

The head of the state's health care regulatory board says Vermont is lucky.

Green Mt Care Board chairman Al Gobeille says the rate increase requests by Blue Cross Blue Shield and MVP are just a fraction of the increases other health insurers across the country are asking for. In Veromnt, the Blues are asking for a 8.3 percent increase and MVP a 3 percent increase. Gobeille says the disparity between the two requests has to do with MVP having what he called a healthier population, as well as increases capsal by the federal Afferdable CaretAct.

But Gobeille says Vermont is fortunate when you look across the country and that rate increases aren't padded.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Gov. Peter Shumlin says a key function of Vermont's once-beleaguered health care website is now working.

Shumlin and officials with Vermont Health Connect said Tuesday the fix allows staff to process quickly changes to peoples' health insurance

The fix has enabled staff to reduce the backlog of customers waiting for changes to be processed from more than 10,200 at the end of May to less than 4,500.

Staff is now able to begin processing many incoming requests immediately over the phone with Vermonters.

Before the fix, requests had to be logged and entered into as many as six different databases, a time-consuming process that added to the backlog even for relatively simple changes to customer accounts.

Vermont group files brief against state health data sweep

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - A Vermont group critical of the state's recent health care initiatives is joining a national doctors' group and an insurance company to oppose the state's health data collection efforts before the U.S. Supreme Court.

Vermonters for Health Care Freedom joined the Association of American Physicians and Surgeons in telling the court the state data collection efforts likely would violate patient privacy.

The state's main opponent, the Liberty Mutual insurance company, says the state is looking to collect massive amounts of data - creating privacy risks and financial burdens.

A top state health regulator, Chairman Al Gobeille of the Green Mountain Care Board, has said the state needs the data to determine if its reform efforts are working.

The Supreme Court is expected to hear arguments in the case this fall.

The Vermont senator made an appearance Wednesday with striking contract workers on Capitol Hill who are employed as cooks and janitors in a number of federal buildings in Washington. Many of the workers earn less than \$11 an hour.

Sanders is pushing a bill that would phase in increases in the minimum wage to \$15 an hour by 2020. That proposal is unlikely to pass in the Republican-controlled Congress, but it puts pressure on Clinton to support the approach.

Clinton backs raising the minimum wage from the current \$7.25 an hour, but she's stopped short of endorsing the \$15 level. She says she backs local efforts to raise wages.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Democratic National Committee says all five of the party's main presidential candidates will address DNC members next month.

Former Rhode Island Gov. Lincoln Chafee, former Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton, former Maryland Gov. Martin O'Malley, Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders and former Virginia Sen. Jim Webb will speak at the DNC summer meeting in Minneapolis on Aug. 28.

DNC chair Debbie Wasserman Schultz, a Florida congresswoman, says the DNC's members will leave the meeting "inspired to redouble their efforts" to win the White House in 2016.

The five major Democratic candidates spoke at a Democratic party fundraiser in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, earlier this month.

WATERBURY, Vt. (AP) - Almost four years after Tropical Storm Irene inundated much of Vermont the state is still continuing its recovery.

A big step in that process is the progress on the reconstruction and renovation of the state office complex in Waterbury. Workers are due to return to the complex in December.

Resiliency has become the watchword of state and local planners across Vermont who are working to take into account future flooding when making decisions today.

Vermont officials estimate the Irene repairs and recovery are costing the state about \$850 million.

More than 7,200 properties were damaged and 137, mostly residential, applied for a federal buyout program that will pay owners a fair market price and then level the building so it can't be damaged in a future flood.

Vermont police say 3 injured-1 critically-in 2-car crash

JEFFERSONVILLE, Vt. (AP) - Vermont state police say three people were injured - one critically - in a two-car crash in Jeffersonville.

Authorities say the accident occurred just before 6:30 p.m. Saturday on Route 108 in Jeffersonville.

They say 23-year-old James Taylor of Jeffersonville lost control of his Subaru Legacy as he was headed southbound on Route 108 and veered into the northbound lane, striking a car driven by 43-year-old Robert Gramss of Arlington, Virginia.

Police say a passenger in Taylor's car was taken to the University of Vermont Medical Center in critical condition. Two passengers in Gramss's car were taken to the hospital for treatment of what police said was non-life-threatening injuries. Police have not identified the passengers.

Authorities say they do not believe alcohol or drugs were factors in the crash.

PLATTSBURGH, N.Y. (AP) - A former New York prison worker who helped two murderers escape from a maximum-security lockup has been sentenced to up to seven years behind bars.

Fifty-one-year-old Joyce Mitchell wiped away tears and apologized as she was sentenced Monday to 2 1/3 to seven years in prison under terms of a plea deal with prosecutors this summer.

She pleaded guilty to charges related to providing tools to Richard Matt and David Sweat, who broke out of the Clinton Correctional Facility June 6.

The pair eluded more than 1,000 searchers in northern New York for weeks. Matt was killed by a border agent June 26. Sweat was wounded and captured by a trooper two days later.

Mitchell admitted becoming close with the pair, and she agreed to be their getaway driver before backing out.

The escape by Matt and David Sweat, who was shot and captured two days after Matt died, launched a massive 23-day manhunt amid rugged terrain involving more than 1,100 law enforcement officers.

They escaped from Clinton Correctional Facility in Dannemora after cutting through cell walls and a steam pipe.

Both were caught about 30 miles west of the prison.

Mitchell admitted providing hacksaw blades, chisels, a punch tool and a screwdriver to Matt. Authorities say she agreed to be their getaway driver but backed out at the last moment.

Mitchell was in court Tuesday morning and pleaded guilty to first-degree promoting prison contraband and fourth-degree criminal facilitation.

The 51-year-old faces a sentence ranging from 2 1/3 years to 7 years in prison.

PLATTSBURGH, N.Y. (AP) - Two convicted killers who staged a complicated prison break together and then spent more than two weeks roaming in thick New York woods finally split up when one man decided he'd make better time without the other escapee.

Gov. Andrew Cuomo says David Sweat thought Richard Matt was "slowing him down."

Sweat was hospitalized in serious condition after being shot twice in the torso by a trooper and captured Sunday near the Canadian border. Cuomo said Sweat has begun providing information about his audacious escape from the maximum-security Clinton Correctional Facility on June 6 with Richard Matt and their weeks on the lam. Matt was killed by officers on Friday.

Matt had blisters on his feet - searchers found his bloody socks - and Sweat thought his 49-year-old escape partner was hobbling their run for Canada.

Lara Sobei, a 16-year employee of DCF, was shot dead Friday outside her Barre office. Shumlin called it an assassination of hero.

Also killed were three relatives of the alleged killer of Sobel. Jody Harring is in police custody and was scheduled to be arraigned Monday.

Shumlin said the state was reviewing its policies to make it safer for some state employees who are in volatile situations. He said social workers would be encouraged to bring along a state police officerer or have a prototcol to have one statnding by, on certain house calls, the situation where he said social workers are most vulnerable.

Vermont attorney General William Sorrell says it could be some time before additional charges are filed against the woman now charged with killing a social worker.

Sorrell made the comments Monday after 40-year-old Jody Herring pleaded not guilty to first degree murder in the death of 48-year-old Lara Sobel outside the Barre office of the Department for Children and Families.

Prosecutors have said they believe Herring killed two cousins and an aunt before she shot and killed Sobel.

Sorrell says the investigation into that case is in its preliminary stages.

After the hearing, Herring's attorney David Sleigh said the legal process for his client is just beginning. He says "there's a lot here that doesn't meet the eye."

The Vermont prosecutor who helped subdue the suspect in the killing of a social worker in the city of Barre says he's frustrated that he won't be able to take part in her prosecution.

Washington County State's Attorney Scott Williams said Monday he's a material witness so he can't be involved in the legal proceedings for Jody Herring. He said that's "highly frustrating, but it needs to be that way."

Court documents say Williams was in a building near where the Friday shooting took place when he heard gunshots. He then helped subdue Herring.

Jody Herring charged in 3 more murders

BARRE, Vt. - Jody Herring will be charged in three more murders. She's already charged with killing a Vermont social worker, now prosecutors are moving forward with charges in the deaths of three of her relatives.

Aggravated murder charges were filed against the 40-year-old South Barre woman Thursday in the slayings of Herring's cousins, Rhonda and Regina Herring, and their mother, Julie Ann Falzarano. The three women were found dead in their Berlin home the day after DCF worker Lara Sobel's murder outside her office in Barre.

"All three of the women were shot within the house with a high-powered weapon. And under Vermont law, if you commit a murder in the course of committing another murder, you can bring aggravated murder charges and the possibility or sentence of life without parole upon conviction. So these three cases on which Ms. Herring will be arraigned on Tuesday are aggravated murder charges, as serious as it is under Vermont law." said Bill Sorrell, D-Vt. Attorney General.

According to court documents, when Jody Herring was being interviewed after her arrest in Sobel's murder and police told her what she was being charged with, Jody Herring said, "What about the other ... three?"

Documents also reveal Jody Herring stole the murder weapon from the apartment of her ex-boyfriend, Henry Premont. Premont told police he and Herring broke up Aug. 5 or Aug. 6, and Aug. 7 he noticed his rifle was missing. He told police his apartment was easy to access even when it was locked, and Jody Herring knew how to get in. He also told investigators he had taken Herring shooting before and she was good a shot. He recalled that Herring once said she wanted to shoot someone in the head, and that she had a handwritten "hit list" and he had seen it. He also said Herring had spoken about Lara Sobel on several occasions.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont's opiate addiction problem is showing up in family courts. It's a big reason, officials say, for the rapid rise in cases filed by the state to take children away from their parents.

Vermont family courts saw 1,060 abuse-and-neglect cases filed in the 12 months that ended June 30. That's up 32 percent from the previous year and more than double the number in 2010.

The court caseload has been growing along with cases of the Department for Children and Families. The department says about 1,300 kids were in state custody as of June 30, up 33 percent from the beginning of last year.

Officials say a rising number of children put in state custody are babies born to addicted mothers and then immediately placed in opiate withdrawal programs.
