Rep. Griffey Introduces Rural Caucus at Legislature



Nashville- TN State Representative Bruce Griffey organized and just held the first meeting in Nashville of the "Rural Caucus" at the state legislature, inviting both Republican and Democrat members of the Tennessee House of Representatives interested in issues related to rural districts. Griffey explained the concept behind forming the Rural Caucus, stating that "There are bi-partisan issues and challenges unique to the rural districts of the state, and the general idea of the Rural Caucus is to get legislators on both sides of the aisle who represent rural districts together, discuss rural legislative issues, and hopefully advance legislation beneficial to rural counties by bringing a bigger voice to the House chamber for rural districts."

Tourism Impact Grows In Tennessee; Henry County Ranked #30 of 95 Counties



Paris, Tenn.- During a board of directors meeting on Thursday morning at the Chamber of Commerce, Executive Director Travis McLeese, announced tourism statistics for the year. McLeese received the data at the 2019's Governor's Conference for Tourism earlier this month.

The report shows that Henry County experienced 2.29% increase in Tourism Revenue from 2017-18, increasing from \$57.26M to \$58.57M, a \$1.3M. Henry County is ranked
