1. Parenting, Family Issues

Mi Casa Y Yo *Me and My House*, with hosts Pastors Jeff and Evelyn Tolle. Addressing topics of daily family life. Daily 11:00 – 11:12 a.m. and repeat at 3:40 a.m.

5/10/2021	You are Not Your Kid's Best Friend; You are their Parent. To train your child, understand that your primary call is to train them, not to be their best friend.
5/11/2021	Being specific with our children. When trying to help your kids grow, it is important to be specific and detailed, rather than general, in the instructions you give.
5/12/2021	Some Parents live their own dreams through the achievements of their kids whether in Sports or other achievements. Parents need perspective about centering God and your children in their development, rather than yourself.
5/13/2021	Children need achievable goals, That's why it's important when training children, learn the importance of starting with small things and gradually growing bigger.
5/14/2021	Understanding delegation and its proper process in training. Don't be too quick to do the child's task yourself because you can do it more quickly. Allow them to struggle through a task like tying their own shoelaces.
6/23/2021	When thinking about your family and your children's future families, choosing the right spouse is an important part.
6/24/2021	Mentors for our children are important. It is important to choose the right people who can provide wisdom and guidance in their lives.
6/25/2021	Words can cut and be remembered forever. When teaching, training and relating with our kids, we need to be careful with the words we choose.
6/29/2021	Learn tools about how to be at peace during any transition of life. So many have lost homes and jobs that they need to be aware of resources in their cities and counties.
6/30/2021	Many families are moving due to job change and economic changes. During times of transition, it is important to be flexible. Learn about the importance of this principle for life.

2. Opioid Abuse, Drugs

4/17/2021	Alex and Suzy Paes - Directors, Hispanic Ministry for Alcohol and Drugs Rehabilitation talk about Drug/Alcohol Recovery: The Rehab Ministry at Victory Outreach Hispanic Group helps people addicted to drugs and alcohol. They explained how people living in the street can be rescued and taken in for free psychological and psychiatric evaluation and directed to the appropriate treatment. Notes that many centers throughout the country serving drug addiction.
4/24/2021	Prof. John Korszyk, Certified Family Counselor, Pastor and Author joins us to talk about Opioid Overdose - A Father's Pain. Young Daniel got into Emergency too late, as a victim of an opioid overdose. In view of such pain and suffering, his father Juan tried to commit suicide, but the bullet hit a pillow instead. Juan frequently gives testimony about his pain...which he says has never gone away. He touches on how to recognize drug abuse in our children.
6/5/2021	Jaime Lazaro - Director, SFVM-San Fernando Valley Ministries, CA joins us to talk about Drug Use and Abuse - This non-profit ministry is dedicated to building a drug-free community. The misuse of methamphetamine brings death, psychological, medical, and social consequences, especially to young people. Outreaches to parent, schools, and churches to help at-risk youth are among the tools for curbing drug abuse.

Hispanics represent more than 29% of COVID-19 cases and 19% of deaths due to this disease. Hispanics constitute only 18.5% of the population of this country.
