York Country Tax Rebate	News	1/19/24	6a, 7a	1min	It was learned that some volunteer first responders in York County were about to get an increased tax rebate. The County Commissioners approved rebates of up to 100 percent for active volunteer firefighters and E.M.S. workers, instead of a 50 percent rebate. There was only one provision: the first responders must own the home they live in.
School Choice Rally	News	1/24/24	6a,8a	1 min	Hundreds of school choice advocates held a rally at the state capitol in Harrisburg. More than 400 students from schools across the commonwealth joined advocates for school choice learning. State Rep. Joe D'Orsie, a York County Republican, said seven-out-of-ten Pennsylvanians support school choice.
Gun Violence Debate	News	1/25/24	7a,8a	1 min	In a push to stop gun violence and reckless use of firearms...police in York proposed a new firearms ordinance. The penalty would include a \$1,000 fine and imprisonment if the fine is not within 90 days.
Gettysburg Military Park	News	2/12/24	7a,8a	1 min	The Gettysburg Foundation scheduled a donation to benefit the Gettysburg National Military Park. A check presentation ceremony took place near the Abraham Lincoln sculpture at the Museum and Visitor Center. The donation amounts to more than \$492,000.

Adams County Home Show	News	2/15/24	7a,8a	1 min	The 44th annual Adams County Home Show was held, with all proceeds benefiting the Builders Association of Adams County Student Scholarship Fund.
Thon	News	2/16/24	7a,8a	1 min	The largest student-run philanthropy event in the world began at the Bryce Jordan Center at Penn State. It raised more than 16 million this year. More than 700 student dancers and thousands of volunteers united for the 52nd annual 46-hour dance marathon.
Agricultural Surplus System	News	3/8/24	7a,8a	1 min	Governor Josh Shapiro invested \$1 million from the commonwealth's Agricultural Surplus System, along with \$2 million in federal funds to help apple growers with an overabundance of their product. And Knouse Foods of Peach Glen came forward with nearly 40 truck loads of apple juice and apple sauce for distribution to families in need.
Public Transportation Funding	News	3/20/24	7a,8a	1 min	The state House passed legislation to increase funding for public transportation systems in Pennsylvania. The bill would increase state aid by about 20 percent. However, the legislation was expected to face long odds in the Senate. The York-Adams area, which is served by 'rabbit transit', is one of those systems.
Children's Aid Society	News	3/26/24	7a,8a	1 min	The Southern Pennsylvania District of the Children's Aid Society began the process of building an 18,000 square foot facility in York. The project, which is expected to cost about \$6.9 million, is being paid through grants and donations. The non-profit organization serves York, Adams and Franklin Counties.
