
PROGRAMMERS. Feel free to ad-lib regarding our Public Affairs Programming.





WCUW, 91.3 FM, is a non-commercial, community access radio station owned and operated by WCUW, Inc., an independent, educational corporation dedicated to the exploration and improvement of the communications media in the Central New England area. WCUW seeks to inform, entertain, enlighten and seeks to make a positive difference in the lives of the people of Worcester County.

Daily 1 pm – 2 pm / Democracy Now! A national, independent, award-winning news program hosted by journalists Amy Goodman and Juan Gonzalez. Pioneering the largest public media collaboration in the U.S., Democracy Now! is broadcast on Pacifica, NPR, community, and college radio stations; on public access, PBS, satellite television. For true democracy to work, people need easy access to independent, diverse sources of news and information.

*Mondays 2 pm – 3 pm (1st Monday of the month) / Franco-American Pathways, a monthly podcast dedicated to the history and culture of the Franco-Americans and the Francophonie of New England. Working from written and audiovisual documents housed at the Franco-American Collection at the University of Southern Maine's Lewiston-Auburn campus, this monthly program will explore Franco culture, history, and identity. Franco-American Pathways is delighted to share this incredible collection with you in two languages, and to spark important discussions about the evolving Francophone community in Maine and New England.

Monday 2 pm – 3 pm / College Connection, a news/current events program produced by the Writing and Mass Communication Capstone students at Assumption University. The program features subjects of interest to local college students, and a much broader range of topics that are relevant to the community as a whole.

*Monday 3 pm – 3:30 pm / "Youth Know Radio" from the Hiatt Center for Urban Education, youth-made podcasts from Worcester Public School students and Clark Undergraduates students to create a mix of podcasts and live radio. Program to start TBA.

About the Hiatt Center for Urban Education; we are youth, school- and community-based educators, and Clark academics and students who are actively engaging each other and our worlds through research. *Monday 3:30 PM – 4 PM / Thirty Minutes of Adventure, a half hour conversation with people from the Worcester community to talk about their stories of successes and failures to inspire the listeners. This program's goal is to shed light on the political and social activism people in the Worcester area. Produced and hosted by Clark University intern, Noor Almaslamani, a Political Science student who will be graduating this year. Noor also interned at a radio station in Palestine and wishes to further develop her interviewing/production skillset.

Mondays 4 pm – 4:30 pm / Pride Radio, a LGBTQ+ show, to educate, entertain and to make our listeners aware of issues concerning the community.

Mondays 4:30 – 5 pm / Community Matters – Conversations with regional and international business and health professionals.

Tuesdays – 4 pm – 5 pm / Voice of the Voiceless, an hour-long conversation on current issues in the news, health, education and well-being as it relates to people of color.

Wednesdays 4 pm – 5 pm / Worcester Public Schools Connect an English/Spanish program designed to inform the public of a wide range of programs and events our WPS district has to offer. Worcester Public School teachers and guests speak on various topics concerning bi-lingual education in Worcester and encourage feedback from the community on topics of concern.

Thursday 4 pm – 5 pm / Alternative Radio, established in 1986, is an award-winning weekly one-hour public affairs program offered free to all public radio stations in the U.S., Canada, Europe and beyond. AR provides information, analyses, and views that are frequently ignored or distorted in corporate media. Our program airs on over 260 radio stations.

Friday 4 pm – 4:30 pm / Vegan Nation A half hour news program focusing on local, national, and international vegan news, music, events, and interviews of interest to seasoned vegans, and those curious to hear more about living a vegan lifestyle.

Fridays 4:30 pm – 5 pm / Talkin' Birds A live and interactive radio show about wild birds and the beauty of nature—attracting birds to your backyard, feeding them, and learning more about them, featuring expert guests.

Saturday 6 am – 9 am / Worcester City Council Meeting An airing/webstream of the prior Tuesday Worcester City Council meeting. Meeting will be available for two weeks after each session via the WCUW archive.
