

The governor may find himself at odds with the state's Catholic Church if he signs a new health care bill into law. That's because it contains a provision requiring all insurance plans to cover a variety of birth control methods for both men and women. Spokespeople say that runs counter to its teaching and its religious freedom.

Days before the Vermont Legislature's adjournment Saturday, the House and Senate reached agreement on a new health bill. The measure is expected to be signed into law by the governor and is designed to make birth control more affordable and accessible for women and men.

Along with barring insurers from charging co-pays or deductibles for birth control, it would force them to reimburse providers for up to a year's supply of birth control methods.

Religious leaders see a bigger cost: Their beliefs. Some leaders say they don't believe the church should pay for it given its teachings on the subject. Leaders preach natural family planning for those looking to avoid pregnancy

The bill's primary sponsor says the bill is about health, not religious freedom.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - It's turned into the Vermont Legislature's version of a game of who will blink first.

Democratic Gov. Peter Shumlin's veto of a renewable energy bill has brought lawmakers back to Montpelier for a special session on whether to override the governor's veto.

But through a day of wrangling, neither the Senate nor the House had voted on that question by 5 p.m. Thursday. Instead, the Senate passed and sent to the House a replacement bill for the one the governor vetoed.

House Republicans have twice blocked a move to take up the replacement bill, and want to have a vote on whether the override Shumlin's veto.

But the Senate voted down an effort to bring the veto override up, and the House can't act until the Senate does.

Sanders tells C-SPAN, "It doesn't appear that I'm going be the nominee." But he is urging Clinton to pick a running mate who he considers to be liberal. He says it would be a "terrible mistake for her to go to a candidate who has roots in Wall Street or has been backed by Wall Street."

The senator says he expects to speak at the Democratic National Convention in Philadelphia. He says his campaign is trying to create the "most progressive platform" and change the party's use of "superdelegates" who help determine the nominee.



Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders says he plowing forward with his efforts to become the Democratic nominee, despite a growing gap between him and front-runner Hillary Clinton.

Sanders spoke to a crowd of nearly 1,000 people during his first stop in Indiana at Purdue University in West Lafayette Wednesday ahead of the state's May 3 primary.

He took swipes at Clinton, saying she supported international trade agreements and cited the recent move by air-conditioning giant Carrier to outsource more than 2,000 jobs from Indiana to Mexico. Sanders also criticized Clinton for taking campaign contributions from large corporate donors.

The visit was the first of two scheduled for Sanders in Indiana as he attempts to bolster support during the last full week before the state's primary.

Hillary Clinton is 91 percent of the way to clinching the Democratic nomination.

Following her wins in four of five northeastern states, Clinton picked up 216 delegates. Bernie Sanders, who prevailed in Rhode Island, gained 163. Five delegates from Tuesday remain to be allocated, pending final vote tallies.

Clinton now has a total of 2,164 delegates when including superdelegates, or party officials who can back any candidate. Sanders has 1,355.

Clinton is currently 219 delegates short of hitting the 2,383 needed to win. At her current pace, Clinton will clinch the nomination in early June.

Most Democratic primary voters see Clinton as the best candidate to face Donald Trump if he is the Republican nominee in November, and 7 in 10 see her as the most likely eventual nominee.

Before Tuesday, Clinton led Sanders 1,292 to 1,042 in the delegate count. When including superdelegates, the AP count had Clinton at 1,761 and Sanders at 1,073.

Most of New York's Democratic delegates are awarded on a proportional basis by the outcome in each congressional district. New York has 247 pledged delegates at stake.

Donald Trump, fresh off a commanding victory in the Republican primary in his home state of New York, is suggesting he may soon have the race in hand.

Trump, speaking Tuesday night in Trump Tower, says Senator Ted Cruz "is just about mathematically eliminated" from clinching the delegates needed to win outright before the national convention.

"We don't have much of a race anymore," says Trump, declaring that his campaign is "really rocking" and he could have the nomination sown up before the party convention in Cleveland.



The law, passed last year, is pushing the state's school districts into larger organizations with at least 900 students.

Districts that merge early will reap tax benefits, and those that wait could face penalties.

Residents of the six towns in Washington West will vote June 7 on a merger, and the first of four informational meetings took place last night.

Right now, it's complicated to share faculty among the schools because each has a separate budget. Waterbury and Duxbury have merged into a single district, but Fayston, Moretown, Waitsfield and Warren are each individual school districts. Harwood, the regional school, is also a separate school district.

With one merged board comes one budget. All teachers would be covered by the same contract and would be able to move among schools with little difficulty.

Similarly, schools could pool resources such as microscopes or textbooks. Or even buildings.

And with a merged board comes more flexibility for teachers as well as administrators.

For Nease, that would mean two school board meetings a month instead of eight to 10. That would free up time for other projects, such as studying ways to revamp maintenance, facilities, food service and other aspects of school operations.

Reed McCracken, chairman of the Waterbury-Duxbury School Board, hopes residents will go to the informational meetings and educate themselves about Act 46 and the potential merger.

The SEC accuses Ariel Quiros in civil complaints of misusing some \$200 million from investors and improperly diverting about \$50 million for personal use. The projects at a Vermont ski resort include a biomedical research facility and rental cottages.

Attorneys for Quiros asked a federal judge Monday to reject an injunction blocking him from his businesses and also to unfreeze his assets. The SEC wants a receiver appointed permanently to take over.

The money was raised from foreign investors through the federal EB-5 visa program, which allows U.S. residency for those who finance projects that create a certain amount of jobs.
