time to remember those who have fallen in service to our country and once again this year on Memorial Day weekend in Dallas it is the annual Carry the Load March at Reverchon Park in Dallas and this year the march is once again an in person event. . The March raises awareness of the true meaning of Memorial Day and also raises money for charities helping our military and first responders. One of the beneficiaries of this year's Carry the Load March is the nonprofit One Tribe Foundation formerly 22 Kill. Jacob Schick is the Executive Director of the nonprofit and he joined me to talk about how his agency is helping with the mental health needs of our veterans, The One Tribe Foundation was started as a result of the alarming number of suicides amongst our veterans with national statistics showing that on average every day 22 veterans take their own life. Jacob talked about the importance of raising awareness about the suicide epidemic plaguing our country's veterans and how One Tribe offers support programs that provide services to our vets so that they can overcome depression and anxiety. Jacob shared his own personal journey. He was severely injured in Iraq and lost his leg to combat but it was the invisible wounds of battle that almost cost him his life and that is why he is committed to helping those who are dealing with suicidal thoughts. We

also let people know that if they are in crisis that there is help and how the One Tribe Foundation can be a resource for those veterans who feel hopeless.

June 5, 2022

Aired 6am to 6:30am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issue and the desperate need for blood in North Texas and the Uvalde Mass Shooting and how North Texas can help by donating blood.

Guest: Clinton McCoy the Director of Mobile Donor Recruitment and Regional Operations for Carter Blood Care.

Topic: Clinton McCoy and I talked about the desperate need for blood products in the aftermath of the horrific mass shooting at Dodd Elementary in Uvalde, Texas and how people from all over answered the call but the sad truth is that the need for blood is constant and especially during the summer months when regular blood donors go on vacation and the number of donors drops. Clinton joined me to talk about the impact that the coronavirus pandemic has had on our blood supply with the supply currently at a critical level we also talked about our upcoming Summer Blood Drive that will take place June 20th through June 25th at various locations around the Metroplex. It is estimated that every two seconds someone in the US needs blood and Clinton talked about the work that Carter Blood Care does in our area to educate people about the need for blood and how to help out and encouraged people to donate blood or to hold blood drives at their churches, schools or place of business this summer. We talked about misconceptions about giving blood and who is eligible to donate and how many people are impacted by one donation since blood is used for burn patients, patients undergoing chemotherapy and victims of car accidents or gunshots.

June 12, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issue Covered: Economic Issues, Education and Food Insecurity

Guest: Benaye Wadkins Chambers the President and CEO of Crossroads Community Services.

Topic: The current economic situation in the United States is leading more and more people to turn to food pantries across North Texas, people who had thought that the worst was behind them from the pandemic who are now struggling more because of the high cost of gas and food. Benaye joined me to talk about the people that she serves with CrossRoads Community Services a nonprofit whose mission is to nourish our community's low income families and individuals by providing nutritious food and supportive education. We talked about how bad food insecurity is right now and we talked about the summer feeding program that is currently underway to help families who normally rely on free lunch and breakfast for their kids during the school year. We talked about the reality of hunger in North Texas and the consequences of that on our community and economy. We also talked about the research that is going on into how to solve the issue of food insecurity at SMU and at UT Dallas and how the SNAP program helps lift people up out of poverty and also helps businesses who sell groceries.

June 19, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Mental Health Issues and Absent Fathers.

Guest: Christopher Brown the President of the National Fatherhood Initiative.

Topic: On this Father's Day Christopher Brown who heads up the National Fatherhood Initiative joined me to talk about the importance of fathers in the family unit and the work that the National Fatherhood Initiative is doing to help fathers rise to the job. Christopher who grew up in North Texas talked about the founding of the National Fatherhood Initiative and how the absence of fathers in a child's life can lead to children who don't feel safe, who fall behind in school and who get in to trouble. We talked about the Father Engagement training that they do that is free to nonprofits across the country so that they can incorporate into their services and programs.

June 26, 2022 Aired 6am to 6:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: LGBTQ Plus rights and Anti-Discrimination

Guests: Rafael McDonnel the Senior Advocacy, Policy and Communications Manager at Resource Center and Leslie McMurray who heads up the Transgender Education and Advocacy program at the Resource Center.

Topic: The month of June is Pride Month a time to raise awareness about LGBTQ Plus issues and so I invited Rafael and Leslie with the Resource Center to join me to talk about issues facing the LGBTQ Plus community here in North Texas and the rise of hate crimes against the gay population here and across the country. We talked about the services and programs offered by Resource Center to help with health issues both physical and mental and how they also offer programs for youth who are

currently dealing with their sexuality and may be facing bullying at school or at home. We talked about their programs for the transgender community and Leslie shared her personal journey as a transgender woman. Rafael talked about the advocacy currently taking place to combat a law that Texas Governor Greg Abbot would like to implement that would make certain transgender treatments to be considered child abuse. We also talked about their work in helping senior citizens in the LGBTQ Plus community in North Texas.
