July 3, 2022

Aired 6am to 6:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Veterans Support, Mental Health, Economy and Gun Ownership Rights and Responsibility.

Guests: Joe Jenkins and Vance Keyes, US Marine Veterans who work with Vets For The People.

Topic: It is 4th of July weekend and as we celebrate our nation’s birthday and the freedom that we all enjoy thanks to living in this country and thanks to our military we wanted to highlight a nonprofit that helps our nation’s veterans by advocating for them to get better health care and better jobs as well as encourages veterans to get involved in their communities. Joe Jenkins and Vance Keyes are both US Marine veterans who work with the nonprofit Vets For The People and they talked about the work that they do to help veterans and the goals of the organization to make sure that no soldier is left behind economically or health wise. We also talked about issues that veterans should be speaking up about including gun control. Both Joe and Vance talked about how in the military you go through extensive training and you go through psychological tests before you can even handle a gun and how these same rules should apply to all Americans. Joe and Vance are firm believers that military veterans can change the narrative around issues that our nation faces and be a unifying voice in society.

July 10, 2022

Issues: Education and the Economy and Health Issues

Guest: Florencia Velasco Fortner the President and CEO of The Concilio.

Topic: With inflation at a 40 year high across the country more and more of our local nonprofits are seeing a spike in the number of people that they are helping and it is very apparent in our minority communities. Florencia Velasco Fortner joined me to talk about the work that The Concilio is doing to help Hispanic families in North Texas. The Concilio is a nonprofit whose mission is to build stronger communities by unlocking opportunities for Latino families and other minority families who are at risk economically. The Concilio help with health programs, financial stability and crisis intervention and with cultural competency education and training as well as tech training to help families who may not be computer savy. They also help families navigate the school system with program that encourage parents to get involved in their child’s education starting in pre-k. We also talked about how The Concilio will celebrate their 40th Anniversary this year with a benefit gala that will highlight the work that they do and the impact that they are making in the community and we outlined the nonprofit’s goals for the future to lift up the people that they serve so that they can provide a better life for themselves and for their children.

July 17, 2022

Issues: Education and Economic Issues and Child Welfare Issues

Guests: Tanya Quiambao the Associate Communications Manager of Corporate Affairs for Kroger North Texas and Crystal Scanio the CEO of the Irving Schools Foundation and Kathleen LaValle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA.

Topic: We are just a month away from students in North Texas going back to school and as families get ready to send kids back to school we are once again teaming up for the Backpack Boosters Back to School Supply Drive and at a time when so many families are struggling due to inflation and high gas prices the need for back to school supplies is greater this year than it was

even last year. Crystal Schanio with the Irving Independent School District and Tanya Quiambao with Kroger joined me to talk about how this year's Back to School Supply Drive will work and how easy it is to make donation at any Kroger in North Texas when you check out. You can either by a supply kit or make a donation of any dollar amount. The goal this year is to help over 78 thousand students in ten school districts. Crystal talked about the importance of helping kids who may not be able to afford back to school supplies because their families are already barely making it month to month with rent, car insurance and buying groceries due to the high cost of food and how fuel prices are taking a bigger chunk out of their budgets. She talked about the reality of what faces children today in low income zip codes and how these school supplies help the children focus on their education rather than their need. Tanya talked about outreach efforts by Kroger to help schools in North Texas and how communities and neighborhoods need to do their part to volunteer to help out their area school districts. Kathleen La Valle with Dallas CASA joined me for the second part of the program to talk about the Parade of Playhouses at North Park Center in Dallas which will benefit Dallas CASA and their work to help abused and neglected children in North Texas. Kathleen talked about the need for volunteers to become advocates and the impact that these volunteers have on the lives of children who are abused and neglected. .

He talked about what everyone should know about the Delta variant and the need to continue to practice social distancing measures as well as wear a face mask to protect yourself and your loved ones.

Issues: Education and Economy

Guest: Rachel Kreidler the Chief Development Officer for Communities in Schools of Greater Tarrant County

Topic: The school year has started and many education experts are concerned about the covid learning slide caused by students who did not do well in a remote learning environment during lockdown and so nonprofits that are focused on education issues here in North Texas are stepping up to help students who may fall through the cracks. Communities in Schools of Greater Tarrant County is part of a national drop out prevention network that helps students stay in school and stay on course to graduate. Rachel Kreidler talked about the work that the nonprofit does in the Tarrant County schools that they are based in and the impact that they make in the students' lives. We talked about the need here in North Texas and how the community can help and how schools can get a program in their district.. According to statistics one in two students in North Texas are at risk of dropping out of school and that number could go up because of covid.

August 21, 2022

Issues: Education, Economic Issues and Community Involvement.

Guest: Karissa Condoianis the Senior Vice President of Public Relations for the State Fair of Texas

Topic: The State Fair of Texas which last year was a drive thru event as a result of the covid 19 pandemic will be in person this year starting on September 24th but with safety protocols in place to keep people safe. Karissa Condoianis with the State Fair of Texas joined me to talk about the event which has been a Texas tradition since 1886 and which gives back to our community with scholarship programs and with food drives. Karissa talked about the impact on our local economy and what people can expect this year and we also highlighted the community work that the State Fair of Texas does from the Big Tex Urban Farms that provide fresh produce to people living around Fair Park and we talked about their education programs which last year went virtual and were such a success that they will once again offer virtual education courses for people to learn about agriculture and more. We talked about the annual State Fair food drive that collects food for the North Texas food drive during the fair.

August 28, 2022

Issues: Mental Health Issues and Education

Guests: Amy Halliburton McCloskey the Director of Special Events for the Grant Halliburton Foundation and TJ Griffin the Director of Communications for the Grant Halliburton Foundation.

Topic: As school begins again teachers and counselors are worried about their students mental health and one of the premiere nonprofits that deals with youth mental health is the Grant Halliburton Foundation and Amy and TJ from the foundation joined me to talk about what parents and educators need to know about mental health issues and what students may be facing in the new year after dealing with the lockdown and the pandemic and social isolation. Amy and TJ talked about the education programs that the Grant Halliburton has for school districts here in North Texas and we talked about the Hope Squad which enlists other students to help those students who are at risk thru a peer to peer program. We talked about the rise in suicide rates among young people and ways that the community can help prevent suicide by raising awareness and letting people know that there is help. We also talked about the upcoming When Life Hands you Teenagers Educational Conference which is aimed at anyone who works or lives with teens. The event will be held in person and virtually on September 29th.

September 4, 2022

Issues: Community Involvement 9/11 Day of Service

Guest: Anita Foster with the Arlington Independent School District and longtime volunteer and advocate for the American Red Cross North Texas.

Topic: As we mark the 20th Anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on our country I wanted to highlight the work that the American Red Cross does especially since the Red Cross here in North Texas played such a critical role in the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks of 2001. Anita Foster who was the Communications Director for the American Red Cross in North Texas at the time and who now works for the Arlington Independent School District joined me to talk about how the Red Cross in Dallas became a communications command center after the Red Cross in Washington DC was not able to because of the attack on the Pentagon. Anita talked about how the Red Cross around the world mobilized to help families looking for loved ones and to help first responders' in the days after 9/11 who were at ground zero. Anita and I talked about 9/11 now being a National Day of Service and how we honor those who lost their lives by doing acts of service similar to what happened in the days following the attacks on our country. We talked about ways people can help in their community and I shared my own story of ending up in Gander, New Foundland and how the people of Gander opened up their homes to complete strangers showing how good can defeat evil.

Guest: Dr. John Carlo the CEO of Prism Health North Texas.

Topic: With the Delta variant of Covid 19 affecting more and more families in North Texas I wanted Dr. John Carlo with Prism Health North Texas to join me to talk about how we can protect ourselves from the variant and what he is seeing here in North Texas when it comes to the spike in cases of Covid 19. We also talked about how the Delta variant is impacting those with compromised immune systems like those with HIV and AIDS. Dr. Carlo talked about the work that Prism Health North Texas does to advance the health of North Texas thru education, research, prevention and personalized care. We also talked about the changes to the annual Lifewalk which benefits Prism Health North Texas and how the Delta variant has caused the nonprofit to pivot from an in person event to a virtual fund raiser to keep families safe. Dr. Carlo talked about the research that is going on for HIV and Aids and how the research done on the Covid 19 vaccine is helping to find breakthroughs for other health issues.

Guest: Kathy Shockley with the Alzheimer's Association of North Texas.

Topic: The month of September is World Alzheimer's Month aimed at raising awareness about the disease that is affecting more and more Americans and as the Alzheimer's Association gears up for the annual Walk to End Alzheimer's which will take place in cities across the metroplex during the months of October and November I wanted to help promote the events as well as the work that the Alzheimer's Association does. Kathy Shockley joined me to talk about the upcoming walks and how people can get involved and she talked about how the event brings families together but also raises important funds for research and for the programs and services offered by the Association. We talked about the research breakthrough that occurred this summer with the first medication targeting Alzheimer's getting FDA approval and we talked about the helpline that helps families 24/7 free of charge if they are going thru something with a loved one who has Alzheimer's and dementia. We also talked about their support groups and their peer to peer help as well as their respite care.
