COLCHESTER, Vt. (AP) - Storms with strong winds, hail and lightning that raced through Vermont have left more than 21,000 utility customers without power, outages that for some could last until Monday.

Green Mountain Power says Saturday afternoon's storms affected more than 26,000 customers. By Saturday night, about 21,200 remained without electricity.

Spokeswoman Kristin Carlson says the storm caused extensive damage across Vermont. She says crews are working to restore power to all customers but for the most badly hit areas power may not return until Monday.

Weather forecasts call for additional storms on Monday, and Green Mountain Power says it is preparing for them.

Carlson reminds customers that power lines knocked down by trees may still be live. She urges people to stay away from them until utility crews arrive.

COLCHESTER, Vt. (AP) - Green Mountain Power says crews are working to restore power to more than 9,600 customers, but power has been restored to more than 16,000 households and businesses in the aftermath of Saturday's thunderstorms.

GMP communications chief Kristin Carlson says the "fast-moving, intense storm caused incredible damage" and left more than 25,000 without power.

Carlson said crews worked throughout the night, assisted by crews from outof-state.

She also said GMP is preparing for a new round of storms that could hit Monday.

GMP's online outage map shows more than 1,500 customers still without power in Royalton. Other communities with high numbers of outages remaining include Sharon, Royalton, Pomfret and Thetford.

With the bid opening barely a week away, Barre City Manager Steve Mackenzie is hoping plans to address a flood-prone section of Gunners Brook could benefit from business-hungry contractors.

Mackenzie said a surprising 17 contractors attended last Thursday's pre-bid meeting involving a much-discussed project that will be financed with federal, state and local money.

The cost of the project has been estimated at \$1.1 million and the work will be conducted in phases at two different locations.

the first phase of the project — construction of a massive "trash rack" in an open section of Gunners Brook near the LePage Gravel Pit — is scheduled for completion later this year.

That work involves the installation of a V-shaped array of driven steel piles that are each two feet in diameter and between 24and 30 feet long.

Finishing that work this year will allow the contractor to focus on the second phase of the work in the spring.

Plans call for the acquisition and demolition of two Harrington Avenue apartment buildings and a nearby home on Reid Street, the creation of a retention area, installation of a secondary trash rack and removal of a disabled bridge on Harrington Avenue.

Still a Democratic candidate for president, Sanders is required to file the paperwork. He has not been campaigning since the beginning of June, when Hillary Clinton effectively locked up the nomination.

But the Vermont senator's lawyer is telling the Federal Election Commission that Sanders' "current campaign schedule and officeholder duties" are causing delays in filing the personal finance paperwork; the lawyer gave a similar reason when seeking the first 45-day extension at the end of April.

The documents would provide a snapshot of how he and his wife, Jane Sanders, earned money last year.

Clinton and Republican Donald Trump both filed their annual financial information weeks ago.

Bernie Sanders is poised to offer his long-awaited endorsement of Democratic rival Hillary Clinton, hoping to transfer the energy of his supporters into the party's fight against Republican Donald Trump.

The Vermont senator is joining Clinton at a campaign event Tuesday in Portsmouth, New Hampshire.

The endorsement is the culmination of weeks of negotiations between the Clinton and Sanders campaigns since the final primaries in June.

Sanders has pressed for Clinton's support of policy stances on higher education, health care and a \$15-an-hour minimum wage.

Sanders beat Clinton in New Hampshire by a dominant 22-point margin last February. Many of his supporters have shifted to Clinton but the senator hopes to rally them as a way of preventing Trump from reaching the White House.

Republican Scott Milne says he's running a grass roots campaign and he's hoping to appeal to people who are "weary of career politicians."

Leahy, who is facing a primary campaign against Cris Ericson who is also running for governor, is seeking his eighth term as one of Vermont's U.S. senators. He has millions of dollars in the bank.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The primary votes weren't fully counted before Republican gubernatorial nominee Phil Scott was trying out some of the brickbats he's expected to throw at his opponent, Democrat Sue Minter, the fall campaign.

Shortly after unofficial tallies showed Minter winning the Democratic gubernatorial primary Tuesday, the Republican Governors Association issued a statement calling her a "Shumlin political insider," referring to outgoing Democratic Gov. Peter Shumlin.

Scott retweeted a message faulting Minter's message on gun safety. She supports universal background checks for gun buyers.

Minter served as disaster recovery chief and transportation secretary under Shumlin. She says she'll run on her own record in those jobs and as a member of the Vermont House.

### State refuses to release fed query of EB-5 center

State officials have denied a public-records request to release documents connected to a federal inquiry into the Vermont agency that handles an immigrant investor program mired in scandal.

Pat Moulton, secretary of the Agency of Commerce and Community Development, which oversees the state EB-5 Regional Center, acknowledged in an interview with the Burlington Free Press in August

that federal

authorities are questioning Vermont's regional center regarding Jay Peak and another project.

The Vermont Regional Center oversees the EB-5 program, which is reeling after allegations of fraud at Jay Peak and other projects in the Northeast Kingdom. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and the

Vermont Department of Financial Regulation have accused Jay Peak principals Bill Stenger and Ariel Quiros of misappropriating some \$200 million raised from foreign investors for the projects. Quiros is accused of personally pocketing an additional \$50 million. They deny wrongdoing.

Under the EB-5 program, foreign nationals who invest \$500,000 in development projects in rural or economically depressed regions of the country are eligible to receive green cards if those projects create a specified number of jobs.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services sent a Request for Information regarding the Regional Center in July. The state Commerce Agency had until the end of August to answer the federal agency's questions, Moulton said. The Free Press made a public records request to Moulton for the federal inquiry and the state's answers nearly two weeks ago.

Moulton said she did not believe the Vermont EB-5 Regional Center is in any danger of being terminated.

The state on Wednesday denied the public records request based on the contention that the documents are "relevant to the pending litigation where the state is a party," referring to the alleged fraud in the Northeast Kingdom. The Free Press is challenging the denial.

MONTPELIER, Vt. (AP) - The receiver overseeing two Vermont ski resorts at the center of a fraud investigation says a \$13.3 million settlement with Citibank will subsidize operations at one resort and a newly opened hotel at the other and pay contractors and vendors.

A judge must approve the settlement.

Ariel Quiros, owner of Jay Peak and Burke Mountain resorts, and Bill Stenger, Jay's former president, were accused by the Securities and Exchange Commission and the state of misusing about \$200 million from foreign investors. Quiros, of Miami, has said he'll be cleared of wrongdoing. Stenger says he has reached a settlement with the SEC. Receiver Michael Goldberg said last week that Stenger is no longer an employee of Jay Peak.

Goldberg says Citibank extended a \$15 million loan to Quiros, who used collateral accounts to secure it and improperly diverted investor funds.

Citibank hasn't admitted any wrongdoing.

Goldberg says the offer has "created a great deal of misinformation" and he's concerned about the validity of BAM's Letter of Intent. The receiver says he's never seen anything like it in 25 years of work.


