	- Christian Salazar (23) and Juan Dominguez (36) share their
	inspiring stories. Both were formerly involved in gangs and
	struggled with drug addiction. They found transformation through
	the Victory Outreach Ministries - Ventura County Unit, a
	rehabilitation program founded by Sonny Arguinzoni, who himself
	was rescued from gangs and drugs. Victory Outreach has centers
	across the US.
