A COALITION OF UNIONS FILED A LAWSUIT LAST WEEK SEEKING TO OVERTURN ACT 10, WHICH PLACES HEAVY LIMITATIONS ON NEGOTIATING RIGHTS FOR PUBLIC SECTOR UNIONS.
