26 organizations, businesses seek Entergy funds

VERNON, Vt. (AP) - More than two dozen organizations and businesses are seeking part of the funding that the owner of the soon-to-close Vermont Yankee nuclear plant has pledged for economic development in Windham County.

The Vermont Economic Progress Council says 26 applicants - from towns, hospitals and private businesses - have sent in proposals for part of Entergy's \$2 million in the first round.

Entergy has promised a total of \$10 million over five years. The area is expected to lose nearly 600 jobs when the plant closes at the end of the year.

The Rutland Herald reports (http://bit.ly/lrgL9B6) that the Agency of Commerce is expected to review the proposals. The council will make recommendations to the governor, who is expected to decide before the end of December who will get the funding.

The so-called coast-down period typically occurs at the end of the plant's operating cycle as the nuclear fuel in the reactor is depleted.

The state's only nuclear power plant has been generating electricity continually since the spring of 2013, a stretch of 500 days.

Entergy Nuclear, Vermont Yankee's owner, made the decision last year to close the plant at the end of the current fueling cycle, December of this year.

Texas low-level waste site could grow

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The Texas facility where the Vermont Yankee nuclear plant ships its low-level radioactive waste may be poised to grow.

At a meeting of the bi-state commission that oversees waste shipments on Thursday, the president of the company that owns the waste disposal site says it is seeing so much demand that it has sought permission from the state of Texas to triple in size.

The Rutland Herald and Times Argus report that (http://bit.ly/YcTxoU) Waste Control Specialists President Rodney Baltzer says the company also is interested in building a high-level radioactive waste facility.

Vermont Yankee is set to close at the end of the year, and its eventual decommissioning is expected to cause the volume of waste being shipped to jump.

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Health Department is urging adults who live near the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant to replace their potassium iodide tablets.

The pills are available for anyone who lives or works in the six towns within the emergency planning zone around the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant: Brattleboro, Dummerston, Guilford, Halifax, Marlboro and Vernon.

The adult tablets expire at the end of the month. Tablets for children are not expiring and don't need to be replaced.

Radioactive iodine is one of the contaminants that may be released in a nuclear emergency. Potassium iodide helps block radioactive iodine from being absorbed by the thyroid gland.

In April, the Health Department sent a letter with instructions for requesting new doses. People can also contact the Health Department's Brattleboro office.

Last year after the plant's owner, Energy Nuclear, announced it was closing the plant, it agreed to contribute \$10 million over five years for economic development in the county. Entergy paid the state \$2 million in the spring.

Vermont Public Radio reports (http://bit.ly/XepuMU) the Windham County Economic Development Program is running and accepting applications through Sept. 23.

Pat Moulton, commissioner of the Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development, said the goal is to fund projects that will create sustainable, structural change, like a business incubator or new infrastructure for industrial land or buildings.

The state agency responsible for representing utility ratepayers is being criticized by consumer and environmental groups after admitting it knew of a big cost increase on a natural gas pipeline project four months before it was made public.

Deep in a legal brief by the Public Service Department requesting a \$35,000 fine against Vermont Gas Systems for being slow to report the cost increase, the department says it knew a big cost increase was coming as early as March. But it didn't make that public before it was announced in July.

Both department Commissioner Christopher Recchia and Sandra Levine, a lawyer with the Conservation Law Foundation, say it was the company's responsibility to tell the Public Service Board sooner. AARP's Philene Taormina says the department should have notified the public.

State regulators are recommending a \$35,000 fine against Vermont Gas Systems for being slow to file a new and higher cost estimate for phase one of a natural gas pipeline expansion in western Vermont.

The company announced July 3 that the cost of extending its system from Chittenden County south to Middlebury had grown by 40 percent, to more than \$121 million.

The Department of Public Service says that marked the first time in 16 months the company had updated the Public Service Board on the likely cost of the first phase. It is asking the board to fine the company.

After building phase one as far south as Middlebury, Vermont Gas is planning to extend its pipeline system west to Ticonderoga, New York, and south to Rutland.

Pipeline digging to stop near utility lines

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The state Public Service Board has ordered Vermont Gas Systems to stop digging for its pipeline near power lines owned by the Vermont Electric Cooperative because of nearby pesticide concerns.

Vermont Public Radio reports (http://bit.ly/119yEzI) the state Agency of Natural Resources alerted the company to the possibility that soil contaminated with Pentachlorophenol, or PCP, could be disturbed by pipeline construction. The cooperative's poles have been treated with PCP, also used as a wood preservative. The EPA has found it to be toxic.

Last week, Vermont Gas said in a letter to the board "it would be prudent" for the company to develop a soil management plan for the project. In response, the board required the company to stop digging until a plan has been reviewed and approved by the board.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - About 40 protesters have converged on the building that houses the Vermont Public Service Board to demand a halt to the natural gas pipeline expansion underway in western Vermont.

Anti-pipeline activists staged a "fish-in" - complete with poles, a canoe and a petition with 500 signatures on Tuesday afternoon to protest what they're calling a bait and switch by project developer Vermont Gas.

The company recently increased the estimated cost of phase one of the project by 40 percent, to more than \$121 million, citing the cost of route changes to accommodate landowners along the route.

Vermont Gas wants to extend its system from Franklin and Chittenden counties south through Addison and eventually Rutland counties, with a spur under Lake Champlain to serve a paper mill in New York.

The former head of child protective services says more money needs to be spent "upstream" to prevent more abuse cases.

Commissioner Dave Yacavone said he is leaving voluntarily and had offered his resignation months ago which was not accepted when controversy swirled around his department after several children under the supervision of state social workers died as a result of abuse.

Yacovone said the department made strides during his three year, nine month tenure, including increasing the number of children visited each month by social workers up from 17 percent to 90 percent, the level required by statute.

But he said abuse cases would continue unless the state spent more money on preventitive services, what he called spending upstream, or he said the state would have to keep hiring more social workers. Yacovone said there have been approximately 50 social workers added in recent years.

Yacovone said he was disappointed when his boss human services secretary Doug Racine was fired three weeks ago, but Yacovone said he had applief for a new job two months ago and that he would have left even if Racine had stayed.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - Vermont Attorney William Sorrell says he thinks lawmakers should reduce the privacy of cases handled by the Department for Children and Families and other agencies.

In comments Tuesday before the Legislature's Committee on Child Protection, Sorrell said Vermont is one of a handful of states where "the doors are locked" for family court proceedings.

He said that in some cases that can make it more difficult for social workers to communicate with other state agencies such as the police.

The Committee on Child Protection is studying the state's child welfare system in the aftermath of the deaths of two toddlers.

Sorrell made a number of recommendations including that Vermont join other states and pass a law highlighting the danger drug abuse poses to children and the danger of child pornography.



The head of the Green Mt Care Board sees a positive trend in hospital budget requests.

MJNEWS 0714

Vermont's 14 hospitals put in budget requests that average well below the cap set earlier this year by the Green Mountain Care Board.

Hospitals are seeking an average 2.6 percent increase in revenue for the coming hospital fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1.

If approved, the requested increases would translate into a \$56.9 million increase in hospital revenue. Total hospital revenues in Vermont last year were roughly \$2.2 billion.

The board issued guidelines asking that budgets not exceed a 3 percent revenue increase, with an additional .8 percent increase allowed to cover investments that further the state's health care reform goals. The 2.6 percent average increase includes revenues to cover hospital investments.

Al Gobeille, chair of the Green Mt Care Baord, the state's chief refulagtory body for health care expenses, is pleased.

Three days public hearings are scheduled for August before the board decides to accept, deny or modify the hospital requests.

The governor, board members and the state hospital association lauded the lower than expected growth in hospital budget requests as a sign that health care costs are being contained.

They withdrew their objection presented to the Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules on Thursday, on the condition that the state will continue to work with them on program implementation.

State officials say they received assurances from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that the rule is in compliance with federal law.

State officials plan to file the set of provisions on health benefits eligibility and enrollment by next week so they can go into effect before emergency health care rules expire on July 29.



On Tuesday, the Green Mountain Care Board authorized Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Vermont to increase its rates an average of 7.7 percent. Blue Cross is the state's largest health care insurer with about 65,000 customers enrolled through Vermont Health Connect. They had requested an increase of 9.8 percent.

The Board approved a rate increase for MVP subscribers of 10.9 percent. MVP had requested an increase of 15.3 percent.

In addition to increases in medical and drug costs, a portion of the increase is due to changes in federal payments and rules that are beyond the control of insurers and the state.

The Green Mountain Care board says individual rate increases will vary.

Lt Gov Phil Scott says the parting ways with CGI was overdue, but should have been done after consulting with legislative leaders. The administration announced it was hiring a new contractor on Monday.

Republican gubernatorial candidate Scott Milne says the Shumlin administration is pushing Vermont to be first in too many areas.

Milne says Shumlin is pushing too many issues where Vermont would be the first in the country, including legislation requiring the labeling of genetically modified foods and efforts to establish a universal publicly financed health care system. Milne called those two efforts reckless.

In an interview with Radio Vermont, Milne said he would rather have seen Vermont's health care exchange established by the feds and not the state, but he hedged on the administrations health care reform efforts, saying he wanted to study the issue more first. He also had no concrete proposal to reduce property taxes.

Milne, who runs a travel agency, reported raising \$20,000 last week in his bid and acknowledged a distaste to quote dial for dollars.

Milne was particularly critical of Shumlin being anti-business, citing the rhetoric surrounding efforts to close Vermont Yankee as an example.
