ISSUE: NATIONAL POLITICS

Program: Perspectiva Nacional (Segment #1, Part A, 4:00)

When: October 1st, 2017 (Saturday 11:00pm/Sunday 6:00pm)

Description of Program

We look at the Senate's latest failure in approving a new health plan that repeals and replaces Obamacare. In addition, we talk about the importance Obamacare has for the Hispanic community. Guest: Leonardo Coello, director of health policy at the National Health Law Program.
