Ascertainment Methodology

Our station employs an active listenership. As a result, ascertaining the issues and topics for local public service programming comes in several forms:

1) Emails:

The Program Director and all On-Air Talent are easily accessible via the internet. Our Station's Web Page provides listeners with the opportunity to send us information.

2) Voice Mail & In Studio Calls:

The Program Director and On –Air Talent regularly receive phone calls from listeners regarding community concerns, issues and events. Public Service Organizations also contact us with information they need to get out to residents or activities they would like us to promote.

3) Faxes:

Typically, organizations send press releases via fax to the Program Director. Local city government officials most often communicate what they would like aired in this fashion. Public Service groups do the same. The Station uses faxed information for local live PSA's, local public service vignettes and the locally produced public service programs.

4) Mail:

Some listeners/groups send the station a letter to let us know their concerns, to inform us about activities or ask us to cover certain topics.

5) Station Appearances:

Since our listenership is so active, we are fortunate to have our station events well attended. Station personnel are always on hand and ready to listen. Many listeners take the time to tell us what they think about our programming and what they would like us to consider airing.
