#### SECTION A: NEWSCAST OVERVIEW AND QUARTERLY ISSUES ADDRESSED

WRBN Radio produces daily newscasts that air on a regularly scheduled basis. A one-minute news tease is aired at the bottom of the hour Monday through Friday between 6:00am and 9:00am. On WRBN, just after NBC news at the top of the hour between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00am Monday through Friday, WRBN airs a 3-minute live newscast. A two-minute recorded newscast airs at 12:00pm and at 4:00pm, 5:00pm, and 6:00pm Monday through Friday on WRBN. These are two-minutes in length. WRBN reports local and area news events and issues on an ongoing basis.

**News Treatments**: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature news stories described below is between 30-seconds and one minute. One to two versions of each story aired multiple times during a 12-hour news cycle and are posted online.

Some of the issues covered in these newscasts and programs during the **fourth** quarter are as follows. Dates indicate local news treatment unless otherwise noted.

#### **<u>1-</u>ELECTIONS**

#### News Treatments: Oct 10th, Oct 25th, Nov 7th

We routinely give updates regarding election dates and turnouts prior to and during early elections and on election day. We also report on all public forums the candidates are involved in.

#### **<u>2-</u>** RABUN COUNTY UNEMPLOYMENT

News Treatments: Dec 3rd, Dec 20th,

Unemployment in the area has been statistically higher than in the rest of the state and country. The radio station reports every month regarding unemployment from numbers released throughout the month from the Georgia Department of Labor as well as initial claims. Unemployment numbers are much higher here on average than they are in the rest of the state though as of late are on the decline. Due to the Gov. shutdown numbers were not released in October.

#### **<u>3-COUNCIL/COMMISSIONER MEETINGS</u>**

#### News Treatments: Oct 2nd, Nov 11th, Dec 16th , Dec 23rd

The radio station covers almost every local government function, which at times are not always attended in great numbers. The station provides a service by informing the public of what happens in their local government.

#### 4- CLAYTON RABUN COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY

News Treatments: Oct 4<sup>th</sup>, Nov 11<sup>th</sup>, Dec 6<sup>th</sup>

Almost one quarter of the population receives water or sewer services from the City of Clayton, who purchases the water from the Water and Sewer Authority. Consolidating systems between

the city and the authority has been an ongoing emphasis of the authority, as well as a sewer expansion project on Highway 441 North, and the take over of the Water Treatment Plant. <u>5-DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY UPDATES</u> Nave Treatments: Oct 21st New 12th Dec 5<sup>th</sup>

The Development Authority of Rabun County (DARC) is a County based government entity that encourages job growth throughout the county. One of the largest projects the group has undertaken was the \$16M Rabun County Business Park. The funding came from tax money; so routine reporting provides the listener with an update on how their funds are being used. During this quarter, the authority focused on problems with in the park mainly with the water/fire protection system and the expansion of Parkdale.

#### 6- BOARD OF EDUCATION

#### News Treatments: Oct 15<sup>th</sup>, Nov 4<sup>th</sup>, Dec 18<sup>th</sup>

Each month we report on the meeting and agenda for the Board of Education and afterwards ongoings of the meeting that are important to the community, also we covered the science fair and the high school pageants.

#### 7- RABUN COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY

#### News Treatments: Oct 4<sup>th</sup>, Nov 11<sup>th</sup>, Dec 12<sup>th</sup>

At the end of March, a piece of legislation known as House Bill 496 was passed by the state legislature providing for the creation of the new Rabun County Water and Sewer Authority. The fourth quarter of 2013 saw local governmental bodies discussing the impact of the new authority and how they should go about taking over the old authority, and the beginning of the take over. Both Water and Sewer Authorities meet on the same day.

#### **1-Coffee Talk**

#### a. Rabun County Public Library

Interviewed Rabun County Public Library Director Stephanie Howard about upcoming events taking place at the library including the addition of E-books and the Traveling Show, a collaboration of dancing and artistry that came to Rabun County this quarter. Aired at 8:45 am on October 15th, November 12th, December 3rd.

#### b. CMBA

Talked with Cricket Werkheiser and Jenny Wilson with the Clayton Merchants and Business Association about various events taking place in downtown Clayton in the fourth quarter. Events included trick or treating and the various Christmas and New Years' events taking place in Clayton. Aired October 4th, November 1st, and December 6th.

#### c. Rabun County EMA Director and Fire Chief

Chatted with Marty Dixon, Rabun County EMA Director and Fire Chief about Emergency preparedness. The beginning of this quarter saw some days of heavy rainfall, while the end of the quarter saw extremely cold temperatures. Dixon discussed tips for dealing with heavy rain and thunderstorms as well as the cold, as well as fire prevention. Aired October 7th, November 27th, December 30th.

#### d. Law Enforcement Agencies

Discussed tips for various holidays with Rabun County Sheriff Frank Andrews and Clayton Police Chief Lindsey Owens. Those holidays included Halloween, Thanksgiving, and New Year's. Sheriff Andrews talked about how to stay safe while trick or treating and reminded residents to not drink and drive during the New Year's Holiday, and Chief Owens talked about the Thanksgiving travel period and staying safe on the roads.

#### e. North Georgia Technical College

Every couple of weeks, someone from North Georgia Technical College stops by to talk about what all they have going on.
