MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Legislature has adjourned for the year and even though lawmakers will be back in Montpelier to deal with the looming veto of the state budget by Republican Gov. Phil Scott, lawmakers had a number of other notable accomplishments in 2017.

The governor's promised budget veto is due to the ongoing dispute about the best way to save money through changes for teachers' health care.

(But the Legislature also became the first such body in the country to vote to legalize marijuana rather than through a public referendum. Scott hasn't said if he will support the bill or veto it.)

The Legislature, with broad bipartisan support, passed a law that limits police involvement with the federal government and gives the governor the power to sign off on agreements for officers to do federal immigration duties.

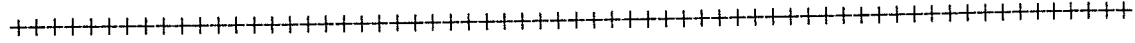

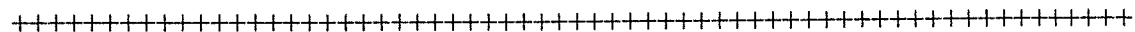

Vermont ski industry celebrates bounce-back season

KILLINGTON, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Ski Areas Association is celebrating a comeback season in which almost 3.9 million skier visits boosted the industry after a weak season last year.

The association released the figures for the 2016-2017 ski season during the group's annual meeting Thursday at the Killington Resort.

Association President Parker Riehle credited a series of winter storms and snowmaking for the success of this season. The industry says that in a good year the ski industry contributes about \$900 million to the state economy in direct winter spending.

The association described the warm 2015-2016 season, which saw little snow, as "challenging." The industry recorded 3.2 million skiers and rider visits.

Last year's numbers followed a record high of 4.7 million skier visits in the 2014-2015 season.

State Board of Education approves school merger proposal

DANVILLE, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont State Board of Education has approved the proposal for a school district merger between the Cabot, Danville and Twinfield districts.

The Caledonian Record (<http://bit.ly/2qwI6tE>) reports the proposal now faces a public vote scheduled for June 20.

A presentation by the school board chairs states the districts are suffering from declining student enrollment, aging facilities and increasing costs.

While a merger would alleviate those issues, the presentation shows it would lead to the closing of Cabot High School. The chair of Cabot's school board says the plan is not perfect, and it was hard to get "a win-win for everybody."

The Twinfield school board says they welcome the school merger.

If the vote fails, Danville may explore a merger with the Blue Mountain Union School District in Wells River.

WILMINGTON, Vt. (AP) - Members of a southern Vermont school board say they support a proposal to merge school districts in order to take advantage of incentives offered by the state.

The Brattleboro Reformer reports (<http://bit.ly/2qo2kmu>) Whitingham and Wilmington residents will vote May 31 on the creation of a Twin Valley unified union district.

Twin Valley School Board Chairman Seth Boyd says the merger would not be a big change for Twin Valley, and they've "done all the work already."

If approved, the incentives include 8 cents off the education tax rate in the first year of consolidation. The districts would combine to form a seven-member Twin Valley school board.

Boyd says if the vote fails, the district could be forced to merge by the state board of education under a school consolidation law.

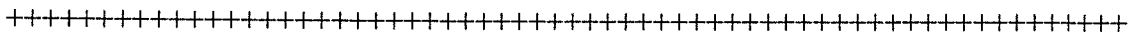

Vermont town considers school with Massachusetts neighbor

STAMFORD, Vt. (AP) - A tiny southern Vermont town could consider forming a new school district with a neighboring community in Massachusetts.

Stamford is planning to vote next week on a plan to merge with the Vermont towns of Halifax and Readsboro.

But Stamford School Board member Erika Bailey says people from nearby Clarksburg, Massachusetts, reached across the state line recently to talk about forming a district. Bailey says it could be worth considering if the merger plan is rejected.

Vermont Public Radio (<http://bit.ly/2rg2EF7>) reports the Vermont towns are 24 miles (39 kilometers) away, across winding roads. Clarksburg is four miles (6.5 kilometers) away.

There are two interstate school districts in which Vermont communities join with New Hampshire towns.

Forming an interstate school district requires approval of the communities, the states and then Congress.

ROYALTON, Vt. (AP) - Voters in Royalton have approved a plan to merge with school districts in Bethel and Rochester, reversing an earlier vote.

Now voters in Rochester, who initially approved the plan, will revote Tuesday.

The Valley News reports (<http://bit.ly/2s2cLiN>) that if the measure is approved in Rochester, the three towns will form the White River Unified School District.

Each town would continue to operate pre-K through fifth-grade elementary schools. Students in sixth through eighth grades would attend a middle school in Bethel. High schoolers would go to Royalton and Rochester would operate an experiential learning center.

A single school board would govern the district, which would operate under one budget.

Supporters have said the merger is needed to meet Act 46's standards of providing a high quality education that's equitable and efficient.

RUTLAND, Vt. (AP) - The Vermont Health Department is working to ensure that health care providers are ready for new rules that regulate how opioid painkillers are prescribed while minimizing the risk of misuse.

On July 1, providers must comply with rules that include limits on the number of pills that can be prescribed and requirements that new users be briefed about drug dangers.

The Health Department's Shayla Livingston says the goal is to reduce the amount of opioids in the community.

Rutland Dr. Rick Hildebrant says health care providers share that goal, but the new rules will place burdens on some providers.

The state says up to 80 percent of people who abuse heroin started by abusing prescription drugs.

BURLINGTON, Vt. (AP) - Officials in Vermont's largest city are urging the state to crack down on dealers who sell fentanyl, the powerful painkiller responsible for many drug overdoses.

Burlington Police Chief Brandon del Pozo said Wednesday officers often respond to between four and eight overdoses within a two-week span, including two fatalities in the past month.

Fentanyl is a synthetic drug that is about 25 to 50 times more potent than heroin.

The Burlington Free Press (<http://bfpne.ws/2ppC8KG>) reports addicts frequently seek fentanyl because they want to achieve a greater high. It's also less expensive for drug dealers to manufacture and sell at a high price.

A bill pending in the Vermont Legislature would create penalties for fentanyl possession and distribution, but its prospects in the current session are uncertain.

Concerns about needles trigger precautions for Green Up Day

RICHMOND, Vt. - It used to be a fun event, but now Green Up Day means taking precautions because of the opiate epidemic.

"If you see a needle; Look, don't touch. And report it to your local officials," said Melinda Vieux the president of Green Up Vermont.

Dr. Richard Bernstein of Richmond Rescue is in charge of the Opioid Task Force in Richmond. He says if you see a needle and you don't want to pick it up, you should put a flag next to the needle. The flag reads DO NOT TOUCH and can be found at the Town Hall in Jericho. Then officials will come collect the needles later.

If you do pick the needle up, here's how:

- You can use some pliers and put the needle in a heavy-duty container, like a laundry detergent container.
- Or you use construction or electric gloves to pick up the needle and place in the container.
- When your container is about two-thirds full, put heavy tape over the cap.
- Then attach a sticker from Chittenden Solid Waste District to the container. Throw the container in the trash.

Dr. Bernstein says picking up a needle is a good thing but he urges people to be careful.

"If you pick up a needle you become part of the solution to a large problem. It increases public awareness. It does remove a dangerous object from the environment and it allows the conversation to keep going," Bernstein said.

Bernstein also says that Richmond Rescue is in the process of setting up needle depositories around town. He says the likelihood that someone will catch a disease from a needle is very low, but people should still use caution this Green Up Day.

Again, this is not the stance from Green Up Vermont; officials there tell people not to pick up needles.

Green Up Vermont said most schools will start Green Up Day Friday, depending on weather. Businesses like Green Mountain Coffee, Ben & Jerry's Waterbury plant, and Dealer.com are among at least 30 companies starting early, as well.

use of marijuana in the state.

By a vote of 79 to 66, the House on Wednesday afternoon passed a bill that
has already been passed by the state Senate. The bill now goes to Republican Gov.
Phil Scott, who has expressed reservations about it.

The vote came after an hour of debate.

Under the legislation, small amounts of marijuana will be legal to possess
and grow starting in July 2018. Meanwhile, a nine-member commission would develop
a law that would tax and regulate marijuana and present it to the Legislature
next year.

The proposal would eliminate penalties for possession of one ounce of
marijuana and two mature and four immature plants for people over age 21. It
would retain criminal penalties for possessing larger amounts.

RUTLAND, Vt. (AP) - Prosecutors say a Brooklyn, New York, man has been sentenced to 10 years in prison for his role as a leader in a conspiracy to sell large amounts of crack and heroin in Rutland County.

Twenty-seven-year-old Joel Joyce was convicted in December 2016.

Prosecutors say he had co-conspirators from Brooklyn bring the drugs to Rutland by bus or other means. They say Joyce then had drug addicts in the Rutland area distribute the drugs and collect his money. The government showed evidence that he made tens of thousands of dollars selling drugs in the Rutland area and often managed the drug trafficking by cellphone from Brooklyn.

Joyce was sentenced on Thursday.

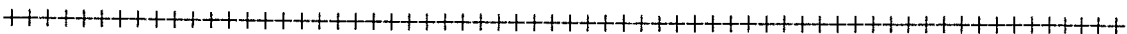

The senator netted a \$795,000 advance for his book detailing his presidential campaign called "Our Revolution: A Future to Believe In." A second version of the book, along with a 1997 memoir, brought his income from books to \$865,484.

Sanders, an independent, earned \$174,000 as a public servant. The senator also made over \$7,000 from his pension from the city of Burlington for his time as mayor and royalties from a 1987 folk album.

Sanders donated proceeds from his book "The Speech" and several public speaking fees to charity.

Generac in a statement said it was consolidating manufacturing at a plant in Wisconsin.

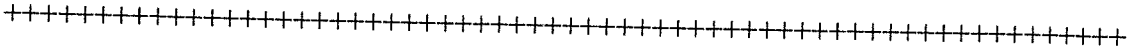

WATERBURY, Vt. (AP) - The state of Vermont and members of the business community are joining together to promote the outdoor recreation economy.

On Thursday, Republican Gov. Phil Scott signed an executive order creating the Vermont Outdoor Recreation Economic Collaborative.

Appearing at the Waterbury Center State Park along with representatives of the outdoor industry in the state, Scott said the state's landscape of forests, farms and communities are a big reason people visit Vermont.

The governor's office says outdoor recreation accounts for 34,000 direct jobs in the state and \$2.5 billion in consumer spending.

The collaborative is intended to look for ways to encourage outdoor recreation. Among the ideas that will be looked at are ways to promote outdoor businesses and protect outdoor recreation resources.

Keurig Green Mountain lays off over a hundred employees

WATERBURY, Vt. (AP) - Keurig Green Mountain has announced it has laid off approximately 130 workers, 40 of whom worked in Vermont.

The company attributed the layoffs to shifting company priorities. Katie Gilroy, a corporate communications manager with Keurig Green Mountain, says the laid-off employees were offered severance benefits and will be supported through the transition.

The company says it will hire employees for new ventures in coming months.

Keurig Green Mountain previously laid off 108 Vermont workers in June 2016. It has four locations in the state: Essex, Williston, South Burlington and is headquartered in Waterbury.
