Hawaii Preparatory Academy senior Caiden Andrist on Hawai'i Island shares a Student Reflection about meeting his best friend while at boarding school and maintaining their connection, even after moving to a different island.

In her Student Reflection, Pearl City Highlands Elementary School 6th grader Lauren Takamoto speaks about her intensive karate training experience at home on O'ahu and what she learns from going to a competition in another state.

During a whirlwind five days, they modeled professional journalists and conducted interviews, captured footage and edited their stories without any hands-on help from teachers or HIKI NŌ's industry professionals.

HIKI NŌ Challenges are held three times a school year and provide students with the opportunity to review and learn HIKI NŌ production standards, test their skills, and get a taste for what it is like to produce work under professional deadlines. During the normal, noncompetitive HIKI NŌ on PBS Hawai'i production cycle, students have several weeks and sometimes months to complete their projects and receive one-on-one mentorship from HIKI NŌ on PBS Hawai'i mentors.

Description: In 1998, a locally-made film exposed what Native Hawaiians had written, talked and sung about for a century: the true story of how and why Hawaii became part of the United States. The film destroyed the false narrative fueled by ruthless self-serving businessmen in Hawaii and expansionists within the U.S. government that Native Hawaiians were willing participants in giving up their sovereignty. This was a narrative that survived for nearly 100 years. Instead, Tom Coffman's film recounts the exhaustive efforts by Queen Lili'uokalani and her supporters to resist annexation amid the belief that American leaders would acknowledge the illegality of such a move and restore the monarchy that was overthrown by descendants of missionaries and others with the backing of the U.S. military. The timeline and truths presented in the film are supported by historical documentation from the five-year period between the overthrow of the monarchy in 1893 and annexation in 1898. Scholars at the time, and since, questioned how the United States, supposedly the world's greatest democracy, put democracy aside in lieu of imperialist expansion across the globe that included Hawai'i, the Philippines, Guam, the Mariana Islands and Puerto Rico. How well-informed are Hawai'i residents about this history since the film's release 25 years ago?
