Guest: David Mayer Chief Strategy and Marketing Office at St. Vincent’s

Duration: 28 minutes

The main topic of the interview was to discuss National Healthcare, and how this will affect people in Duval County.

Ascertainments show that with the new healthcare reform there are many intricate details that people need to research fully before making any changes. These new changes will impact everyone from employers to employees, and the people making these decisions.

Dr. David Miller is head of the Stroke Center at Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville. He talked about the warning signs of stroke and how cardio vascular disease is the number one cause of death for all Americans. Miller talked about the latest advances and how new technology is saving lives and preventing stroke patients from becoming permanently disabled. He also talked about an upcoming free medical screening soon to be held by Mayo for those who need medical help but don't have the money or insurance to pay for it.

Our discussion was centered around the healthcare debate, and specifically, the Patient Protection and the Affordable Care Act, commonly referred to as "ObamaCare". Mr. Altmire began our conversation by explaining why he voted against ObamaCare back in 2010, due mostly to the fact that he believed this plan did not do enough to bring down the overall cost of healthcare in America.

We also reviewed many of the popular questions Americans have about the new healthcare plan, including: Can I keep my doctor? Will my premiums, co-pays and deductibles go up? How hard will it be to see my doctor? What about specialists? Will prescription drugs be affected? Will doctors and other healthcare professionals prefer Obamacare? How difficult will it be to have certain procedures and tests performed?

Ascertainments show that the cost of healthcare in America has gotten to the point where a change had to be made. Obamacare addresses many of the current issues, but opponents argue that it's too close to socialized medicine, and the cost of healthcare will actually rise with these changes.

They talked about how health care is vital to ensure people and children of all financial standing can get access to health care and we discussed safety at local Daycare centers and why it is so important that you send your child to a licensed daycare center and how parents can check to ensure their children are safe and the center's staff knows CPR and other critical health care methods that may needed in dire situations.

Ascertainments show that new healthcare laws won't deny people coverage due to pre-existing conditions, allows young people to stay on their parents' policies until they are 26, and requires insurance companies to provide certain preventative care for free. Insurers must also use at least 80% of their premiums on actual health care and not their overhead costs or profits.

Kim Sirdevan and Stacy Sechrist are both licensed clinical social workers at the Youth Crisis Center. They talked with me about the high rate of teenage suicides in Northeast Florida and the services available for free to residents. New reports show 1 in every 8 teenagers in Jacksonville has attempted suicide. We discussed what is causing the recent jump in teenage suicide rates and how cyber bullying and other issues play a role. They also ran down the signs and symptoms that parents need to watch out for teens who may be considering taking their own life and how to get them the help they need. We shared contact information and how listeners can get their children the help they need for free.

Ascertainments show many people are concerned about not just health care but the mental health care that many young people need to get through what they perceive as problems too big to solve.

Dawn Lockhart is the Executive Director of the Family Foundations of Jacksonville. It is a non-profit group that offers free or low cost money management advice to those who need it most. Lockhart talked about ways listeners can get their finances in order and how to dig your way out of debt when you're in over your head. She also talked about programs they offer to help first time home buyers plan ahead for success and how people can contact her office to request their services.

Duration: 28 minutes, 50 seconds

Our discussion began with Mr. Gay giving a history of Operation New Hope, and how it evolved from a restoration project for the Springfield area, to the charitable organization it is today. He described the difficulties former felons face with integrating back into society. Finding employment is a tremendous challenge for former felons, and Operation New Hope is working with the *Ready4Work* program to reduce the recidivism rate. In today's economy, former felons have an especially difficult time finding work. Mr. Gay also discussed the *Breaking the Cycle* program, which focuses on assisting the children of former felons. He also touched on the home-buying process, and what programs and subsidies are available for financially-stressed individuals.

Ascertainments show that former felons have a difficult road integrating back into society, but with programs such as Ready4Work & Breaking the Cycle, there is help available, not only for them, but for their families as well. Donations & volunteers are always needed to assist these organizations.

Jerry Mallot is President of the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce. He says the Chamber is working with the city to bring new high paying jobs to Jacksonville. He talked about how the city plays a crucial role to attract new companies here and to help the businesses already here expand with the help of incentives and tax breaks. The state picks up the tab for at least half of the cost and sometimes up to 80% of those incentives that Mallot says is money well spent when you figure the long term economic impact on our city and your bottom line.

Nancy Ruben talked about a new plan to dredge the St. John's River to allow larger cargo ships to use Jacksonville as a port of call. Ruben says the project will cost 733 million dollars. Some of the money would come from the Federal Government and the rest would need to come from the city and state. Ruben says the project itself will take years to complete but the payoff will be great and help lead our city into the future. The port has an estimated economic impact of more than 1 billion dollars a year.

The pilot program is partly funded by the Federal Government and other local agencies that have a stake in boosting the local economy by helping small business become successful. The meeting drew about a thousand people and focused on mentoring programs and action plans that can help teenage boys stay on the path to success and avoid getting involved with people who could lead them to commit crimes.

Crenshaw also talked about the recent IRS scandal and how the agency targeted conservative groups applying for tax exempt status for more scrutiny than liberal groups. He also talked about how the new health care law, which takes effect in January, will also mean more taxes for some and how the process could hurt small businesses that cannot afford to provide health care coverage for their employees.

Our discussion began with Mr. Keane explaining the history of the Jacksonville Police & Fire Pension Fund (PFPPF), and how it has evolved over the decades. He contends the city's policies and the Board of Trustees' investment strategies have been the reason for the underfunding of the PFPPF. He also stated that the level of benefits was not the reason for the lack of funds.

Mr. Keane also explained some of the terminology dealing with pension funds, including pension "holidays" and the DROP program.

Ascertainments show the majority of citizens understand the importance of a pension plan for city workers (including police officers & fire fighters), but proper management is critical in maintaining the health of the plan for present and future generations.
