WATERBURY – Floodwaters are receding in some areas of Vermont, but flooding could continue as major waterways are yet to crest. The Otter Creek, Mad River, and Winooski River are expected to crest overnight Saturday into Sunday afternoon, depending on location.

Keep a close eye on waterways and evacuate if water threatens your location. Should you be driven from your home and need shelter contact Vermont 2-1-1.

Several roads have closed or been reduced to one lane throughout the day and additional roads could be affected into Sunday. Motorists should respect all closures and detours and never drive over a flooded road, currents and unseen washouts can sweep away a vehicle.

THE STOWE REPORTER SAYS THE VERMONT AGENCY OF TRANSPORTATION RECEIVED ONLY ONE BID TO RECONSTRUCT THE NEARLY 10 MILES OF ROAD, AND THAT BID CAME IN AT OVER SEVEN MILLION DOLLARS OVER THE TWENTY MILLION DOLLAR BUDGET.

MIKE FOWLER, THE STATE ENGINEER WHO WAS MANAGING THE PROJECT UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT EARLIER THIS MONTH, SUSPECTS THAT A COMPRESSED SCHEDULE DISCOURAGED SOME COMPANIES FROM BIDDING. Vermont public safety officials are urging people to buckle up and say police will be more visible on roadways following eight deaths from car crashes since Friday night.

Public Safety Commissioner Tom Anderson said Tuesday that seven of the people killed were not wearing seat belts. He says seat belt wearers are 50 to 70 percent more likely to survive a crash.

A crash in Bridport on Monday killed the four occupants.

Law enforcement officials say it's drivers' responsibility to drive safely.

Aside from wearing seatbelts, drivers are urged to slow down, not use handheld devices like cellphones while driving, and to not drive while impaired.

The lawsuit alleges the Vermont Regional EB-5 Center and Jay Peak were essentially partners in fraud. It says the scheme involved millions of dollars from the investors.

Jay Peak's leadership was accused last year of misusing more than \$200 million raised from foreign investors through the EB-5 visa program for developments at or near the ski resort.

Lawyers for the investors and for the state are expected to argue whether the government should be immune from the lawsuit and whether the case should be dismissed.

BENNINGTON, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Board of Education has approved a school district's merger proposal under Act 46.

The Bennington Banner reports (http://bit.ly/2ho8MdK) the proposal approved Wednesday involves merging Bennington, Pownal, Shaftsbury and Woodford into the Mount Anthony Unified School District.

The decision to merge the districts now heads to the ballot for a vote Nov. 7. Bennington must vote "yes" for the merger to continue.

If more than one district votes "no," the merger will fail. In the case of only one voting "no" and the others approving, a new district will be formed and the outlier will be an independent elementary district.

School districts that merge under Act 46 stand to gain tax incentives and state grants. Those that fail could be subject to re-districting by the education board.

Quiros will not fight SEC charges; only litigate damages

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The owner of a Vermont ski resort accused of massive fraud involving foreign investors' money will not contest the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission charges against him.

A lawyer for Ariel Quiros, the Miami businessman who owns Jay Peak Resort, said Tuesday that Quiros is not admitting or denying any of the SEC charges and will only now litigate damages.

Quiros, and then-president of Jay Peak, William Stenger, were accused last year of misusing more than \$200 million raised from foreign investors through the EB-5 visa program for developments at or near the ski resort.

Stenger has settled with the SEC. Quiros' lawyer says the focus for Quiros and the SEC will be on the amount of damages to be paid. An SEC spokesman declined to comment on the case.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The White House's "drug czar" says Vermont's treatment system for opioid misuse is an "incredibly valuable national model that is being emulated around the country."

Richard Baum, the acting director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy, and his staff are in Vermont for two days visiting with members of Vermont's opioid and drug misuse prevention, treatment, recovery and enforcement communities.

Baum said Monday that Vermont has the highest per capita opioid treatment capacity in the U.S. He says it's one of three states that have enough opioid treatment capacity to meet the needs of its residents.

Republican Gov. Phil Scott says last year, there 106 deaths in Vermont from heroin, fentanyl or prescription painkillers. Last month, Vermont opened its sixth treatment hub in St. Albans, as part of the state's so-called hub and spoke system.

BRATTLBORO, Vt. (AP) - Police say emergency crews in a Vermont town of about 12,000 responded to seven opiate overdoses on the Fourth of July at multiple locations, including two people who remain in critical condition.

Brattleboro police say the overdoses occurred in a downtown alley, residences, hotel rooms and a gas station bathroom.

Emergency responders administered the opiate overdose antidote naloxone to several of the patients. Some patients required several doses of naloxone.

Two victims were flown to regional hospitals. As of Wednesday morning, all the victims survived.

There are similarities between the overdoses, including markers or stamps on the bags of heroin.

In the past police have released those markers as a warning, but police now say users seeking an effective high will look for the batches highlighted by police.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont has been awarded a nearly \$240,000 federal grant to help respond to the opioid overdose crisis.

The grant is part of the \$12 million the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention this week awarded to 23 states and the District of Columbia.

The grant will be used to enhance prevention efforts and to improve the tracking of opioid-related overdoses.

U.S. Democratic Sen. Patrick Leahy says U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary Tom Price has proposed cutting these CDC programs by \$50 million next year.

Leahy said Tuesday that he's calling on Price and President Donald Trump to withdraw their proposal to make those cuts to what he called "this vital program."

BURLINGTON, Vt. (AP) - Vermont officials say the state has improved its access to opiate addiction treatment, including eliminating the waiting list for treatment in Chittenden County, the state's most populous country.

Republican Gov. Phil Scott and other officials said Thursday Vermont can now quickly meet the demand for treatment services in all 14 counties.

Officials attribute the increased capacity to the opening of a new program in St. Albans, expansion of services at the Howard Center, and additional access to physician practices at the University of Vermont Medical Center.

Scott said addressing the waiting list for treatment is "an outstanding milestone" but he says there's more work to do. He says the state will continue to address the epidemic "like the public health crisis it is."

OFFICER-DRUG EVIDENCE THEFT

Former police officer charged with giving drugs to woman

BURLINGTON, Vt. (AP) - A former Royalton, Vermont, police officer is charged with taking heroin from the department's evidence closet and giving it to a woman with whom he was having a relationship.

John Breault appeared in federal court in Burlington on Friday for his initial court hearing.

The complaint filed by an FBI agent says the woman told authorities that she started getting heroin and prescription medications from Breault in July.

The complaint says the drugs were from a drug bust in Royalton and the department's prescription drug take-back box.

The 31-year-old Breault resigned from the police department last week. His lawyer said Friday that Breault has never done drugs and was trying to help a friend.

He was released on conditions. His next court appearance is on Oct. 13.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Attorney General's Office has settled a claim against an economist accused of submitting false invoices while evaluating the state's proposed single-payer health care system.

The Burlington Free Press reports (http://bfpne.ws/2wwDdop) Massachusetts Institute of Technology professor Jonathan Gruber was hired as a consultant in 2014. State officials later learned Gruber's invoices for himself and his research assistants were inaccurate.

Gruber filed a claim after Vermont altered his contract in November 2014.

Gruber has agreed to drop the claims the state owes him \$40,000 that was retained under his contract and \$50,000 for his assistant's work. Vermont has agreed to not go forward with its claims under the Vermont Civil False Claims Act.

According to the settlement, Gruber denies he violated the Vermont False Claims Act.

He attributes the delay to a rollout of a new software system to help better track filings. While the system is providing more data, Mousley says it led to the staff taking more time to process filings at first.

He expects the last requests to be completed within the next two months.

The Burlington Free Press reports (http://bfpne.ws/2eL64Kz ) the department sent letters to about 20,000 Vermont residents requesting they review their tax returns and purchasing habits. The agency is starting a new initiative to collect the 6 percent use tax. Department Commissioner Kaj Samsom says only 10 percent of state returns include use tax payments.

Officials say Vermont income taxpayers can determine how much use tax they owe by reviewing receipts or paying an income-based estimate.

According to the Joint Fiscal Office, around \$1.8 million is expected to be raised by the use tax initiative. Lawmakers have tasked the department with increasing overall tax collections by \$3.2 million this year.

Vermont Legislative leaders say they are confident lawmakers will not need to return to the State House for a special session this fall after President Trump and Congress struck a deal on a shortterm spending plan.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont is potentially weeks away from a health care funding cut due to a newly inked federal budget deal.

Last week, the U.S. Congress passed a temporary budget deal that will keep federal spending at current levels until Dec. 8. Vermont Public Radio reports (http://bit.ly/2xep8ZN) the deal didn't include financing for the Community Health Center Fund which is set to expire at the end of September.

Kathryn Becker Van Haste, director of heath policy for independent U.S. Sen. Bernie Sanders, says the lack of funding could close nine community health centers statewide.

Van Haste told this to the state Legislature Thursday, saying one in four Vermont residents use federally qualified health centers.

Van Haste says Sanders' office is attempting to negotiate continued funding before the program expires on Sept. 30.

Vermont lawmakers consider regulations for Airbnb

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - State officials are working with Vermont residents who use Airbnb to determine if new legislation is needed to regulate the service.

Vermont Public Radio reports (http://bit.ly/2wAA0EG ) state lawmakers this week commissioned the Short-Term Rental Working Group to survey activity in the Vermont. A report on the more than 3,600 homeowners using Airbnb is expected this month.

The group is expected to recommend if Airbnb hosts should register with the state. Department of Health official Lillian Colasurdo says determining what level of regulation is needed may be difficult.

Airbnb is cooperating with the state and advising hosts to be vocal about any proposed regulation. Company spokesman Peter Schottenfels says Airbnb is glad Vermont is pursuing "sensible short-term rental policies."

Airbnb had previously agreed to pay a rooms-and-meal tax for its hosts.
