Video of the incident obtained by Local4 shows a teenager spraying protesters while riding in a car driving by the street. The incident happened Sunday night during a Black Lives Matter protest march from a Grand Island park to a parking lot on South Locust Street. The type of liquid shot from the toy gun is unclear. At least one protester said in a video that it was vinegar. Police say if that's the case, the charges would likely be misdemeanors. If however, it was determined that bodily fluids were involved, the offense would be a felony.

Kearney Reopening Playgrounds and Other Amenities :30

The city of Kearney announced Friday that playgrounds, splash pads, and the Yanney Park fitness pad will be available for use in Kearney parks, beginning at 9:00 a.m., on Monday, June 8. The amenities will be closed daily, from 7:00 - 9:00 a.m., for sanitizing by Park Staff. Participants are encouraged to recreate responsibly: Wash hands with soap and water prior to and after use, take breaks to sanitize hands, try to maintain six-foot separation between users when possible, avoid using if crowded, take trash with you, stay home if not feeling well or if exposed to someone who is sick with COVID-19, and be courteous and respectful of others.

Clay County Shooter Still at Large :30

As of late Wednesday afternoon the Clay County Sheriff was still on the look-out for a kidnapping suspect who also fired a handgun Tuesday at deputies. Hastings Police tipped off Clay County authorities after a woman told them she had been held against her will by Blessing since the morning of April 10.

AMBER Alert Cancelled After Two Boys are Found :30

An Amber Alert issued for two boys who were abducted from Tekamah has been canceled after they were found safely in Kansas. The alert was issued Monday morning after the Tekamah Police Department said a 7-year-old and a 4-year-old last seen in Tekamah were abducted. NSP the children had been abducted by their step-grandfather Tanner Leichleiter, from their home in Tekamah.

Former Teacher Faces Child Porn Trial in September :30

04/28/20 Local4 Midday Tuesday

A former teacher connected to a human trafficking investigation in Grand Island is going on trial later this year for possession of child pornography. Brian Mohr, 37, a former teacher at Grand Island Northwest, is charged with 11 counts of possession of child pornography. Grand Island police in January said they found 34 child porn images in Mohr's possession. The identities and ages of the victims were verified, and were confirmed to be under the age of 19 years old. Mohr admitted to investigators that he knew he was in possession child pornography.

Sutton Man Arrested Following Human Trafficking Investigation :30

04/30/20 Local4 5pm Thursday

A multi-agency effort, including the Nebraska State Patrol and Clay County Sheriff's Office, arrested a Sutton man after an extensive investigation into allegations of human trafficking and sexual exploitation. Linus Cloet, 58, of Sutton, was arrested in Clay County this morning on charges of sex trafficking of a minor, child abuse, three counts of pandering, and two counts of solicitation. Cloet was lodged in Clay County Jail.

COVID-19 Patient Attacks Nurse, Spits on Walls :30

05/18/20 Local4 Midday Monday

A 48-year-old woman who had been confirmed COVID-19 positive was arrested after she reportedly punched a nurse at CHI Health St. Elizabeth and spit on the hospital floors and walls. According to court records, Nyadak Chuol Tut, 48, is being charged with assault on a health care professional. Documents show Tut was patient at CHI Health St. Elizabeth on May 11 and was confirmed COVID-19 positive.

Utah Trucker Convicted in Hall County Traffic Death :30

05/19/20 Local4 Midday Tuesday

A Utah trucker may spend up to 20 years in prison for his part in a January accident in Hall County which killed a Wisconsin woman. Peterson Black, 37, Talorville, UT, pleaded no contest Monday to a charge of felony motor vehicle homicide. The crash happened January 5 on I-80 about four miles west of the Grand Island exit. A semi driven by Black was west-bound when it went out of control, crossed the median and went onto the east-bound lanes.

Man Arrested for Shooting at Group With BB Gun :30

06/02/20 Local4 Midday Tuesday

Hastings police are working to make a connection between a group of people sitting outside their apartment and the man who fired a BB gun at them. It happened Monday around 9:00 p.m. HPD said that five or six people were cooking on a grill outside their apartment in the 200 block of East B Street when a car pulled up and the driver fired a BB gun at them. It was an automatic action BB gun and multiple people were hit. None of them have serious injuries.

Grand Island Sees Second Night of BLM Peaceful Protests :30**06/02/20 Local4 5pm Tuesday**

A second round of peaceful Black Lives Matter protests took place in Grand Island Monday night. Dozens of people showed up to the Pizza Hut parking lot down South Locust Street to chant and hold up signs to end racism and police brutality.

UNK Holds Moment of Silence :30**06/04/20 Local4 6pm Thursday**

With protests continuing around the area, UNK staff wanted to show solidarity with the people who are fighting against prejudices. Thursday afternoon, a large group gathered around the bell tower on campus in support. Staff, faculty, students, and community members were invited to share in a moment of silence.

Three Injured in Crash that Leaves Fireworks Exploding Inside Trailer :30**06/22/20 Local4 5pm Monday**

When troopers arrived on scene, the semi, which was hauling fireworks, was fully engulfed in flames with fireworks inside the trailer actively exploding. Witnesses had been able to extricate all persons involved in the crash from the vehicles. Both occupants of the SUV, a Toyota Highlander, were transported to the hospital in Fremont for treatment. The driver was then flown to Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha for additional treatment. The driver of the semi was treated on scene.

Grand Island Attempted Murder Case Moved to Juvenile Court :30**06/22/20 Local4 Midday Monday**

[Kean Flores, 14, was charged in Hall County with attempted murder](#), first degree assault and use of a weapon to commit a felony. Grand Island Police said two boys were in a mutual consent fight, when Flores pulled a knife and stabbed the victim in the chest. The victim has survived, but Grand Island police said his wounds were life-threatening.

Loomis Man Sentenced to 12 Years for Distributing Child Pornography :30**06/24/20 Local4 5pm Wednesday**

21-year old Trevor C. Maaske of Loomis, Nebraska was sentenced Wednesday by United States District Judge Robert F. Rossiter, Jr. to 144 months' imprisonment for receipt and distribution of child pornography. After his release from prison, Maaske will begin an 8-year term of supervised release and will be required to register as a sex offender. Judge Rossiter ordered Maaske to pay restitution in the amount of \$9,000.

Bail Set for Woman Accused of Shooting her Husband along I-80 :30**06/25/20 Local4 6am Thursday**

A judge raised bail Wednesday to \$1 million for a resident physician who is charged with fatally shooting her husband in front of their two children while stopped along Interstate 80. Kathleen Jourdan, 31, of Omaha, initially was held without bond on charges of second-degree murder and use of a deadly weapon in the death of her husband, 35-year-old Joshua Jourdan.

2019 Hwy 281 Car Jacking Leads to Prison :30**06/24/20 Local4 5pm Wednesday**

Wheeler was arrested by Hall County Sheriff's deputies after a string of events that played out April 15, 2019, on Highway 281 just south of Doniphan. Wheeler reportedly forced a van to stop by standing in traffic. The van was driven by a woman from Shelton, NE. The woman tried to resist, but he was able to enter the van. She then grabbed her infant child and left the van. Wheeler then attempted to take off with the van.

Number of Nebraskans Filing For Unemployment Benefits Continues to Rise :30

04/09/20 Local4 6am Thursday

Initial jobless claims filed in Nebraska during the week ending April 4 reached 26,788. That figure is according to newly released non-seasonally adjusted data from the Department of Labor. The week prior there were 24,725 claims — for an increase of 2,063 claims or a total of 51,513 in just two weeks.

Cost of Corn Farming in 2020 :30

04/23/20 Local4 Midday Thursday

Nebraska farmers will be spending almost \$3-B to put crops in the ground this spring. USDA reports show corn farmers will spend \$2.7 billion to plant 10.5 million acres. That's a 4% increase from last year's total planted corn acres. Farmers buy seed, fuel and fertilizer. Corn prices dropped by 20% in Nebraska as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Farmers try to plant corn in mid-April and try to finish by mid-May.

Smithfield in Crete Changes Plan, Not Closing :30

04/28/20 Local4 Midday Tuesday

Smithfield foods in Crete has changed its plans and has decided not to close down as COVID-19 cases continue to rise among workers at the plant. According to an email sent to employees, a "new plan" was announced, stating the plant will not be shutting down but rather reducing hours and production. The email states some departments will work different parts of the day, with some leaving at lunch.

Elementary School Class Attends Virtual Tour on Importance of Trucking During COVID-19 :30

The coronavirus pandemic has highlighted the importance of the trucking industry. An elementary school class went on a virtual tour to see some of the trucks keeping our stores stocked. Here in Nebraska even before the coronavirus outbreak, there was a shortage of truck drivers. Long-term estimates show that number increasing to 100,000 in 10 years.

Hastings Bar & Grill Partially Re-Opens :30

Restaurants are back open in Hastings, but only part of their dining area can seat customers following the more relaxed Directed Health Measure. Murphy's Bar and Grill have reopened and are taking precautions. Under the new DHM, restaurants can operate at 50 percent occupancy. Up to six people can sit at a table. To allow for more social distancing between parties, Murphy's taped off every other table.

Cather Center Alters Spring Conference :30

Grand Island's JCPenney Store Among 154 Closing :30

As more stores close in malls across the country, the Conestoga Mall in Grand Island is about to take another major hit. It's losing a flagship retailer. JCPenney said Thursday it would start closing 154 stores in 20 states, including the store in Grand Island. At this time, the Grand Island store is the only one to close in Nebraska. Though additional closures are expected to be announced in the coming weeks.

Emergency Loans Offered to Small Businesses in Grand Island :30

The Revolving Loan Fund is an existing program from the city, but the two organizations will add matching dollars to help provide sustainability for Grand Island businesses moving forward. About \$340,000 dollars will be available to assist in recovery, with a maximum of 22,500 dollars for each business. Any operation with 2 to 49 employees is eligible.
