Vermont marks reconstruction of state offices

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Gov. Peter Shumlin is marking the start of construction of what will become the home of the Vermont Agency of Human Services at the Waterbury office complex, most of which had to be abandoned after it was damaged by flooding from Tropical Storm Trene.

The governor on Tuesday ceremoniously helped construction crews pour one of the first concrete footings on what will become the new state office building.

The \$125 million Waterbury state office project is the largest state capital construction project in state history.

Construction is due to be completed by the end of 2015. Once that is done, it will become home to about 900 employees of the Agency of Human Services.

The new site is designed to survive the next big storm.

Supreme Court: State workers don't get double pay

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Supreme Court has denied 63 state workers who wanted double pay for working while displaced from their offices following Tropical Storm Irene.

The court affirmed an August 2013, Vermont Labor Relations Board decision.

The Vermont State Employees Association, which represents state workers, had appealed the board decision to the state Supreme Court.

Flooding from the storm nearly three years ago closed the state complex in Waterbury and the Department of Motor Vehicles office in Rutland.

The employees argued their contract entitled them to double pay, but the state Labor Board and the Vermont Supreme Court on Friday disagreed.

Businesses hit by Irene can apply for more grants

SPRINGFIELD, Vt. (AP) - Two regional development groups in Vermont have been awarded \$1.5 million in grants to help businesses recovering from Tropical Storm Irene.

Brattleboro Development Credit Corp. and Springfield Regional Development Corp. received the Community Development Block Grants for a second round of disaster recovery.

The Eagle Times reports (http://bit.ly/lkKe647) the development groups have provided grants for businesses affected by flooding since the August 2011 storm in Windham and Windsor counties. This funding is expected to assist with flood mitigation, engineering fees and insurance payments.

The groups have allocated about \$1.25 million to 43 businesses since the storm. Businesses apply for the grants.

ROXBURY, Vt. (AP) - The state of Vermont is still trying to get the Federal Emergency Management to help pay for repairs to the fish hatchery in Roxbury.

Restoring the hatchery is the state's largest remaining Irene repair project.

At issue is whether FEMA should help pay for a replacement hatchery that meets federal clean water standards.

If the hatchery, Vermont's oldest, were to be restored to its pre-Irene condition it would violate federal water quality laws.

Vermont Public Radio (http://bit.ly/1mRYWrE) reports a replacement facility that meets clean water standards would cost nearly \$4.5 million. It asked FEMA to pick up 90 percent of the cost.

FEMA denied the request on the grounds that the 2011 flood didn't cause the hatchery to be out of compliance so the repairs are not the agency's responsibility.

BRIDGEWATER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont Gov. Peter Shumlin and the acting chairman of the White House Council on Environmental Quality are touring parts of Vermont to get a look at how the state has recovered from flooding caused by Tropical

Storm Irene.

Shumlin and Acting Chair Michael Boots stopped Thursday at a former West Bridgewater gas station that was damaged and made unusable in 2011 by flooding from Irene.

Shumlin and other state officials told Boots how the location is being bought out and the site restored to its condition before the building was constructed. They were then heading to Rutland to tour Green Mountain Power's Energy Innovation Center.

Environmental Commissioner David Mears has filed with the Environmental Protection Agency a plan to reduce phosphorus loads in lake champlain by limiting runoff from farms and commerial development, among other efforts. However, the plan does not include a way for the state to pay for its share of the cleanup, which the EPA has requested. Mears acknowledges that hole might be a problem for the feds. The Legislature ordered the Shjmlin administration to identigy a funding sources by November.

Is the state playing chicken in the road with the feds. Mears says yes.

Phosphorus in Lake Champlain has contributed to toxic algae bloom.

A critic of the state's lake cleanup efforts sees hope in the latest plan.



The Conservation Law Foundation filed a lawsuit to get the federal government to get the state to do more to clean up Lake Champlain. Chris Kiliam of CLF says the latest plan by the Shumlin administration is the most comprehensive he has seen in the 25 years he has been working on the issue.

The state plan calls for reductions in agricultural and commercial runoff but requests more time and flexibility in reducing phosphorus loads coming out of wastewater treatment plants.

No proposals in the plan were included to fund reduction efforts.

The EPA is looking for a 35 percent reduction in phosphorus in the lake, which contricubes to algae blooms.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Top officials with several Vermont state agencies say they are ready to collaborate on efforts to clean up phosphorus pollution in Lake Champlain.

Environmental Conservation Commissioner David Mears briefed reporters on a new plan submitted by the state to the Environmental Protection Agency that is designed to reduce the flow of phosphorus into rivers feeding the lake.

Mears was joined by Deputy Transportation Secretary Sue Minter, Forests, Parks and Recreation Commissioner Michael Snyder, Agriculture Secretary Chuck Ross and Housing and Community Affairs Commissioner Noelle MacKay, each of whom discussed how their agencies would help implement the lake cleanup plan.

Officials say two areas of focus will be improved agricultural and forestry practices to reduce phosphorus-laden runoff into rivers.

Students with the University of Sherbrooke, Quebec, form the team on the lake for Memphremagog Conservation Inc., an international organization.

The Caledonian Record reports (http://bit.ly/SPJPWR) that in addition to monitoring for the algae, three students will look for excessive sedimentation, erosion, work on the shore and tree cutting.

The patrol will be on the lake seven days a week until September.

Studies have found that the lake is aging prematurely due to excess sedimentation from runoff due to development and farm and road practices in the watershed.

U.S. fisheries biologist Bradley Young says now all 26 Lake Champlain tributaries where sea lamprey breed can be treated. In Vermont and New York, sea lamprey are controlled with a chemical, but Quebec doesn't allow chemicals.

Sea lamprey prey on sport fish such as trout and salmon.

VERNON, Vt. (AP) - The company that owns the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant wants to do away with the 10-mile emergency planning zone surrounding the reactor after it ceases operation later this year.

VERNON, Vt. (AP) - A spokesman for the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant says it experienced a small leak of radioactive steam last week, but that the leak was contained and the public was not in danger.

Yankee spokesman Rob Williams tells Vermont Public Radio (http://bit.ly/QZkl81) the leak was discovered by a worker doing maintenance on a pipe. He said the problem was corrected immediately and that air sampling monitoring confirmed extremely low radioactivity, well within the limits set in the plant's operating license.

The steam condensed into water. Bill Irwin, the state's radiological health chief, said the water was collected in a drum and did not leak into the environment or groundwater.

The plant is scheduled to be closed at the end of 2014.

An NRC memo provided to The Associated Press on Tuesday shows the commission accepted its staff's recommendation to drop expedited transfer of the spent fuel from consideration. The memo, issued Friday, says the NRC doesn't want to deal with the issue again.

Five U.S. senators wrote to the NRC earlier this month complaining of relaxed safety standards at closed nuclear power plants. They said the spent fuel pools are possible sites of fires that could release as much radiation as a reactor accident and said research shows the pools could be targets for terrorists.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont Gov. Peter Shumlin says a government website that features budget, contract, grant and other information has helped improve the state's grade for transparency.

An annual ranking by the U.S. Public Interest Research group gave Vermont an A-minus for making government financial data accessible online. That's up from an F in 2010, the year before Shumlin took office.

But Shumlin also is making clear transparency has its limits. He won't release documents tied to the development of a financing plan for the universal health care system he wants to launch. And he won't release a full schedule including meetings with lobbyists as chairman of the Democratic Governors Association.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont lawmakers have sent a wide-ranging tax bill to the governor calling for publicizing the names of the state's biggest delinquent taxpayers and increasing the cigarette tax by 13 cents per pack from its current \$2.62.

The 100 businesses and the 100 residents with the biggest tax delinquencies would be given a chance to pay up before having their names made public.

The measure also sets statewide school property tax rates, which are one part of a formula that for primary homes also reflects local spending and taxing decisions. The statewide portion of the tax will be 98 cents per \$100 of value for a primary home and \$1.51 and a half cents per hundred for non-residential properties.

The union has been critical recently of the administration's response to whistleblowers, saying employees have seen retaliation by managers when they try to raise issues in the workplace.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Senate is debating a \$1.44 billion general fund budget, with increases for Medicaid providers, health care for retired teachers and affordable housing.

When separate transportation, education and other funds are added in, the state is on track to spend about \$5.5 billion in the fiscal year 2015, which begins July 1.

Appropriations Committee Chairwoman Sen. Jane Kitchel says the main concerns her committee heard as it drafted the budget were from health care providers serving Medicaid beneficiaries and from advocates for more affordable housing for low-income Vermonters.

Gov. Peter Shumlin had asked for a 2 percent increase for Medicaid providers. The House trimmed that increase to three-quarters of 1 percent when it passed a budget last month. The Senate bill would restore the 2 percent increase.


